

When I think about that tiny mustard seed and the kingdom of God, I think about the rippling effect one small act of kindness can have. When a person offers a smile or a simple courtesy, it can sometimes change the course of another's day.

I am not a morning person, and with very little effort I have managed to raise a whole family of morning grumps. I remember the days when all seven of us were playing "beat the clock" at 6:30 AM. At best, our "good mornings" were grumbled as we tried to keep out of each other's way. Some mornings our house felt like the proverbial powder keg, just one missing sock away from disaster. On those mornings, one person's outburst over an empty milk carton could sour everyone's day.

I developed my mustard seed theory by watching how that powder keg could be defused—a shared cinnamon bun, some help searching for missing keys, or

a ride offered to school. One person's act of kindness could affect everyone. Since I am not my best at daybreak, it took a conscious effort for me to be that person.

I discovered that when I started the day with prayer I could often find a quiet peace inside myself that helped me respond rather than react. It was wonderful to watch how sometimes that mustard seed experience of peace could even grow to fill a household. I picture the kingdom of God as an eternal experience of that peace—an experience we can sometimes taste even on grumpy mornings.

PERSONAL RESPONSE:

What are some of the things that set you up to be grumpy? How can you avoid them or work around them?

FAMILY RESPONSE: Ask family members to share what gets them out of grumpy moods. How can they get themselves out of a bad mood?

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a mustard seed, the tiniest of seeds. When planted, the tiny mustard seed grows into a tremendous tree with large branches. So too in each of our lives small things can have profound effects. God can use one of our more insignificant gestures to radically change another person's life. It may be the kindness of a smile, our willingness to accommodate someone, listening to someone's story, helping someone who is hurting, standing up for someone who is right or complimenting someone on something they did. We all have God given gifts and talents. What are some of yours? Our task is to use our talents creatively, consistently, lovingly, and generously. Because we are always guided by the Holy Spirit, things that may be insignificant or unnoticed to us can profoundly change the life of someone else. While we may think we are small and insignificant, God can make us large and magnificent. All we have to do is open ourselves to being used. We trust that God will take care of the rest.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading: The prophet Ezekiel's image of God growing Israel into a mighty majestic cedar tree bearing fruit, with birds nesting in its branches was intended to be words of comfort for the exiled Israelites in Babylon. How do you find God's comfort in times of distress?

Second Reading: Paul encourages the believers in Corinth to be courageous in knowing one day all will appear before "the judgment seat of Christ." How confident are you in reflecting on judgment day?

Gospel Reading: Mark tells us that Jesus often spoke in parables to the crowds about the kingdom of God. Today's parables speak to the often unseen and subtle growth of the kingdom of God in our midst. How might you better observe the kingdom of God at work in your life?


If ever there was a "how to" manual for Christians, it is in the readings this week. Using parables and stories, Jesus tells the people how to live.

With the announcement of the easing of restrictions commencing Monday 17th May 2021, we are now limited by the 2 square metre rule. Hence, we can now accommodate 350 people in the church.





WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Where does the money go that is collected each week at Church?

Answer:

This is a good question! Every parish has financial obligations, including the basic operation of the buildings, salaries, maintenance, and improvements. In addition, there are programs to run, charities to be funded, and operational expenses like hosts and wine for Mass, music books, vestments, and so on. Finally, there is the diocesan assessment that each parish pays to help run the diocese and the support services provided to each parish.

Most parishes manage to get by with the collection, a few fundraisers and endowments. But contrary to popular opinion, cash flow is also a problem, and many parishes operate in the red. The Finance Committee is responsible for assisting the pastor in fiscal management, and good stewardship is the basis for successful programs.

Here at Holy Spirit, we have two collections during weekend Masses. The weekly collections consist of regular electronic contributions by direct debit/credit card or by cash given at the time of the collection.

The FIRST COLLECTION (BASKET 1) is for the upkeep of our Augustinian priests. This is to provide for their household expenses and to support the ministry of the Augustinians.

The SECOND COLLECTION (BASKET 2) is for the Parish. It provides for the regular running costs of the parish - for the maintenance of the parish buildings (including electricity and insurance), administration of the parish, support of ministries exercised for the parish and for the remuneration of staff.

There are times during the year when there is a SPECIAL THIRD COLLECTION for the various charitable missions (St. Vincent de Paul, Catholic Mission, seminary appeals and various other ministries).
