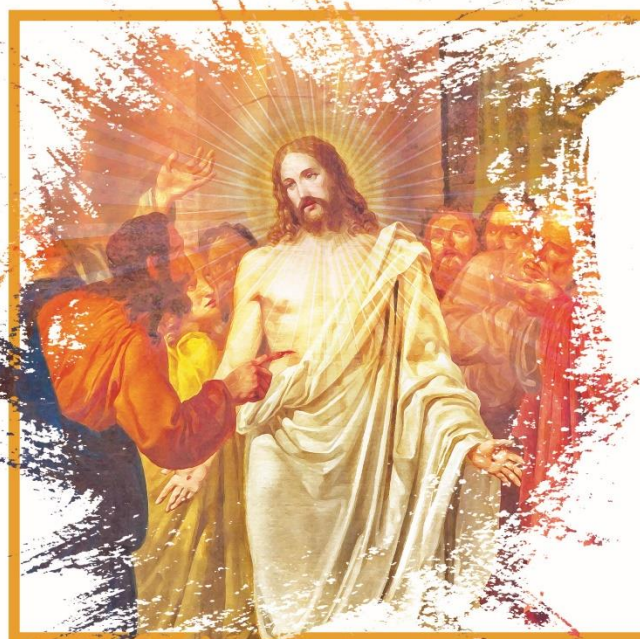

Jesus' disciples are behind locked doors, afraid that at any minute there will be loud knocking and the soldiers will be there to arrest them.

The knock does not come but the Risen Jesus does. And what are Jesus' first words to these disciples he loves? "Peace be with you." Jesus repeats that phrase three times in this Gospel.

Thomas is not present for Jesus' appearance, and when the others tell him about their experience, he doubts their word.

Jesus joins the disciples again, and this time Thomas is with them. Once again Jesus greets them with the words, "Peace be with you." What is this peace that Jesus offers his disciples? It is not the sort of peace that removes one from danger or trauma.

Remember, ten of those apostles received the peace of Christ, and all but one of them died martyrs.

And it certainly doesn't magically take away fear or apprehension. The disciples kept the doors locked even after Jesus' first visit.

The peace Jesus gives does not obliterate fear, but it does offer comfort and courage and Christ's strength to get through any sort of danger or trial.

When we rest in God's peace we know that no matter what happens, all will be right. Even death has lost its power over us.

This is the peace Thomas received after he doubted. It is the peace the disciples received more fully at Pentecost with the coming of the Holy Spirit.

It is the same peace we are offered when we cooperate with the Spirit we received in baptism and confirmation. If only we could believe and be truly open to receiving it.

Mercy goes beyond justice, not just forgiving someone who has done something wrong, but freeing them from further repercussions and giving them the chance to start over.

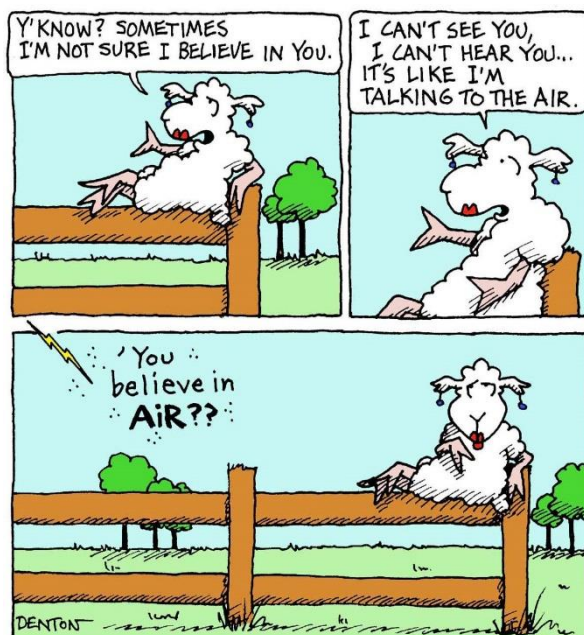
Mercy is a powerful expression of discipleship.

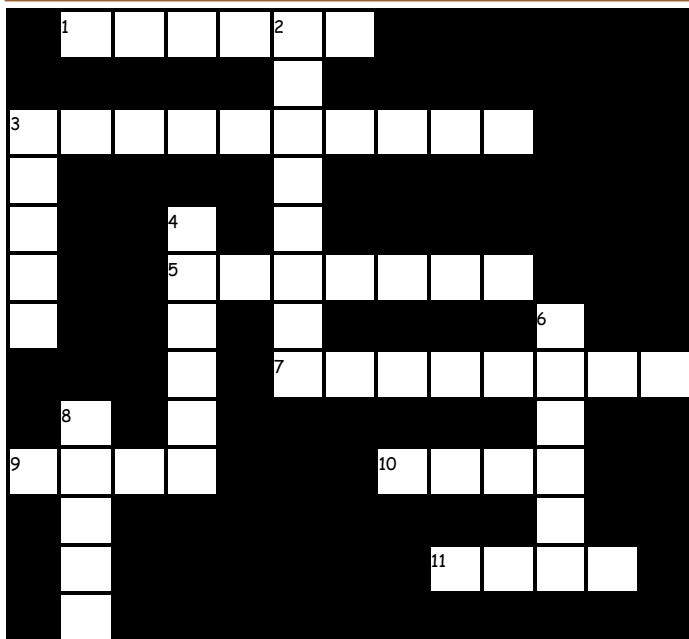

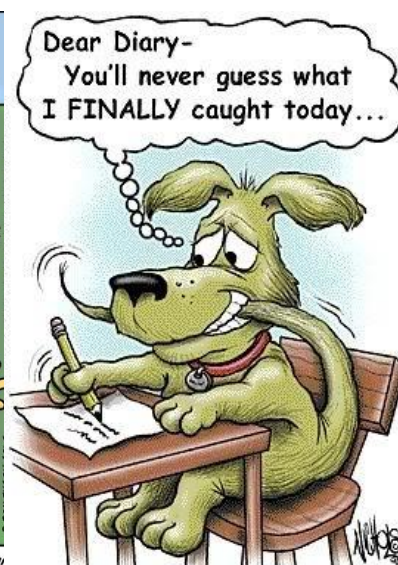

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why are priests transferred from one parish to another? How is that decided?

Answer:

Bishops or Religious Superiors take the appointment of pastors to parishes very seriously and the decision to assign or transfer priests is one of the most important decisions bishops or superiors can make, effecting the lives of everyone in the parish community. In the Diocese of Parramatta, usually a parish priest is assigned in a six-year term. For the Augustinians, it is a four-year term. The bishop or superior can renew their appointment. Term limits for associate pastors vary from diocese to diocese.

Sometimes a particular priest is assigned to a parish or chaplaincy to respond to specific issues (such as a parish merger, a fundraising campaign, or because he has special qualifications that make him a good fit for the community).

In the case of new or recently ordained priests, the vibrancy and diversity, the presence of a school, or certain social programs offer invaluable training and ongoing formation. In making their decisions regarding the placement of priests, most bishops rely on a priest personnel committee or a council of priests.

There is also a period of dialogue with the priest(s) who will be moved, sometimes even including an extended period of discernment and self-assessment, helping to be as sure as possible that the assignment of a priest to a particular community will truly benefit the people and be a healthy one for the priest himself.
