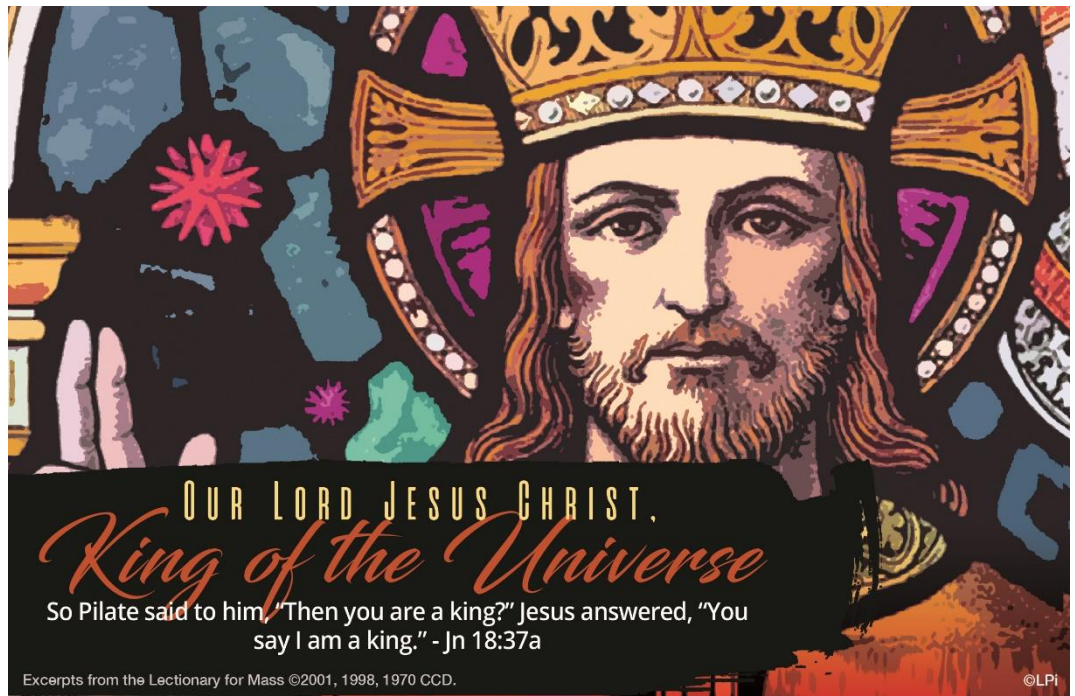

VOICE FROM THE PEWS

On this last Sunday of the church year we celebrate Christ the King. It is an appropriate way to commemorate all that Jesus is and all that he did. It is a celebration of the kingdom of God proclaimed and lived by Jesus, our brother and saviour. The best way to celebrate this great feast is by following Jesus' example and living our lives proclaiming the kingdom.

Often when we talk about God's kingdom we focus on heaven, our afterlife. We have learned from childhood that if we are good, obey the commandments and live in God's light, when we die we will go to heaven. In heaven we will spend eternity with God and all his saints and angels. All of this is true of course, but it is a very limited view of the kingdom of God.

God's kingdom is much more than a place where we spend forever. God's kingdom is also present today, here and anywhere, any time God's will can be

found. Jesus lived the kingdom because he lived in absolute truth and love. He reconciled and healed; he preached the good news and loved as only God can love. Like Jesus, Christians are expected to be kingdom builders too.

As parents, we are called to do our best to build the kingdom of God in our own homes. We are asked to reconcile and heal, speak only the truth and love as God loves. It seems an impossible task, and it would be if it weren't for our faith in Jesus. The secret is to ask God to fill us with his love and his strength so that every cell and fiber of our being will respond and react as Jesus would. If we live with this intention, God's kingdom is sure to come.

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



God is wonderfully and surprisingly creative! He turns the tables on our understanding of what it means to be a king by sending us a king who embraces poverty, insults, suffering, ridicule, rejection, and even death. This is our king. Jesus is not the king of prestige or grandeur but the king who brings light to darkness, hope to despair, sinners to mercy, and new life out of death. God dances on, around, in and through all of the silliness and ugliness of the world bringing all of creation to the eternal dance of new life and hope. Whether we accept it now or hope that we one day do, Christ is king of the universe. Christ is the alpha and the omega, the beginning and the end. Every human being, even those who scorned and rejected him and failed to see him in the least of our brothers and sisters will look upon him. Only those who understand truth will understand that we are on this awesome universal journey to Christ. It is a journey of surprises but also a journey of enlightenment when we will one day see and experience with the deepest joy our being in Christ. We will be restless until we are all one day together united in Christ our King.

FIRST READING: The prophet Daniel has a vision of the “everlasting dominion” of the “son of man.” Why do think the Lord revealed this vision to Daniel?

SECOND READING: John teaches his community that Jesus “has made us (believers) into a kingdom, priests for his God and Father.” How should knowledge of this reality affect your spiritual journey?

GOSPEL READING: In his trial Jesus tells Pilate that his kingdom is not of this world. What do you think prevents the Kingdom of God from being more fully present in our world?

WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

This month is the anniversary of Dorothy Day’s death. Dorothy Day, co-founder of the Catholic Worker movement in the U.S., was known for her deep care and compassion for the poor. She called those who had nothing left to give her “meeting place with God.” But she did more than acts of charity—she became an advocate for those who are denied basic human rights. Your challenge this week is to search your heart and ask yourself, “Do I work for justice as well as care for those in need?” Then choose one act of justice—emailing your legislators about a vote coming up in Congress on aid to the poor, calling the White House to let the President know your opinion on a justice issue, researching the just (or unjust) practices of a company from which you purchase goods and then choosing how much you can or cannot support that company—and follow in Dorothy Day’s footsteps. Do something for those who have nothing to give you in return.

