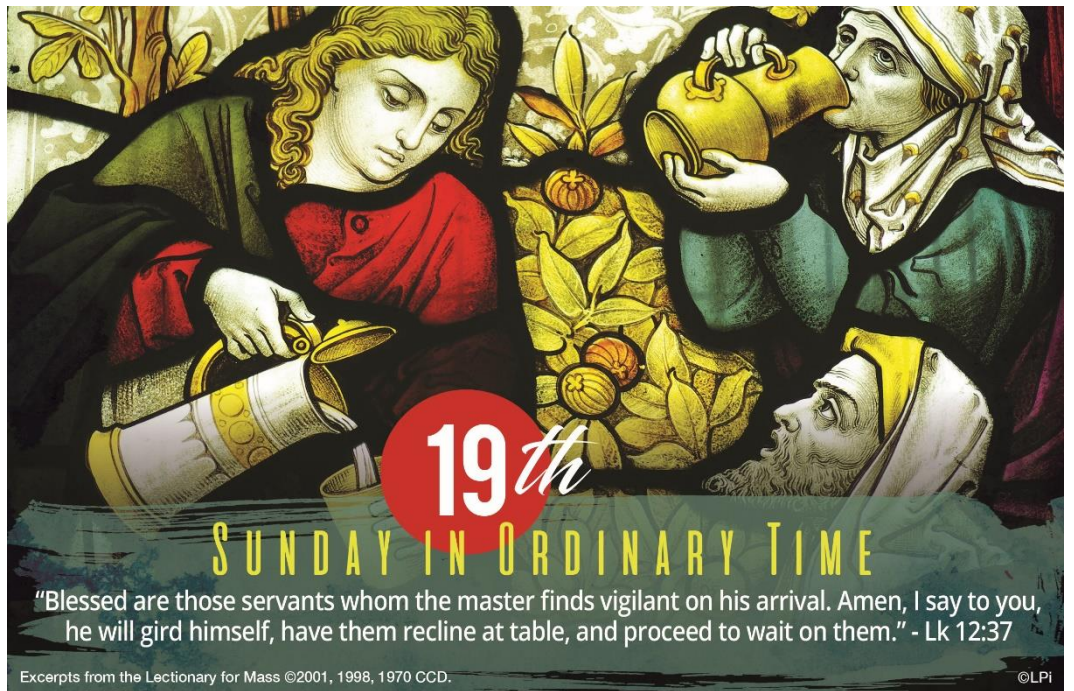

Like most of the children in town, Bro Tuyen went to schools Monday to Saturday, went to Church almost every day and attended the catechist classes two days a week. With five boys in the family, his parents didn't hire helpers in their banana plantation.

He studied and completed the mechanical engineering at Ho Chi Minh City University of Technology and Education in Ho Chi Minh city. It was only when he was in the university that he attended parties and other social functions, it was because he was far from home.

He was attracted to pretty girls since he was 10 yrs old but it did not surpass his love to play soccer and other games whom he loved to play with friends.

He felt he had a calling, not surprising to consider the family's spiritual practice and his environment. His parents let the children to make their own decisions. Their only requirement is for them to finish a degree. Hoang, the eldest finished a Business Management course; Vinh like Bro Tuyen finished Mechanical Engineering, Sang got an IT degree and Cao the youngest is still studying Mechanical Engineering.

Bro Tuyen got an uncle in Belmore who is a friend of Fr Tan's relative. When Bro Tuyen has expressed his desire to be an Augustinian, his uncle has mentioned it to Fr Tan's relative who in turn told it to Fr Tan. When Fr Tan learned of this news, he together with Fr Tony Banks both OSA went to Vietnam in 2011. That time Bro Tuyen was already serious about his vocation. He finished his engineering degree in 2012 and the next year he moved to Brookvale.

REFLECTION

Historical Context – Parousia

The Greek word parousia means ‘presence’ or ‘arrival’. In ancient times the word was usually associated with the formal visit of a king or a ruler. The parousia of a king was a significant and sometimes formidable event. In the writings of the New Testament, the word is used for the return of Christ, the drawing to a close of salvation history and the full establishment of the kingdom of God. The earliest Christians expected to see the Parousia in their own lifetimes. The realisation that this was not to be the case led to a rethinking about living a Christian life.

Gospel Focus – Answer the question!

Peter asks Jesus very specifically, ‘Lord, do you mean this parable for us, or for everyone?’ Frustratingly for Peter (and for the audience), Jesus doesn’t give the direct question a direct answer, he answers the question with another story. Throughout the gospels, this is a constant tactic used by Jesus. He almost never gives a question a straightforward answer. By doing this, he invites the questioner to reflect on their own question and their purpose in asking it in the first place. He also cleverly avoids being tied down to a yes/no answer when a matter is not that simple.

Have you thought? – Stewardship

Jesus responds to Peter’s questioning the gospel in a roundabout way by speaking about a steward acting either faithfully and with wisdom or alternatively irresponsibly and recklessly. A steward is one who stands in the place of the master during the master’s absence – taking on the duties, responsibilities and authority of the master. That’s exactly what Christian people are called to do: become stewards who act in the place of Jesus as we await his return. As the prayer of St Teresa of Avila says, Christ has no body now on earth but yours.

