

VOICE FROM THE PEWS

In this reading we hear the famous quote from John 3:16 that we see so often cited by Christian fans at football games: Jesus came, "so that everyone who believes in him may not perish, but may have eternal life." It is important to note that the eternal life Jesus offers us is not just a heavenly kingdom after we die—eternal life means much more.

The life we were born with is limited and finite. We know that every breath we take brings us closer to our physical deaths. The years and gravity take their toll on us, but what Jesus offers us is life outside time and gravity. It is beyond the wounds

and handicaps of our physical world, but it is also very much here and now.

Jesus offers us his life—life with, and in the Triune God in whom we believe. We come to this divine life by fully embracing our human life, just as Jesus did. We accept the

limitedness of our humanity with all the pain and joy that entails. We do not suppress our human nature but engage in it fully, always drawn to the light that is Jesus.

We are asked to live each day in the truth of our eternal life so that "...it may be clearly seen that [our] deeds have been done in God" (John 3:21). There is no dichotomy—no spiritual above physical life. Teach your children to value the finite world, especially themselves, body, mind and spirit—one package — loved by God with all its blemishes.

FAMILY RESPONSE: Take turns telling what you like about each other. Talk about each person's physical as well as spiritual qualities.



LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



God’s messengers always seem to get mocked. They speak a truth that some folks do not want to hear. While on the one hand we admire them, we also are quite happy keeping them at a distance. After all, they are not referring to me but someone else, aren’t they? We often wrongly conclude that because we may be more avant-garde, contemporary, politically sensitive, and untraditional, we are somehow more in the light than others. People tend to prefer darkness more than light, even the most spiritually sensitive among us. The light always carries with it the richness of God’s mercy and compassion which see beyond ideologies and concepts to relationships that cultivate life, earthly and eternal. Every hand of compassion and mercy extended to a human being must always point back to God. The call always involves ordering our lives in accord with our truth and essence of being. As God never forgets us, we must never forget God. Now is the time to take stock of our infidelity and return to the light, even though it is difficult to look at.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading: The author of 2 Chronicles reflects on how historically God’s fidelity and mercy was often met with Israel’s disobedience and arrogance. How does the Lenten journey provoke an examination of conscience for you and your faith life?

Second Reading: Paul speaks of our faith and our salvation as “the gift of God” to us. In what ways do you show appreciation for God’s grace?

Gospel Reading: Jesus taught Nicodemus that God sent His only Son into the world to offer eternal life to believers. Who in your life needs to hear this message?




WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES COMMENCING 26 FEBRUARY

With the announcement of the easing of restrictions commencing Friday 26th February 2021, we are now limited by the 2 square metre rule. However, the 1.5 metre social distancing from one household to another is still in place.

The wearing of face mask is strongly encouraged if social distancing is not possible.

For us to accommodate more people in the church congregational singing is not permitted, otherwise we have to observe the 4 square metre rule. Eight people are allowed to sing in the choir.

CONTACT TRACING:

Because NSW Government still requires contact tracing, there are three ways to do this:

- Sign-in using the QR Code displayed near the entrance doors.
- Mass Attendance cards MUST be completed by each household per mass. Cards are available in the foyer.

In order to maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- Families and those living under one household sit together.
- Proceed to end of row if vacant.
- Leave 3 chairs empty between you and another household.



The elderly, those with health conditions, flu-like symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home.

Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.

**WHY DO WE DO THAT?
Catholic Life Explained:**

Question:

Why do priests wear a Roman collar?

Answer:


The practice of priests wearing the Roman collar developed in the mid-nineteenth century as an alternative to wearing the cassock which in some places was seen as impractical or which was even outlawed by anti-Catholic legislation. Since its introduction, it has taken different forms, and if you visit different countries today, you will see variation in what priests wear.

The Code of Canon Law simply observes that priests wear "suitable ecclesiastical garb" according to the judgments of the national bishops conferences and local custom (no. 284).

The Australian Bishops have instructed that outside of liturgical functions, a "black suit and Roman collar are the usual formal attire for priests. The use of the cassock is at the discretion of the cleric." Priests who are members of religious communities are to follow the rules of their institute regarding the habit or other approved clothing.

In the end, whether a priest wears the Roman collar, a religious habit, or, as is the case in many European countries, a suit and tie (to distinguish them from Protestant clergy who wear a collar) the goal of their clerical clothing is to serve as a sign of their commitment to guide and to serve, and to also allow them to be truly public figures because they are ordained for the service of all.

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