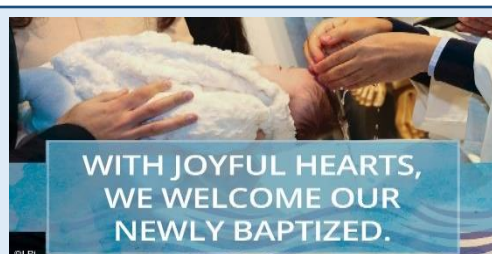

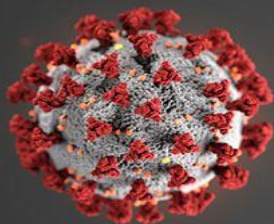
BAPTISM Preparation Meeting

**COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES
COMMENCING 8 NOVEMBER**

With the announcement of the easing of restrictions commencing Monday 8th November 2021, when NSW hits the 90% full vaccination target, we will observe the 2 sqm rule indoor and outdoor. Hence, we are allowed to have 300 people in the church at any one time, excluding the clergy and those involved in the liturgy. There is no need to book.

Places of worship is open to all regardless of vaccination status.

The wearing of face masks indoors is **MANDATORY**. Children under 12 are exempt but are encouraged to wear masks where practicable.

CONTACT TRACING:

Because NSW Government still requires contact tracing, there are two ways to do this:

1. Sign-in using the QR Code displayed in the foyer
2. Mass Attendance cards **MUST** be completed by each household per mass. Cards are available in the foyer.

Please be mindful of the following:

- Congregational singing is still **NOT** permitted. Choirs of up to 10 people can perform but all performers must be vaccinated.
- Funerals and weddings permitted with no person limit

Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.

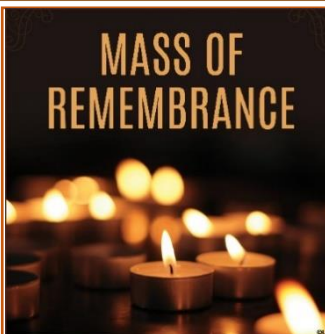

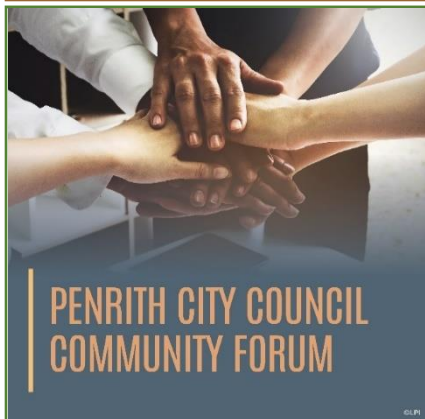

Question:

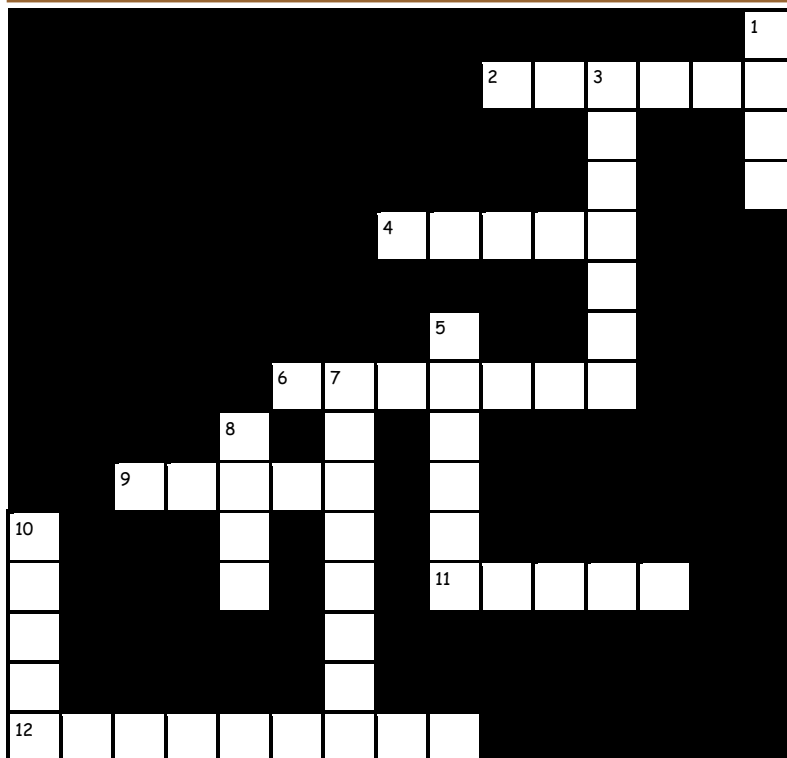
Why do we make changes in the Mass? Some seem so small and unimportant. Are they really necessary?

Answer:

The celebration of the Eucharist is at the heart of our identity as Catholics. Our purpose as a Church community revolves around the Eucharist. Everything we are and everything we do is measured not only by how well we celebrate, but also by how well we live the sacrament. If that is so, then we as a community will always strive to celebrate the Mass as best we can. The reasons for some changes might seem more obvious than others, but there is a reason behind each one. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal is the introduction to the Missal that contains all the prayers for the celebration of the Mass. The Order of Mass we use now was issued in 1975 and, as often happens over the course of years, some questions have come up about the proper way of doing some things and whether or not other practices are acceptable. These changes clarify some things and make the celebration of the Mass more meaningful for everyone. The opportunity is presented to us to better learn and understand each part of the Mass, which in turn should help us deepen our appreciation for its beauty and meaning. We will be a better Church if we have a clearer understanding and knowledge of Who and what we celebrate.
