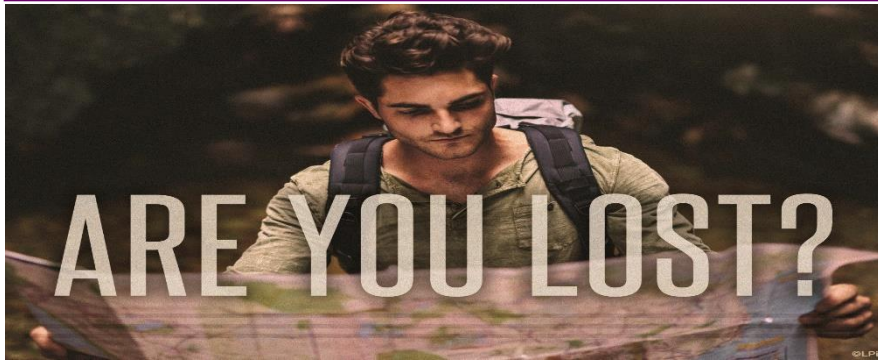

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



Does the world realize that it is waiting? As we go about all of the busyness of our lives and entertain our distractions, there are many holes and gaps in our lives that need to be filled. We are always wanting more, but not really sure what that “more” needs to be. Fulfillment, happiness, contentment, and true satisfactions are fleeting occurrences and often come to us in illusive ways. What we think is the ultimate fix to our anxious emptiness really is only a fancy trend that we entertain. The world does not realize any more today than it did over two thousand years ago that it is waiting for a Saviour. We need a Saviour. We need to see and embrace the God who has broken into history and become one with us. It is this union of God and man that sets us on a straight path, orders our relationships, establishes proper focus and goals, and tells us whose kingdom we really are meant to serve. The world does not know how truly lost it is. Do you realize how lost you are and that the One you need most is here among us and within your grasp?

**QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK**

**First Reading:** Today’s reading from 2 Samuel narrates the context in which God establishes his covenantal promise to King David around the year 1000 B.C. In the birth of Jesus, God fulfills his covenant with David. What does this teach us about the idea of “salvation history?”

**Second Reading:** Paul concludes his letter to the Romans with a hymn of praise to God for the long-awaited revelation that all are saved and justified through faith in Christ. In what ways are you praising God during this season of Advent?

**Gospel Reading:** Today’s Gospel reading records the angel Gabriel’s announcement to Mary of the upcoming birth of Christ. Mary’s acceptance of God’s will for her life (“May it be done to me according to your word.”) models for all of us unconditional faith. How can we encourage others to embrace such faith?

**WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES**

How can you help “liberate” this person or family from whatever is keeping them from living a free and full life?

## COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES COMMENCING 7 DECEMBER

With the announcement of new easing of restrictions commencing Monday 7<sup>th</sup> December, we are limited by the 2 square meter rule. However, the 1.5 meter social distancing per household still applies.

If you are planning to come to any of our masses, there is no need to book (except for Christmas Masses).

Congregational singing is now permitted, but 12 years or older are advised to wear a mask.

**WHY DO WE DO THAT?  
Catholic Life Explained**

**Question:**

What is the difference between apostles and disciples?

**Answer:**

When we look at the gospel accounts of the life of Jesus, we see two special titles applied to his followers: *apostles* and *disciples*. At first glance, we might think that these two words are interchangeable, but when we look at what each one means, we quickly see that the evangelists were using them very specifically. When we look more closely, we see that while Jesus had many *disciples*, the group of *apostles* was much more limited and referred to Jesus' closest collaborators.

The word *apostle* essentially means "one who is sent forth" or, as we might think of it today, "an ambassador." The group of apostles — sometimes called the Twelve — included those twelve men who formed Jesus' inner circle (see Mark 3:13-14; Luke 6:12-13). It was this group that received the gift of the Holy Spirit and who were sent out by Jesus with the special mission of forgiving sins on that first Easter Sunday (see John 20:19-23). In time, the Catholic Tradition also recognize Saint Paul and Saint Barnabas as apostles, recognizing that they also shared the mandate of going out in the Lord's name to pray, to bless, and to preach. In 2016, during the Jubilee of Mercy, Pope Francis raised the liturgical celebration of Saint Mary Magdalene to the rank of feast, recognizing that she also received a special mandate to proclaim the good news of Jesus' resurrection to the Eleven, becoming the "apostle to the apostles." In a particular way, the bishops continue the mission of the apostles in our own time.

