

## VOICE FROM THE PEWS

Once again, we see Jesus' concern for the poor. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor...then come follow me. Jesus asks us not just to give from our own pockets, but also to truly identify with the poor. Christian love requires more than charity. It demands empathy and a willingness to fight for justice.

When Jesus spoke of justice he was talking about treating people fairly, honouring commitments, setting things right and definitely justice for all. His sense of righteousness went beyond a legalistic understanding of reward and punishment. It involved relieving suffering, healing relationships and making sure everyone was fed. It is this broader understanding of justice that we are asked to mirror in our own lives and help our children hunger and thirst for in theirs.

Children seem to develop a sense of righteousness at an early age, but it is usually centered on themselves. As they

grow, they become concerned about fair treatment for friends and loved ones. It is our job to help them to eventually develop empathy for people they don't know.

We can help youngsters appreciate basic justice by rewarding and disciplining them fairly, but we must also foster a broader understanding and a more active approach. Listen intently as they talk about their own experiences of injustice and those of their friends, pray about the situation and work out possible solutions. Later, call attention to injustices in the larger community and follow the same steps. Coming to appreciate "justice for all" is a gradual process that begins at home and leads to every corner of the world. **FAMILY RESPONSE:** Watch the evening news together. Find one news story from your community or the larger world, talk about and decide if there is anything you can do to help. Say a prayer asking for God's help.



LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



Presumption can be a great sin. We can easily convince ourselves that as long as we do the bare minimum or master the basics, it is sufficient. Love doesn't operate this way. If we are truly in love with God, then the basics are not going to be enough. That love is going to want to get expressed in going above and beyond, in leaving the comfortable and familiar, in stretching and growing and in following a voice other than our own. This is what those who are truly in pursuit of wisdom come to realize. Just like any human relationship worth achieving reveals, we never reach a plateau in following the Gospel or growing in wisdom and holiness. Wisdom is the rudder that guides us through all of life's attractions and options. It alone determines what is worth pursuing and what must be left behind. That is why those who are only concerned about checking the boxes and doing the least amount possible often walk away sad when offered God's gift of life eternal. They are not truly in love.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

**First Reading:** Today's reading presents wisdom and prudence as life's most precious gifts. Why do you think these virtues were held in such high regard by ancient Israel?

**Second Reading:** Hebrews connects the power of the word of God with divine judgement — one day we must all "render an account" of our lives before the Lord. How often do you think about your own judgement day?

**Gospel Reading:** Jesus teaches the rich man and the disciples that while wealth can often hinder one from entering the kingdom of God, self-sacrifice and discipleship can earn eternal life. How well do you balance these realities in your life?






WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

On October 11 we honor Pope Saint John XXIII. This is the pope who shepherded the Second Vatican Council. He also wrote several encyclicals, one in his last year of life in which he focused on war and peace. In *Pacem in Terris* (or *Peace on Earth*), Pope John wrote that the root cause of war is people not getting the resources they need to live a life of dignity. We know that there are enough resources in the world to support all of God's people. But some have too much while others don't have the barest necessities of life. Your challenge this week is to ask yourselves (as individuals and households) if you have too much, if you over-use resources while people around the globe are starving or living in despair. If you answer yes to this question, choose one thing you have which you can donate to someone in need. Drop it off at the St. Vincent de Paul Society or a local shelter to take one step toward ensuring lasting peace in our world.



**COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES  
COMMENCING 11 OCTOBER**

NSW Government has revised the COVID-19 guidelines effective Monday 11 October, when NSW hits the 70% full vaccination target.

The church is open everyday for private prayer and devotion only, immediately after the Online Mass until 5pm. Our priests are available for pastoral assistance. Please contact parish office to make an appointment. Parish Office is open Tuesday to Friday, 9am to 5pm.

Funerals permitted with up to 100 people (10-person limit for people who are not fully vaccinated).

Weddings ceremonies permitted with up to 100 people (5-person limit for people who are not fully vaccinated).

The wearing of face masks indoors is mandatory.

**CONTACT TRACING:**

For those attending the funeral or wedding and those involved in the livestreaming, NSW Government still requires contact tracing. There are two ways to do this:

- Sign-in using the QR Code displayed near the entrance doors or
- Mass Attendance cards to be completed by each household per mass. Cards are available in the foyer.

*Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.*

**REOPENING OF CHURCHES**

Churches in the Diocese of Parramatta will resume public Masses and all other religious services from the Monday after NSW hits the 80% full vaccination target as this would then permit all Catholics to attend regardless of vaccination status. Most likely, it will be on Mon 25 October.



**WHY DO WE DO THAT?  
Catholic Life Explained**

**Question:**


Why are Catholics required to get married in a church, and not outside or at a different venue?

**Answer:**

Because the sacrament of marriage is a sacred covenant between the husband and wife, the celebration of the sacrament of matrimony is much more than simply a social or family event. So, the rule that the sacrament be celebrated in a church is a way to help reinforce the deeper meaning of Christian marriage. To help make this clearer, the Church’s tradition also normally includes the celebration of the Mass when the marriage is being celebrated between two Catholics, and so a church or chapel is the ideal setting.

For special reasons — which vary from diocese to diocese — the local bishop can give permission for the marriage to be celebrated in another suitable place.

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


