

#### **VOICE FROM THE PEWS**

What, where and when is this kingdom in which Jesus Christ rules? Before Jesus even began preaching, John the Baptist announced that the kingdom of God was at hand. Jesus, himself, announced that the kingdom was upon us (Luke 11:20). But he also said that it was yet to come (Luke 22:30). How can we explain this paradox of time and place?

The not-so-simple fact is that the kingdom of God is not a set place, nor a particular time. The popular idea of heaven (an afterlife for the good), and the kingdom of God are not synonymous. The kingdom of God is whenever and wherever we find God present in action— good triumphing over evil.

When John the Baptist proclaimed the coming of the kingdom, he was announcing the coming of Jesus. As Jesus walked the earth, he was literally God in action. He confronted evil wherever he found it—prejudice, greed, selfishness, even sickness and death—and he won. Wherever,

whenever Jesus was and is, we find the kingdom. And whenever, wherever people continue to bring Christ's justice, forgiveness, healing and wholeness, we find the kingdom.

All of this, the cosmic battle between good and evil, and the victory won for us through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus is recorded for us in Scripture. It is the story of our faith, a story that is not finished yet. We believe the fullness of the kingdom is yet to come. Jesus promised that one day good would finally triumph, defeating evil forever. On that day we will enter the full reign of Christ as King.

#### **FAMILY RESPONSE:**

The kingdom of God begins in your home. Talk about ways you can let others know you love them without saying the words.

#### REFLECTION

#### **Historical Context - Christ the King**

The Feast of Christ the King was introduced to the liturgical calendar by Pope Pius XI in 1925. The establishment of the feast took place in a world that had suffered through the First World War and was unknowingly heading towards the Second World War. In this setting, the world was experiencing a dramatic growth in secularism and an even more dramatic growth in dictators who were rising to power in various states. The introduction of the feast was a call back from the secular and a call to remember Christ as having authority above and beyond any earthly leader.

#### **Scriptural Context - Shepherd and Criminals**

The gospel of Luke is underlined by a message of hope for those who are afflicted, outcast and poor. In this gospel, the message and ministry of Jesus are directed specifically to these lowly ones. The significance of the role played by the poor is highlighted by the framing of the whole narrative in this gospel: the birth of Jesus is celebrated by shepherds and his death is accompanied by criminals. Shepherds and criminals – two classes of people on the absolute fringe of society; not dignitaries or wise men from afar – are witness to the birth and death of Jesus.

#### Gospel Focus - A kingdom of inclusion

In response to the criminal's faith, Jesus assures him, 'today you will be with me in paradise'. There is a certainty and immediacy about the response. Jesus does not tell him that some time in the future he will be rewarded for his faith. No, it is today that the criminal will join Jesus in paradise. It is an expression of the welcome and inclusion that Jesus has extended to the outsider and undervalued throughout his ministry. It is a clear indication that the Kingdom of God that Jesus has worked to bring about is a kingdom of inclusion and welcome.

#### **Questions for Adults**

Why might the lectionary include only this short aspect of the crucifixion? Which word or phrase from the gospel most catches your attention? Why? What can we learn from the interaction between Jesus and the second criminal? Where can we see reflections of the attitudes of the first and second criminals today?



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

#### **SAINT ANDREW**

Apostle and Martyr Feast Day: 30th November



Born in 7 BC in Bethsaida, Galilee, Andrew, the Apostle, was the first disciple of Jesus. He was the elder brother of Saint Peter, and, like his brother, was a fisherman by trade.

At first, the two brothers continued to carry on their fishing trade but later, the Lord called them to stay with Him all the time. He promised to make them fishers of men, and this time, they left their nets for good.

Andrew went through life leading people to Jesus, both before and after the Crucifixion. He was a missionary in Asia Minor and Greece, and possibly areas in modern Russia and Poland.

Martyred on a saltire (x-shaped) cross, he is said to have preached for two days from it before he finally died on November 30, 60 AD, in Patras, Greece.

His relics were destroyed in c.1559 by Protestants. Major shrines dedicated to Saint Andrew are found in Italy, Greece, Edinburgh and Warsaw.

Saint Andrew is often depicted in pictures with a saltire cross symbolizing the manner of his martyrdom.
