I thought I would not have any contribution for this Sunday's bulletin. Then suddenly I remember few years ago an Augustinian priest from the Philippines came over. I learned from him the perfect prayer, the Lord's Prayer. This is the prayer that our Lord has taught us.

Our Father who art in Heaven – He is our Father revealed by His Son Jesus Christ. Through the Sacrament of Baptism we became the adopted children of God. In itself there are seven petitions:

1. **Hallowed be thy Name** – We ask that God may be made holy, known and sanctified by the entire universe and by us, that he may be loved and revered.

2. **Kingdom come** – We ask that God may reign, in the world, in our homes, in us and that one day He returns and we will be admitted to Heaven.

3. **Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven** – We ask grace to do the will of God in all things at all time. We pray that

all His desires will be done and we submit to His authority.

4. **Give us this day our daily bread** -We ask for the nourishment of our body and soul each day. As Christians we must make every effort to proclaim the good news to everyone.

5. **Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us** – We ask that God pardons our sins as we pardon the sins of those who offend us. We ask for God's mercy to penetrate into our hearts to forgive our enemies

6. **Lead us not into temptation** – We ask God to protect us from temptation and the grace from conquering temptation.

7. **Deliver us from evil** – We ask God to deliver us from all evil at all times.

In the midst of this chaotic world, we simply turn to Our Father in Heaven to grant us these petitions.

REFLECTION

Living the Gospel – Ask, search, knock

Jesus says in the gospel, ‘Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you.’ The actions of asking, searching and knocking are means by which we initiate the encounter with God. If we don’t ask, search and knock, how is anyone (including God) to know our needs or know what it is that we are searching for. Particularly in our spiritual lives, it is only through the search and the knocking on the doors of different experiences that we ever come closer to finding answers.

Historical Context – Stone for bread

The stone/bread, snake/fish and scorpion/egg comparisons seem a little far fetched to us, but would have made perfect sense to a 1st Century Palestinian audience. The flat, brown stones around Lake Galilee look very similar to the flat bread that was baked in the area. The ‘snake’ may refer to a sea-snake – an eel – which might be caught up in a fisherman’s nets but was regarded as unclean by the Jews. The poisonous scorpions of the region are very pale in colour and when curled up at rest could be mistaken for an egg.

Gospel Focus – Relationship

A crucial aspect of prayer is the attitude with which we view God. We trust in God’s character that it is not a pointless exercise to ask for something. We trust that God is even more loving than a parent who tries to give their child what they need. If we did not make these basic assumptions about God, there would be little point in prayer. When our prayer lives falter at times, perhaps we need to first check out our relationship with God and our attitude towards God before trying to ‘fix’ the ways we pray.

Questions for Adults

What message/s about prayer do you get from this gospel passage? Why does Jesus suggest that we have to be persistent in our prayer? What is the most fulfilling form of prayer for you? How would you describe your ‘prayer life’? What commitment for the coming week would you like to make as a response to today’s gospel?