When we think of the word *disciple*, we see that it has a very different meaning. Rather than referring to those who were sent out to carry on the mission of Jesus, *disciple* literally means "student" or, more specially, an "apprentice learner." The task of the disciple is to learn and integrate into their lives the teachings, values, and way of life of their master teacher. Although a disciple might be called on to explain or represent aspects of their life, in light of the teachings they receive from this master teacher, Christian discipleship is ultimately about living our lives with faith and integrity, guided by the life and mission of Jesus, our Master Teacher. The call to discipleship is the common vocation of all Christians.

**SAINT OF THE WEEK**

**SAINT STEPHEN**

Patron Saint of Deacons, Altar Servers, bricklayers and casket makers  
Feast Day : 26<sup>th</sup> December



Saint Stephen was one of the first ordained deacons of the Church. He was also the first Christian martyr. Stephen was so conformed to Jesus in his holy life that his martyrdom was both a natural and supernatural sign of his love for the Lord. It also inspired the early believers as they faced the first round of brutal persecution.

Great preaching and miracles were attributed to Stephen. His popularity created enemies among some Jews, and they accused him of blasphemy, of speaking against God and Moses.

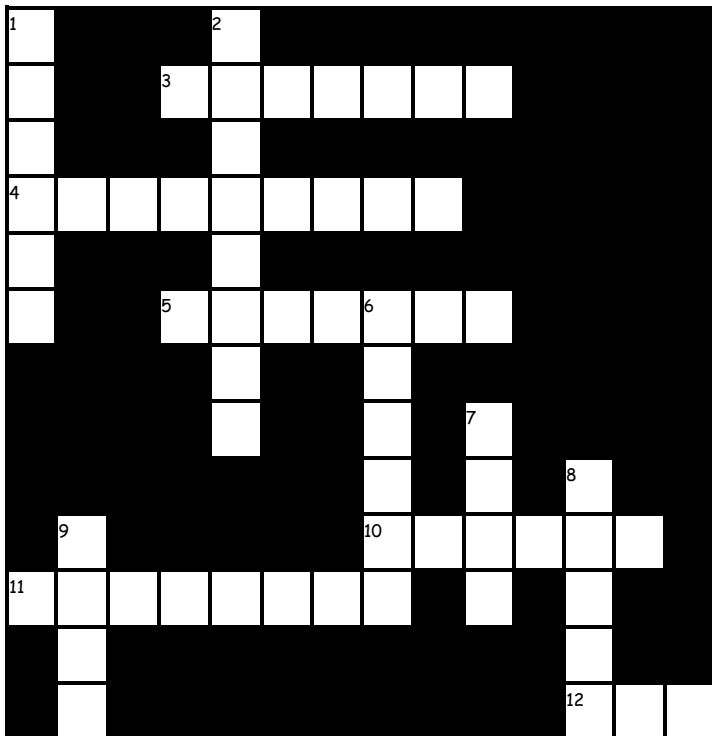
Stephen was filled with wisdom from heaven. He responded by detailing the history of Israel and outlining the blessings God had bestowed upon his chosen people. Stephen explained that Jesus had come to fulfil the law of Moses, not destroy it

As Stephen concluded his defence, he looked up and saw a vision of Jesus standing at the right hand of God. He said, "Look, I can see heaven thrown open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." That vision was taken as the final proof of blasphemy. The crowd rushed upon Stephen and carried him outside of the city to stone him to death.

As Stephen was being brutally stoned, he spoke his last words, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit. Lord, do not hold this sin against them," words which echoed the very words of Jesus on the Cross. Following those words, Stephen died, in the Lord.

**ON A LIGHTER NOTE**

**PROTOCOLS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CRIBS FOR CHRISTMAS 2020**

- 1. The straw, moss, palm branches and other decorations must be disinfected with alcohol.
- 2. The angel flying over the crib will not be allowed due to the aerosol effect produced by the batting of his wings.
- 3. The choir of angels will be restricted to one person because of the risk of contamination.
- 4. No shepherd shall be more than 65 years old or in a vulnerable category.
- 5. All non-essential participants (Romans, sinners...) are forbidden.
- 6. Pilate will explain to authorised participants how to wash their hands.
