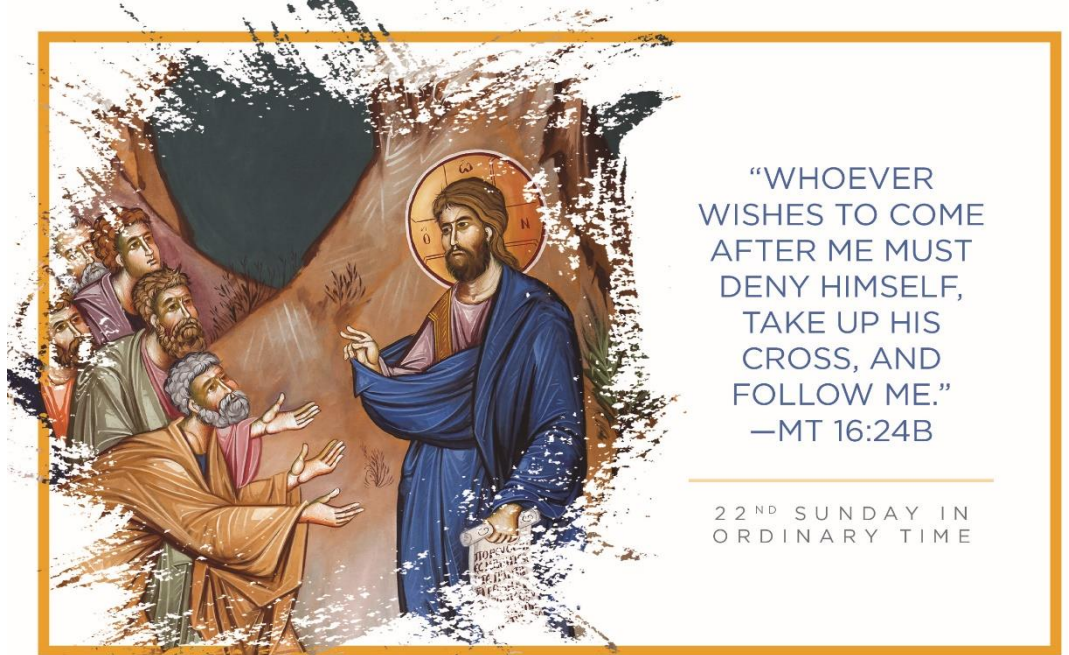

VOICE FROM THE PEWS

God's ways are not always the accepted way of the culture in which we live. Probably our most difficult job as Catholic parents is to instill in our children a value system based on the Gospels rather than the society that surrounds them.

Our children are bombarded constantly with the values of a secular society that prizes possessions and position over just about everything else. The commercial world of social media, magazines, and Amazon teaches them to want more and more, while the competitive worlds of academics and athletic teach them the importance of being number one. We adults can get trapped on this treadmill ourselves wanting a bigger and better car or home, the newest technological gadgets, or pushing ourselves to be the top salesperson or youngest VP in the company.

Jesus tells us to think as God thinks and to see things from God's perspective, not our own. God sees things outside of time. He sees that the treadmill of wanting more and more only gets us to the nowhere of never having enough. God sees globally: for every winner there are thousands of losers, for every rich person there are millions of poor.

We have to help our children trust in God's promise to provide all that they need. We have to help them see that God has a vested interest in each of them becoming their own personal best, not "better than" anyone else. This is definitely one of those lessons our children need to see us witness. It can't become just another sermon. We lose all credibility if we preach it without living it ourselves.

Secular problems require savvy secular solutions. We are trained to solve problems, be successful and productive, and find our way through all that life presents to us. Corporations value those who can decipher the best avenue to take in order to resolve an issue. How do you train and renew your mind? Facts, figures, scientific tools, analytical processes, best practices, and models of varying kinds are at our disposal. If we don't know the full and proper course of action, we can easily find it. But there is a knowledge that goes far beyond all these things that makes a direct claim on the essence of our being. It satisfies a deeper thirst and hunger that keeps us restless until it is satisfied. Our minds, hearts, and souls cannot only be nurtured purely by secular and temporal things. Gospel Reading: Peter and Jesus have an intense exchange of words over Jesus' revelation that as the Messiah, he will suffer and die. How often do you think there was tension between Jesus and his 12 apostles?