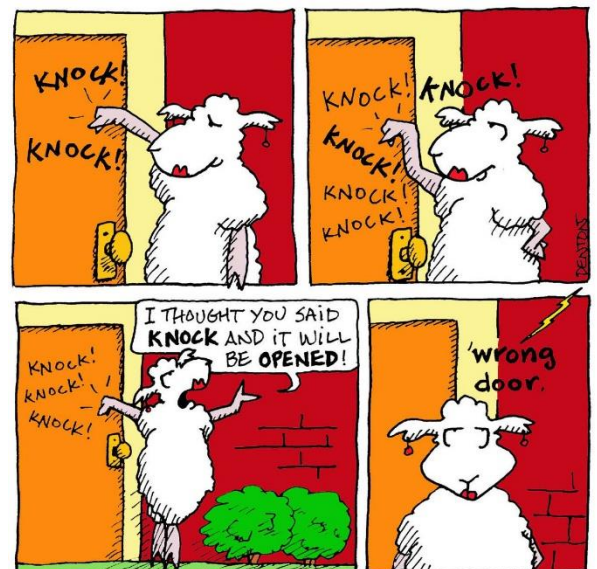

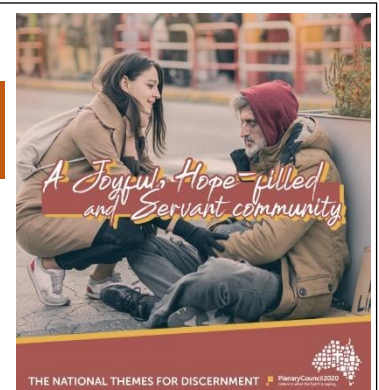


PLenary COUNCIL 2020: National Theme for Discernment #4

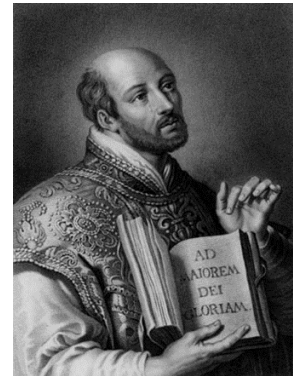

SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA
 Patron Saint of Spiritual Retreats
 Feast Day: July 31st



Saint Ignatius of Loyola was a Spanish Basque priest and theologian, and one of the most influential figures in the Catholic Reformation of the 16th century. He was the founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in Paris in 1534. St. Ignatius was born on 23rd October 1491, one of 13 children of a family of minor nobility, in Azpeitia, Spain. As a young man Ignatius Loyola was inflamed by the ideals of courtly love and knighthood and dreamed of doing great deeds.

But in 1521 Ignatius was gravely wounded in a battle with the French. While recuperating, Ignatius Loyola experienced a conversion. Reading the lives of Jesus and the saints made Ignatius happy and aroused desires to do great things. Ignatius realized that these feelings were clues to God’s direction for him.

Over the years, Ignatius became expert in the art of spiritual direction. He collected his insights, prayers, and suggestions in his book the Spiritual Exercises, one of the most influential books on the spiritual life ever written.

Ignatius Loyola was beatified by Pope Paul V in 1609 and canonized by Pope Gregory XV on March 12, 1622. In 1922 he was declared patron of all spiritual retreats by Pope Pius XI.

His achievements and those of his followers form a very important chapter in the history of the Roman Catholic church. English translations of Ignatius’s two most important works are The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, and The Constitutions of the Society of Jesus.

