

## VOICE FROM THE PEWS

In all honesty, this Gospel story always caused me concern. I found myself on the side of the workers who had labored all day. When I listened to my inner voice, I sounded like a four-year old, “That’s not fair!” Then one Sunday a priest told a story in his homily that helped me understand the parable a little better. I’ll share it with you.

A middle-aged husband and wife both die and find themselves surrounded by a large crowd standing in front of the pearly gates. An angel behind the gates tells the crowd that the gates to heaven will be opened at any moment, and eternal judgment will begin.

The husband gets more and more agitated as time passes and as he looks around at the crowd. “Good grief,” he tells his wife, “there’s George Walton, one of the biggest frauds in the state. What is he doing here in front of heaven’s gates? Does he honestly think he has a chance of making it in?” “Oh no,” he continues, “there’s the assassin Oswald. And is that

Adolph Hitler in the corner there waiting to be let in? “This is ludicrous,” he continues. “Those three should be sweltering in hell. What is God thinking of letting them even near the gates to heaven and close to good folks like us?”

At that moment, the man hears the booming voice of God telling him he has just passed judgment on himself, and he has failed. In questioning God’s love and generosity, he has shown his own lack of both. He was refused entrance through the pearly gates.

Jesus is clear in the parable of the landowner that God’s love and generosity is not to be questioned. We are all on the receiving end of what was promised. God’s generosity is something to celebrate, even if we are not the ones on the receiving end at that particular moment.

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



Think for a moment about the most special person in your life. Why do you love them? Many people will answer that question noting character traits they admire about the person, pointing to an indescribable compatibility that exists and describing a deep sense of connection and intimacy or even a sense of rightness about the relationship. In relationships that are authentic and true, rarely are the personal benefits gained from the relationship noted as motivating factors for its pursuit. If we truly love someone we do so simply because it is right and good to do so and not for some other self-serving reason. Why do you love God? The sense of happiness and the gift of mercy that come from that relationship are God's to give, regardless of when in life we come to Him. God's ways are different than ours.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

**First Reading:** While still in captivity in Babylon, Isaiah urged the Israelites to seek the Lord, for the Lord is near even in exile. When have you felt the Lord's presence in dark periods of your life?

**Second Reading:** In his letter to the Philippians written from prison and toward the end of his life, Paul reflects on his spiritual dilemma between life and death. How do you work through spiritual dilemmas?

**Gospel Reading:** Jesus' parable of the workers in the vineyard of the Lord offers us important insights into the Kingdom of Heaven and God's generosity. To whom do you think this parable is unsettling?



## COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES COMMENCING 24 JULY

With the announcement of new restrictions commencing last Friday 24<sup>th</sup> July, we are allowed to have 100 people in the church at any one time, excluding the clergy and those involved in the liturgy. Congregational singing is strictly prohibited.

### **For WEEKEND MASSES:**

BOOKING IS NECESSARY for Weekend Masses. To book:

For those who have no internet access, you can contact the Parish Office from Tuesday to Friday, between 9am and 5pm. Please wait for confirmation of your booking from the Parish Office.

Mass Attendance Cards cannot be used for weekend Masses.

As you come to church, ushers will check if your name is in the list. NO REGISTRATION NO ENTRY.

### **For WEEKDAY MASSES:**

There is no need to book when you come to the Weekday Masses. Complete the Mass Attendance cards available in the foyer. One card for each household per mass. Drop the completed card on the day you are attending in the designated box provided in the foyer.

### **For PRIVATE DEVOTIONS AND PRAYERS:**

Please sign-in when you come to church for private devotions and prayers. Complete the SIGN-IN cards (BLUE-coloured forms) available in the foyer. One card for each household per entry. Drop the completed card on the day in the designated box provided in the foyer.

All these information gathering methods are in compliance with the NSW Department of Health for contact tracing.

In order to maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- Families and those living under one household sit together.
- Proceed to end of row if vacant.
- Leave 3 chairs empty between you and another household.

*The elderly, those with health conditions, flu-like symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home.*

*Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.*



**WHY DO WE DO THAT?  
Catholic Life Explained**

**Question:**

If God is good, why is there evil in the world?

**Answer:**

The problem of evil is perplexing. If God is all-powerful and all-good, why doesn't He stop bad things for happening? He must either not be all-powerful, or perhaps He's not very good after all. Human beings have faced the possibility of evil since the very beginning of our existence. In granting us free will, God gives us the ability to make free choices. God does not force us into moral perfection. We are not forced to love Him or to love our neighbour. We must make the decision ourselves. This means, of course, that we have the ability to choose against love.

One small decision of selfishness, jealousy, or pride may not seem so bad. But every decision — good or bad — is like a stone dropped into a still pond. The ripples extend much farther than the original stone. When decisions against love begin to compound, they affect families, neighborhoods, and nations. This is all the more reason for Christians to be faithful to our baptismal call to love one another as Christ has loved us!



**SAINT OF THE WEEK**

**SAINT MATTHEW**

Patron Saint of Accountants, Bankers, Book-keepers and Stockbrokers  
Feast Day : 21<sup>st</sup> September



Little is known about St. Matthew, except that he was the son of Alpheus, and he was likely born in Galilee. He worked as a tax collector, which was a hated profession during the time of Christ.

According to the Gospel, Matthew was working at a collection booth in Capernaum when Christ came to him and asked, "Follow me." With this simple call, Matthew became a disciple of Christ.

From Matthew we know of the many doings of Christ and the message Christ spread of salvation for all people who come to God through Him.

Many years following the death of Christ, Matthew wrote his gospel account. He wrote the book in Aramaic in the hope that his account would convince his fellow people that Jesus was the Messiah and that His kingdom had been fulfilled in a spiritual way. It was an important message at a time when almost everyone was expecting the return of a militant messiah brandishing a sword.

It is thought he departed for other lands to escape persecution sometime after 42 AD. According to various legends he fled to Parthia and Persia, or Ethiopia. Nothing is recorded of Matthew's passing. We do not know how he died, if his death was natural or if he was martyred.

Saint Matthew is often depicted with one of the four living creatures of Revelation 4:7, which reads, "The first living creature was like a lion, the second like a bull, the third living creature had a human face, and the fourth living creature was like a flying eagle."

Matthew was a tax collector and is therefore the patron saint of bankers. The Church established St. Matthew's feast day as September 21.
