

REFLECTION

Historical Context - Light of the world

The events of today's gospel passage occur within an extended passage of the gospel of John in which Jesus attends Jerusalem for the Feast of Tabernacles (Jn 7:1 following). A feature of the feast was the illumination of the Temple. Pilgrims would cover the Temple with lights and torches so that it shone out over the entire city. It was during this feast that Jesus declared himself to be the Light of the World and, a few verses later, healed the blind man and brought light into his world.

Living the Gospel - Lenten light

The story of the man born blind is a perfect choice for the Lenten season. During this season we are invited once again to open our eyes to Jesus; to step out of darkness and into the light; to look towards the future with hope and not despair. When we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus at the Easter vigil, we celebrate the coming of the Light of the World into our lives. This annual call to turn away from darkness and walk in the light is a powerful and poetic call to focus our lives on the way of Jesus.

Gospel Focus - None so blind

There's a very old saying that has its roots in the Bible but is not a direct quote from the Bible: 'There are none so blind as those who will not see.' It would be a fitting summary of today's passage for there are two movements between darkness and light that are evident in the story. Firstly, there is the blind man who can see. He can see physically but can also see the truth of who Jesus is. Secondly, there are the Jewish authorities who have physical sight but are completely blind to the truth of Jesus.

Questions for Adults

How does the pattern of this story differ from most of the healing stories in the gospels? What is the man's logical argument to the Jewish authorities regarding Jesus? What are areas of blindness or darkness in our world today that need the light of Jesus? In what ways can you be the light of Christ for others?



Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope everyone is keeping well and safe with this Coronavirus outbreak in our midst. This pandemic has brought us face to face with a reality that none of us could have imagined.

You will see three inserts in our bulletin this weekend. They are:

- 1. an update from Parramatta Diocese
- 2. Faith-fully Navigating Coronavirus with your Kids (for families with young kids)
- 3. Planned Giving Pledge Form

As mentioned in the statement, all Catholics are dispensed from the Sunday obligations. With this, I will strongly advise those who are 70 years and older, who are sick and infirm and who have underlying health issues to not come to mass. My concern always is for all parishioners, but at this stage I think our most vulnerable should be carefully considered.

We will have the same mass times at Holy Spirit but with additional restrictions. Following the advise from the Federal Government, we will only have 100 chairs (including clergy and other ministers) inside the church. The rest of the assembly can stay in the covered area of the school, just like we have the Good Friday and Christmas Eve celebrations. We will ensure that chairs will be arranged according to the suggested distance, i.e., 1.5 meters apart.

Access to church is from the main door and the side gate (from the carpark). As people enter the main door and/or the side gate, there will be tables for people to place their collections (1st and 2nd collections). Parish bulletins can be collected on the same table after mass.

Sanitisers are available near the holy water fonts.

When you process for communion, we advise you to observe distance.

Those seated outside the church will receive communion from there. There is no need to go inside the church to receive communion.

Children's Liturgy and Youth Nights are also temporarily suspended.

These guidelines will stay as it is until further notice.

Because our church collections have been down drastically in the past three weeks, we will be asking you to seriously consider joining the Direct Debit Planned Giving Program. If this scenario of having a very low church collection will stay for a while, our main worry is we don't have enough funds to pay for the bills, salary for our parish staff, Diocesan loan, insurance and other necessary expenditures. Forms are also available on our parish website.

If you have a Facebook account, I ask you to follow our parish's Facebook page (facebook.com/holyspiritstclair/). We will continue to post updates, notices, inspiring quotes and points for reflection on this platform.

Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. May our response to this crisis be a decisive witness of love and from love.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT BENJAMIN

Deacon and Martyr Feast Day: 31st March



Saint Benjamin, Deacon and Martyr, was born in Iran in 329AD. Christians in Persia had enjoyed twelve years of peace during the reign of Isdegerd, son of Sapor III, when in 420 it was disturbed by the indiscreet zeal of Abdas, a Christian Bishop who burned the Temple of Fire, the great sanctuary of the Persians. King Isdegerd threatened to destroy all the churches of the Christians unless the Bishop would rebuild it.

As Abdas refused to comply, the threat was executed; the churches were demolished, Abdas himself was put to death, and a general persecution began which lasted forty years. Isdegerd died in 421, but his son and successor, Varanes, carried on the persecution with great fury. The Christians were submitted to the most cruel tortures.

Among those who suffered was St. Benjamin, a Deacon, who had been imprisoned a year for his Faith. At the end of this period, an ambassador of the Emperor of Constantinople obtained his release on condition that he would never speak to any of the courtiers about religion.

St. Benjamin, however, declared it was his duty to preach Christ and that he could not be silent. Although he had been liberated on the agreement made with the ambassador and the Persian authorities, he would not acquiesce in it, and neglected no opportunity of preaching. He was again apprehended and brought before the king. The tyrant ordered that that he be tortured. Saint Benjamin expired in the most terrible agony about the year 424.
