#### **VOICE FROM THE PEWS**

I remember telling one of my theology teachers that I was looking forward to heaven so I could have all my questions answered. (Was it really just a lone shooter who killed President Kennedy?) My teacher commented that perhaps being in heaven meant not caring about having all the answers. That led to another question, even more difficult to answer: What is heaven like?

No one knows what happens when we die, but the children of God know it's going to be great. Through, with and in Jesus we will also be with and in God. After the Resurrection we know that we will be whole in body, spirit and mind. Imagine life without any kind of pain or struggle, filled with love, joy and all that is good.

I remember how difficult it was when my mother died. The emptiness I felt after her funeral was devastating. I missed her so much. But over the years I have grown into a new relationship with Mom. I experience her presence often, and know that she loves me now as she was never able to love me when she was alive. She can love me unconditionally, like God loves me, and that is a great comfort.

That is what I think heaven will be like: being with Mom, Dad and my sister, plus a host of other folks, being loved perfectly and being able to love perfectly, just as God loves. Who cares about mansions or streets of gold? What could top an eternity of that kind of love?

#### **REFLECTION**

#### Scriptural Context - The Law of Moses

The first five books of what we know as the Bible make up what Jews regard as the Torah (the Law). Right up until the second half of the 19th Century, it was accepted that Moses was the author of these five books. Literary criticism reveals a variety of authors and editors and the books are now thought to have been written at the time of the Jewish exile in Babylon. Despite this, Moses holds a special place in Judaism as the 'Lawgiver' because of his part in the Ten Commandments and he tends to be associated with the whole of the books of Law - the Torah.

#### Gospel Focus - I am who am

The Sadducees quote the Law of Moses at Jesus but he goes one better by quoting the very conversation when Moses encountered God in the burning bush. In this encounter, God reveals Godself to be the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. God does not say, I was the God of Abraham, but rather I am the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. This distinction confirms that the relationship is ongoing, not stuck in a time before their death. It is in this same encounter that God reveals God's name as 'I am who am' - represented in Hebrew by the letters YHWH from which we get Yahweh.

#### Have you thought? - Life after death

The ancient Greeks, Romans and Egyptians all had detailed mythologies about life and death. For the most part, any concept of what occurred after death revolved around images of an underworld of torment and misery. The Jewish idea of a life after death begins to take shape based on the notion that the love of God for each person is so abundant and so indulgent that it is not limited even by death. However, the notion of resurrection developed to be an understanding of what would happen 'one day' – a great resurrection of all people at the end of time.

#### **Questions for Adults**

Why does the gospel writer need to explain that Sadducees don't believe in a resurrection? What does it tell us about 1st Century Judaism that different groups held some different beliefs? Why might the Law have insisted that a man marry his brother's wife if the brother died childless? What link exists between today's reading and the Nicene Creed that is said during the Mass?





#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

#### **SAINT GERTRUDE**

Patron Saint of the West Indies Feast Day: 16<sup>th</sup> November



Gertrude, one of the great mystics of the 13th century, was born on the feast of the Epiphany, January 6, 1256, in Eisleben, Thuringia (within the Holy Roman Empire). At the age of four, she entered the monastery school of St. Mary at Helfta, as an orphan.

At the age of 25, she experienced the first of a series of visions that continued throughout her life.

Gertrude devoted herself strongly to personal prayer and meditation, and began writing spiritual treatises for the benefit of her monastic sisters. She practiced a spirituality called "nuptial mysticism," that is, she came to see herself as the bride of Christ and was devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.


Gertrude wrote "The Herald of Divine Love", amongst numerous others, and "Spiritual Exercises", which can be used by anyone who seeks to deepen spirituality through prayer and meditation.

Gertrude showed "tender sympathy towards the souls in purgatory" and urged prayers for them. She is therefore invoked for suffering souls in purgatory. Gertrude died at Helfta, near Eisleben, Saxony, around 1302. Her feast day is celebrated on November 16, but the exact date of her death is unknown. She was canonized in 1677 by Clement XII.

In compliance with a petition from King Phillip IV of Spain, she was declared Patroness of the West Indies. In Peru her feast is celebrated with great pomp, and in New Mexico the town Santa Gertrudis de lo de Mora was built in her honour and bears her name.
