

REFLECTION

Scriptural Context - Gospel Parallels

The account of the Transfiguration appears in all three synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke). The word, synoptic, means 'seen together' and these three gospels can be seen together because they have so much material in common. It is now accepted that the gospel of Mark was the first written as so much of it appears in the other two, while the gospels of Matthew and Luke both seem to have also drawn on another source of Jesus material (known as the 'Q' source). Despite the parallels, each writer uses the same story to convey the particular message of that gospel.

Living the Gospel - 'Listen to him!'

God's voice from the cloud claims Jesus as his Son, the Chosen One, and then goes on to instruct those present – and we, the readers – to 'Listen to him!' For the disciples, this was a message not to get carried away with their own ideas about the Messiah but to listen to what Jesus was saying about the suffering he must endure and to what he was saying about true discipleship. Jesus tells us that to be a follower of his involves sacrifice, hardship and often unpopularity. It is this message we must listen to as much as the promise of salvation

Gospel Focus - A new vision

Peter sees the appearance of Elijah and Moses as a confirmation that Jesus has come to continue the work of the great prophets of the past. Rather than placing Jesus in the old tradition of the prophets, the appearance of Elijah and Moses, together with the voice of God, is to endorse the new direction that Jesus' ministry is taking. Jesus' new vision for the world is informed by the relationships forged between God and the prophets of the past, but it is a vision of a completely different way of relating to God: a much more personal relationship that calls us to respond from the heart to those around us.

Questions for Adults

What message did the Transfiguration hold for the three disciples who witnessed it? What message does the event hold for us today? Have you ever had the experience of not wanting to 'go back down the mountain'? Why is this reading chosen for use in the season of Lent?

Unit overview and content

This unit provides an advanced study of the body of thought known as Catholic Social Teaching (CST), sometimes called 'the Church's Best Kept Secret'.

It begins by situating within a philosophical context, examining a variety of theories of justice, from Plato and Aristotle through to modern philosophers such as John Stuart Mill and John Rawls. Out of this foundation it then examines, in-depth, the historical development of modern Catholic Social Teaching, especially as it has been expressed in the Church's official documents and by experts in the field. Finally, the course allows students to apply their advanced knowledge of this field to a particular case study of their choice.

Dear brothers and sisters.

Re: COVID-19 Update

You will be aware through the media and other sources of emerging concerns over the spread of COVID-19 (earlier referred to corona virus.)

Several weeks ago, I issued on behalf of Bishop Vincent some directions around certain liturgical practices which have been accepted by the clergy and people of the Diocese, and it has provided a measure of protection and comfort for many of our people who are rightly concerned about this health issue.

A new set of directions were sent to the clergy today which adheres to advice that we have received from public health authorities about the risks of transmission associated with the virus. One of these risks concerns the administration of Holy Communion.

In the Latin Church, Holy Communion can be received in two ways, either on the tongue or in the hand. From today, Holy Communion can only be received in the hand because of the high risk of transmission if people continue to receive on the tongue.

I understand that for those of you who normally received Holy Communion on the tongue that this is a matter of pious practice and reverence for the Blessed Sacrament and that you may have been doing so your entire life. In the current circumstances, I ask that you adjust to the practice of Holy Communion in the hand for the sake of your fellow parishioners.

I further ask that you respect those administering Holy Communion, both ordinary and extraordinary ministers, who have received a directive that they cannot administer Holy Communion on the tongue.

As soon as this health risk is mitigated, and advice comes from the public health officials we will revert to the usual liturgical practices that applied before the appearance of COVID-19.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT FINA (SERAPHINA)

Patron Saint of Gimignano, Tuscany, Italy Feast Day: 12th March



St. Fina or Seraphina, Virgin A.D. 1253 was born of poor parents in the town of San Gimignano and is remembered as a Saint for the perfect resignation with which she accepted her bodily suffering. She lived the life of a recluse at home, spending much of the night in prayer.

Her father died when she was still young and around this time, Fina was attacked by a sudden complication of diseases which caused paralysis. Her mother had to leave her for hours while she went to work or beg, but Fina never complained. Desiring to be like Our Lord on the cross, for six years she lay on a plank in one position, unable to turn or to move. Although in terrible pain she always maintained serenity and with her eyes fixed upon the crucifix she kept on repeating, "It is not my wounds but thine, O Christ, that hurt me".

Her mother died suddenly and Fina was left utterly destitute except for one devoted friend Beldia. Someone had told her about St. Gregory the Great and his sufferings, and she had had a special veneration for him. She used to pray to him to intercede with God that she might have patience in her affliction. Eight days before her death as she lay alone and untended, Gregory appeared to her and said, "Dear child on my festival God will give you rest". And it came to pass when her body was removed from the board on which it had rested, the rotten wood was found to be covered with white violets.

All the city attended the funeral and many miracles were reported as having been wrought through her intercession. From St. Fina's example we come to know the power of living hope-filled lives, with trust in God's dream for each one of us.