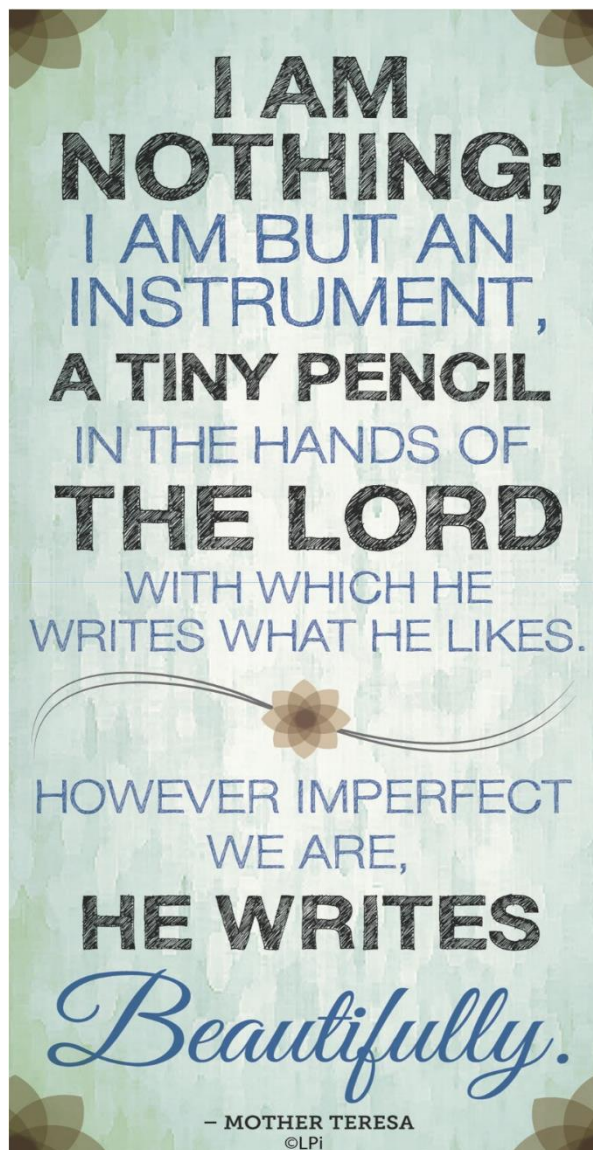

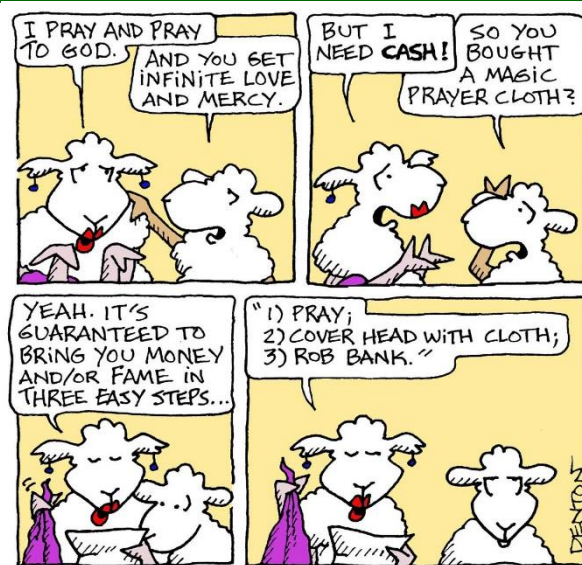

With the announcement of new restrictions commencing last Friday 24th July, we are allowed to have 100 people in the church at any one time, excluding the clergy and those involved in the liturgy. Congregational singing is strictly prohibited.

For those who have no internet access, you can contact the Parish Office from Tuesday to Friday, between 9am and 5pm. Please wait for confirmation of your booking from the Parish Office.

Mass Attendance Cards cannot be used for weekend Masses.

As you come to church, ushers will check if your name is in the list. NO REGISTRATION NO ENTRY.

For WEEKDAY MASSES:

There is no need to book when you come to the Weekday Masses. Complete the Mass Attendance cards available in the foyer. One card for each household per mass. Drop the completed card on the day you are attending in the designated box provided in the foyer.

For PRIVATE DEVOTIONS AND PRAYERS:

Please sign-in when you come to church for private devotions and prayers. Complete the SIGN-IN cards (BLUE-coloured forms) available in the foyer. One card for each household per entry. Drop the completed card on the day in the designated box provided in the foyer.

All these information gathering methods are in compliance with the NSW Department of Health for contact tracing.

In order to maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- Families and those living under one household sit together.
- Proceed to end of row if vacant.
- Leave 3 chairs empty between you and another household.

The elderly, those with health conditions, flu-like symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home.

Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.

