

REFLECTION

Historical Context - Service in the Temple

The ritual of the redemption of the first-born son originates in Exodus 13:2 where God claimed the first-born sons of Israel as God's own. These sons were to be sanctified for service in the Temple. However, this service was taken away from the first-born sons of every tribe and reserved exclusively for the sons of the tribe of Levi and the descendants of Aaron, the high-priest. It is from this tradition that we encounter the 'Levites' in the gospel accounts. The Levites were involved in various ministries in the Temple: assisting the priests; musicians; and slaughtering sacrifices.

Have you thought? - The role of the observer

In today's gospel passage, it is the devout Simeon and the prophetess, Anna, who declare the greatness and far-reaching influence of the child that has been brought to the Temple. This is a common feature of the gospel accounts. It is not Jesus himself who proclaims his greatness but those who have observed him and recognised the revelation of God's presence amongst the people. It is a role that continues today. Those of us who believe and recognise the presence and influence of God in the world are challenged to proclaim it in both our actions and our words.

Gospel Focus - A sword

Simeon's second pronouncement about Jesus is addressed to the child's mother, Mary. Having predicted the rejection that Jesus will endure, Simeon tells Mary, 'and a sword will pierce your own soul too.' He appears to be referring to the sacrifice that Mary will have to make in the future. On this day, Mary and Joseph have 'redeemed' their son from service to the Lord in the Temple. Despite this, Jesus is still destined for service to God and Mary will have to surrender him back to the Lord. Simeon suggests that Mary herself will be a sacrifice offered to God at this time.

Questions for Adults

In what way does Simeon suggest that the ministry of Jesus will reach beyond the Jews to Gentiles? Why do many images of Mary and Joseph portray them in rich costumes and not their poorer status? Why might the gospel writer have combined the two separate rituals into the one event? How does this episode reflect the hopes and dreams that all new parents hold for their child?





SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT JEROME EMILIANI

Patron Saint of Orphans and Abandoned Children Feast Day : 8th February



Born in 1481 in Venice, Italy, to wealthy parents, Saint Jerome ran away from home at age 15 following the death of his father. He became a soldier in Venice, Italy, in 1506, and commanded the League of Cambrai forces near Treviso, Italy.

He was captured by Venetian forces in August 1511, bound with chains and thrown into prison, where he had a lot of time to think about God and gradually learned how to pray, asking Our Lady for help. He was miraculously freed by an apparition.

He was made Mayor of Treviso, whilst studying for the priesthood. Jerome was ordained in 1518 – the year of the plague.

He cared for the sick, and housed orphans in his own home. At night he roamed the streets burying those who had collapsed and died unattended.


He founded six orphanages in the town of Somasca, a shelter for penitent prostitutes, a hospital and a seminary. He also founded the *Order of Somaschi* (or Somascan Fathers). He is also believed to have developed the question-and-answer catechism technique for teaching children religion.

He fell ill while taking care of the sick and died on 8th February, 1537 at the age of 56. He was beatified on 29th September 1747 by Pope Benedict XIV, canonized on 16th July, 1767, by Pope Clement XIII, and declared the Patron Saint of orphans and abandoned children by Pope Pius XI in 1928.
