The bedrock of our Christian faith rests on the mystery of the Trinity—our belief in a Triune God, one God in three persons. For years, I categorized to whom I prayed: praise to God, the Father; day-to-day help from my friend, Jesus; and on test days, prayers went directly to the Holy Spirit. There is no problem praying in this way. It just got confusing for me when I began to imagine each person in the Trinity as a sort of individual power beacon.

Our human understanding is limited, so when we speak about God, we speak of three persons. But we know there is only one God. The Trinity is not like three signal towers sending out waves of power or grace. God's power is not static; it is dynamic. God is love, a dynamic love that is always in motion, always in relationship—Father, Son and Spirit.

The self-revealing mystery of God is like a whirlpool of love, spilling out into

and through all of creation, returning in a whirlwind of love. It is in this overflowing, ever-returning circle of love that we find God's power and grace. When we get caught up in that whirlwind, we experience the Spirit of Truth, and begin to know God beyond words or definition. The mystery is not solved; we just get an inkling of our place in it.

Keep yourself open to the mystery of our self-revealing God and teach your children to be open, too. We live in an age of instant answers. Encourage your children to explore and discover the mysteries of this earth. But remind them that there are some mysteries that can only be revealed when you allow them to unfold.

PERSONAL RESPONSE:

What is your personal image of God? How has it changed over the years?



LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week

PRAY THE ROSARY WITH CREATION



Life can leave us feeling very distracted and detached. Perhaps this is why many people seek things that make them “feel good,” wrongly believing those things actually provide a sense of meaning and purpose. In truth, they are simply more distractions. When we discover real silence, we can realize that the stirrings and impulses in our hearts desiring connection, meaning, and purpose are really God desperately trying to pull us toward His Divine Heart. Once we submit to God’s pull, we are led to the beauty of God’s presence. This holy presence carries us to the heights of mountains, the vastness of ocean depths, the beginning of things and their end, and the majesty of universal wonder. We meet the Father. Then, gently carried to the tenderness of compassion, love, mercy, and forgiveness we touch the innocence and vulnerability of life. We see the poor and those who are broken. We meet the Son. Finally, we are directed toward the seasons that change, the ebb and flow of life, the inspirations that surprise, and the wonder, awe, and joy of life. We embrace the Holy Spirit.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading: In the Jewish wisdom traditions of Proverbs, we hear how “wisdom” itself is of divine origin from the very beginning of creation and was God’s “delight.” What do you find intriguing about this divine relationship?

Second Reading: Paul speaks of believers having the “peace of God” through Jesus Christ and the “love of God” poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. Where do you experience the peace and love of God in your life?

Gospel Reading: Jesus speaks of the Spirit giving to believers everything the Father has given to the Son. How should one react to this abundance of divine blessings?

WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

On Sunday we celebrate the Trinity, the union and communion of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Trinity lives in perfect harmony and love as three persons in one God. They are a model to all of us of living together as one in community. Catholic Relief Services reminds us that we are one human family. Your challenge this week is to live in communion with someone in need. Stand in solidarity with a person who is outside your regular orbit of family, friends, fellow workers or students, neighbors, etc. Listen to this person’s story, share something of yourself, and offer support of some kind.

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

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CREATION CARE TIPS

Summer is a great time to eat out with your family. How do you choose the restaurant? When you decide on a restaurant, do you check to see if the restaurant uses locally-produced food instead or buying it from thousands of miles away? Your challenge this week is to check out the restaurants in your town and then support those which provide more healthy, local options which also care for God’s creation. The more customers inquire about their food sources, the more demand it causes for locally grown and sustainably produced items.



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WHY DO WE DO THAT?
Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why is the Church against stem cell research, especially if it offers the possibility of cures for diseases like Alzheimer’s and Parkinson’s?

Answer:

Like so many issues, the truth about stem cell research is more complicated than a few sound bites and vague promises of cures. For the Church, the problem is with embryonic stem cell research, not the research itself. The destruction of human life, even for a seemingly noble cause, is never acceptable. The ends cannot justify the means. Stem cells can be obtained in other ways, including from the placenta as well as from adults. So research is possible without the destruction of other life.

On the other hand, stem cell research shows much promise, but no concrete results. Some scientists also dispute what diseases might be cured by new discoveries. The research is still in its early stages. The question for our country is whether we should invest a lot of money in research now, looking for cures that will probably remain out of reach for most people, or should we invest that money in other programs with more immediate benefits, especially those that stress prevention and education. It is indeed a complex issue that requires close scrutiny and investigation before we jump to inaccurate conclusions or make decisions based on good, but misinformed, intentions.