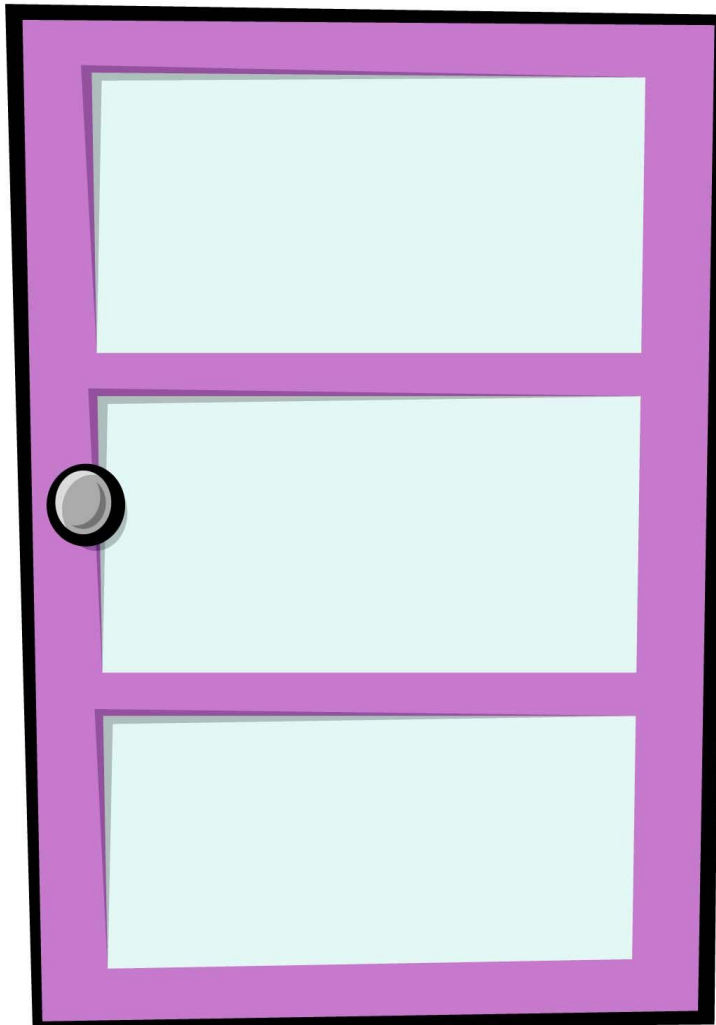

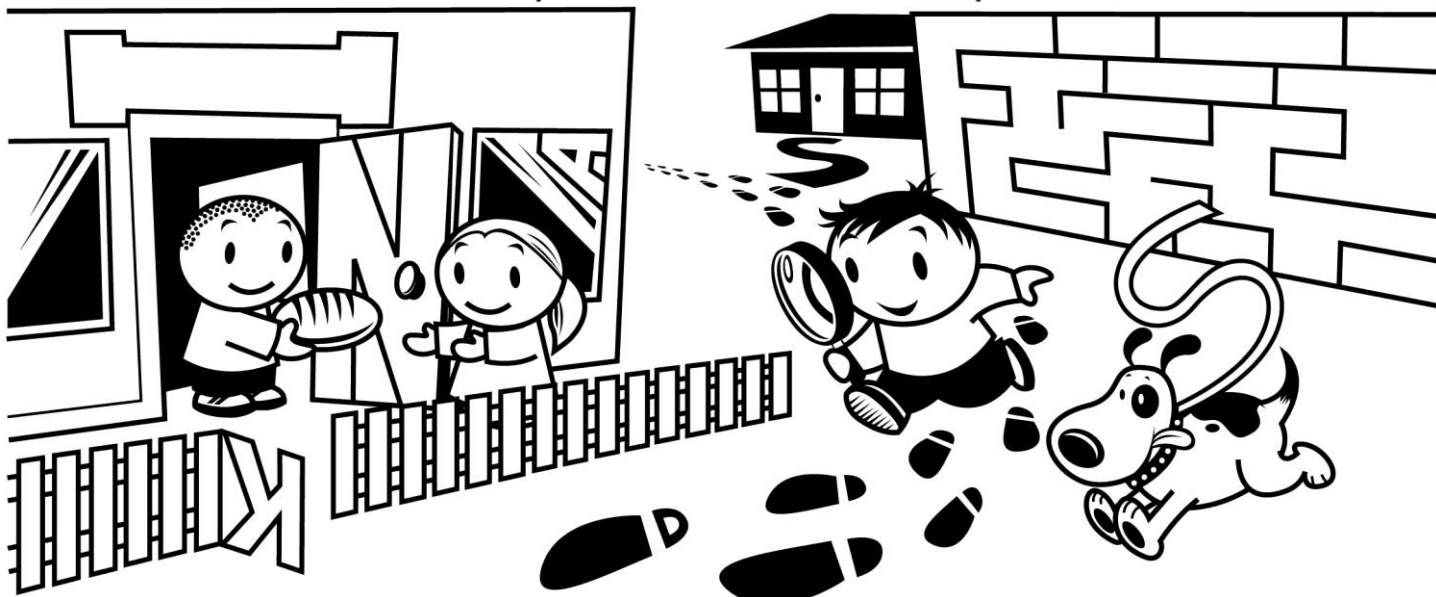