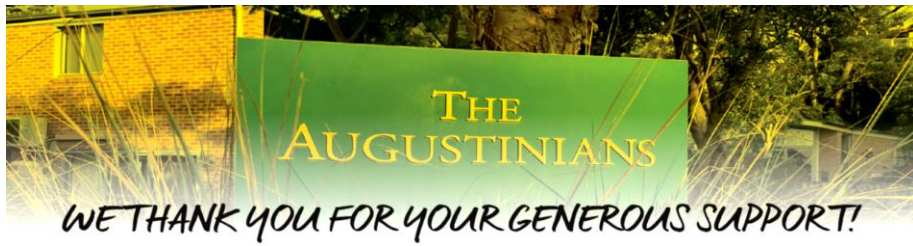


**WEAR A MASK

**WHY DO WE DO THAT?
Catholic Life Explained**

Question:

How many times a day can a person receive communion?

Answer:

To find an answer to this question, we need to turn to the Church’s Code of Canon Law. Here we read, “One who has received the blessed Eucharist may receive it again on the same day only within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates ...” (no. 917). This tells us that the standard answer would be that we can receive communion twice in a day.

Having said that, we also want to be sure that we pay attention to the entire instruction. The phrase “within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates” is important. It means a) that we always have to think of receiving communion as being within a celebration of the Mass and b) we have to be participants in that celebration – we can’t simply show up “in time” for communion.

So, when would this rule apply?

For example, if you attend Mass on a Saturday morning and then take part in the Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday evening, you could licitly receive communion at both celebrations. Or, another example, if you receive communion at a wedding or funeral Mass, you could also receive communion at a daily Mass or Sunday Vigil celebrated on the same day. We always want to be sure that we observe the rules for fasting from food and drink before receiving the eucharist (see Code of Canon Law, no. 919).

We should also remember that the Code of Canon Law instructs that anyone who is in danger of death or seriously ill may also receive communion a second time (no. 91, §2).

TAP & GO MACHINES AND REGULAR CHURCH CONTRIBUTION

The passing of collection plate by parishioners along the pews is now a thing of the past as some churches have already decided to stop using it to help stop the spread of the virus.

The Tap & Go machines are available in the church foyer and are set to \$10 per tap. If you wish to donate more than that simply tap your credit card as many times as you like. It also accepts Apple Pay, Google Pay and Pay Wave.

Each machine is labeled to where contributions go to. One machine supports the ministry of our Augustinian clergy and the second machine supports the maintenance and development of the Parish. Thank you for your generosity.

Another option, if you prefer a cashless transaction, is to sign-up for Regular Church Contribution (Planned Giving) by direct debit/credit card. Forms are available in the foyer and on our parish website.

We encourage you to give electronically as this saves the parish a significant amount of money and time. This is your church and your parish—we depend on your financial support to grow and nourish our parishioners.

Collection baskets are still available in the church.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT THERESA OF CALCUTTA

Patron Saint of World Youth Day

Feast Day : 5th September



Saint Theresa of Calcutta was a Roman Catholic Albanian-Indian nun and missionary. Named Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu, she was the youngest child born to Nikola and Drane Bojaxhiu on August 26, 1910 in Skopje, Macedonia. Assisted by the Jesuit parish of the Sacred Heart, Gonxha left her home at the age of 18 to join the Institute of the Blessed Virgin Mary, known as the Sisters of Loreto, in Ireland.

In December 1929, after arriving in Calcutta, Sister Mary Theresa was assigned to the Loreto community and taught at St. Mary's School for girls. In 1937 after her Final Profession of Vows, became the "spouse of Jesus" for "all eternity" and was called Mother Teresa. On September 10, 1946, during a train ride from Calcutta to Darjeeling for her annual retreat, Mother Teresa received her "inspiration, her call within a call". On August 17, 1948, she dressed in a white, blue-bordered sari and left the Convent, to find and serve Jesus amongst "the unwanted, the unloved, the uncared for." On October 7, 1950, she established the new congregation of the Missionaries of Charity in the Archdiocese of Calcutta. She received the Indian Padmashri Award in 1962 and the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979, 'for the glory of God and in the name of the poor'.

Despite her failing health, Mother Teresa continued to govern her Society and respond to the needs of the poor and the Church.

Mother Teresa died in Calcutta on September 5, 1997, and was given a State funeral by the Government of India. Her tomb at the Mother House of the Missionaries of Charity quickly became a place of pilgrimage and prayer for people of all faiths, rich and poor alike. Mother Teresa was beatified by Pope John Paul II on October 19, 2003, and canonized by Pope Francis on September 4, 2016.