Questions for Adults

How do you understand Jesus’ saying, ‘where your treasure is, there will your heart be also’? In what ways does this passage suggest that we are accountable for our actions and attitudes? Does the language of ‘servant’ and ‘master’ get in the way of a modern reader’s understanding? Where today do those who have ‘had a great deal given’ need to step up to what is expected of them?

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST CLARE OF MONTEFALCO

Also known as St Clare of the Cross
Patron Saint of Montefalco
Feast Day: 17th August



Clare Damiani was born in 1268 in Montefalco, Umbria, Italy. At 6 years of age, she was placed in the convent of Saint Illuminata, where her sister Jane was superior. Clare observed the rule of the Third Order of St Francis and led a life of prayer and penance.

In 1290, when Clare and the other sisters moved to a new convent in Santa Croce, the bishop of Spoleto substituted the rule of St Augustine.

After the death of her sister in 1298, Clare was chosen superior. She carried out her duties in an exemplary manner, and performed many miracles. During the latter part of her life, she also received the gifts of ecstasy and supernatural knowledge. She was deeply devoted to the Passion of Christ.

It is related that our Lord, carrying His Cross, appeared to Saint Clare of Montefalco and said: "I have been searching for a long time, daughter, to find a firm and solid place on which to plant My Cross, and I have not found one more suitable than your heart. You must receive it and allow it to take root."

When Saint Clare's heart was opened after her death, the Cross and other instruments of the Passion were found within, formed solidly in fibrous tissue. For this reason she is also called Saint Clare of the Cross.

Clare of Montefalco died on August 17, 1308, and was buried in the chapel of Santa Croce Convent. She was canonized by Pope Leo XIII on 8th December 1881.

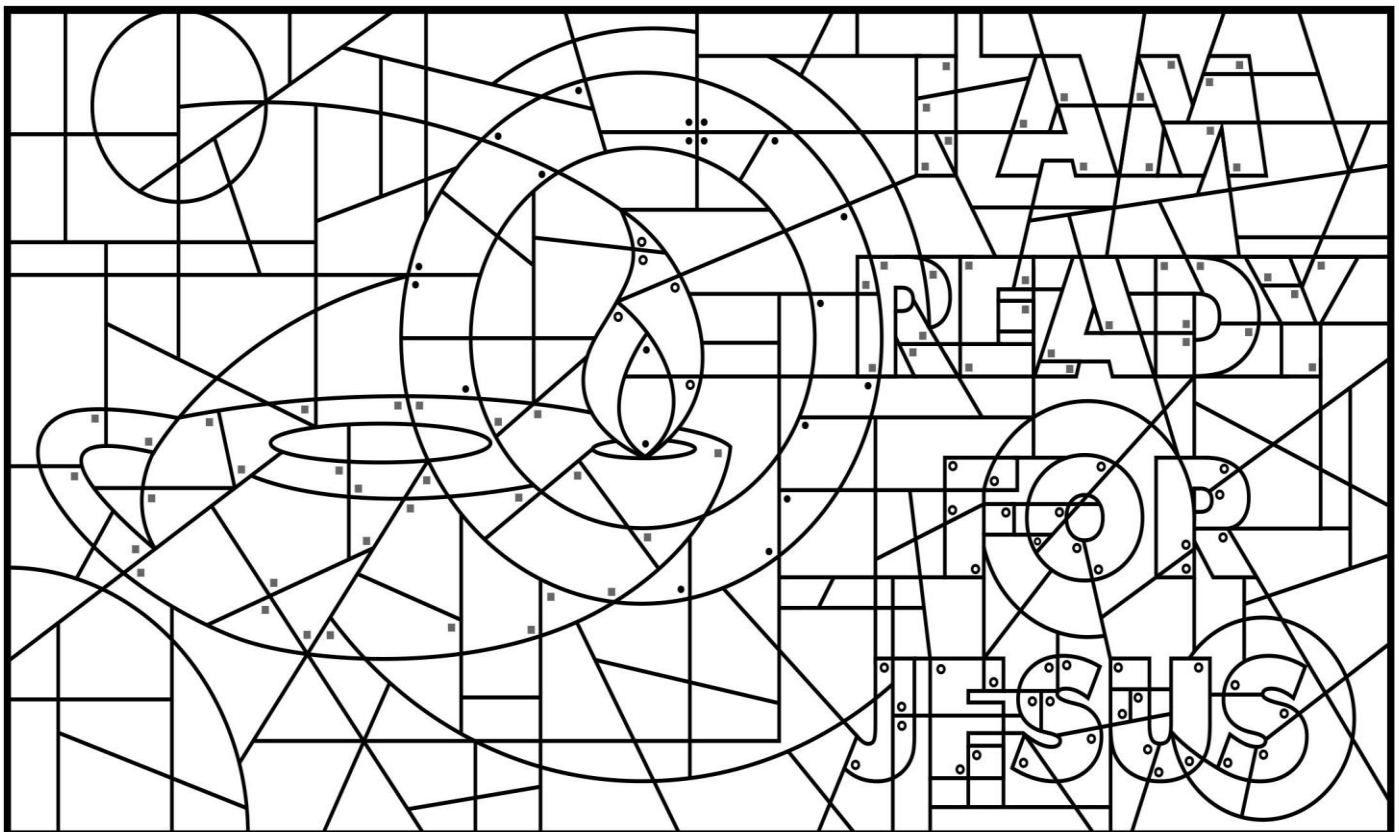
