

The story of the feeding of the multitude is a Eucharist story. At Eucharist, we, too, gather to listen and be fed by Jesus. And like the people on that hilltop, we, too, are all satisfied.

The Eucharist was Jesus' lasting gift to his followers. It was his way of being present in a very concrete way throughout the ages. When we receive the host and drink from the cup, we know that Jesus is truly with us and in us. And as we watch our brothers and sisters receive from the same cup, we realize again that we are one: the body of Christ given up for the world. Take time to celebrate elements of the Eucharist at home.

*The Eucharist is a meal.* We remember the Last Supper, the breaking of the bread, the blessing of the wine. The time your family sits together at table is sacred, too. Say a prayer when you begin. Treat each other with the respect you would pay to Jesus.

*The Eucharist is a sacrifice.* At the preparation of the altar we respond, "May

the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands..." Parents know about sacrifice— giving up sleep to comfort a restless child, wearing retread sneakers so a teen can have new soccer shoes. We are doing our children a disservice if we don't teach them to sacrifice, too. Children need to learn the discipline of choosing a greater good.

*The Eucharist is a celebration of new life.* We become a part of Christ's body, sharing in his Spirit. In Eucharistic Prayer III the priest says, "Grant that we... may... become one body, one spirit in Christ." You and your children experience your life in Christ's through the give-and-take of everyday family life. Help your children to also experience that life with the larger church family by becoming involved in parish activities.

*The Eucharist is a family affair.* We celebrate it with our parish family, and we live it day in and day out with our household family.

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



Good dietitians will remind us that we are not only the product of what we eat but the disciplines we undertake. Many people spend a great deal of time and effort eating a healthy diet, getting a sufficient amount of rest, and engaging in regular exercise. Experts tell us that attending to these increases our chances for a longer life. While this is certainly a worthy pursuit, is our earthly life really the one that requires the most attention and effort? Faith kicks in to remind us that we are meant to live forever with God. Hence, isn't it our eternal destiny that requires most of our effort and attention? The food and nourishment we need to achieve this goal and fine tune our souls for this promised inheritance are the Body and Blood of Christ. Only this heavenly sustenance will unite us with God and our brothers and sisters, strengthen us to do what the Gospel asks us to do and prepare us for life eternal. Through the discipline of prayer, our desire to receive our Lord is deepened. It is this yearning, above anything else, that we want clearly seen and front and centre when we close our eyes in death. God loves us so much that he gave us his only begotten Son. Let us rush to receive him!

**QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK**

**First Reading:** We hear in the reading from Genesis a victory meal of bread and wine between Abraham and Melchizedek, king of Salem. This is the Bible's first recorded meal of thanksgiving. Why do you think celebratory meals are so central to the storyline of the Bible?

**Second Reading:** In his letter to the Corinthians written around 55AD, Paul preserves for us the earliest attestation of the words Jesus spoke at the Last Supper. Jesus' institution of the Eucharist is core to our faith. Why do you think more Christians today do not appreciate the importance of this tradition?

**Gospel Reading:** The miracle of the feeding of the 5,000 with loaves and fishes in many ways helps all believers understand how we need to be nourished by Jesus. In what ways does the Eucharist feed and sustain you in your daily life?

**WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES**

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus, we are reminded that we are the body of Christ here on earth today. We are called to be his hands and feet, his heart, ears, and shoulders to those who need him most. Your challenge this week is to look around—at your local community, but also at the national and global news—to reflect on who needs you to be Jesus' body this week. And what part of Jesus are you called to be? Will you be the listening ear, the shoulder to cry on, the heart of compassion, the thoughtful brain, the voice for those whose voices are suppressed? Be Jesus this week.

**WHY DO WE DO THAT?  
Catholic Life Explained**

**Question:**

If one’s gift or talent is making money, and one uses that money for honourable purposes, is it considered a spiritual gift? What does our faith teach us about wealth and stewardship?


**Answer:**

Jesus said it best: to whom much is given, much is expected. All gifts come from God, and our abilities are given to us to be used for the benefit of ourselves and of others and at the service of the Gospel. In an article entitled “The Many Faces of Stewardship,” Catherine Doherty wrote about stewardship in the “nitty-gritty everydayness of my life,” and about the currency or “money” of spiritual stewardship: love, understanding, and unselfishness.

For a gift to have a spiritual benefit, our intention and involvement would be part of the consideration. If I give money to a charity, but do so in order to gain a tax advantage, it could hardly be a virtuous thing on my part. But if I give because I want to help and, in fact, am even willing to get involved, I have committed myself in a deeper, more meaningful way. Regardless of our money-making talents, in the end, true stewardship comes down to how well we practice the virtues of faith, hope, and love within our life and with those in our community and church. Ultimately, the most important element in stewardship is not intangible—it’s you!

**CREATION CARE TIPS**

*“The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a sharing of the blood of Christ?*

*The bread which we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ?”*

—1 Corinthians 10:16



Each time we commemorate the Last Supper, we invite Jesus to be part of our lives. In doing so, the community becomes his body. For that reason, it would be wise to take a moment and consider our choice of bread. Much bread in the United States today is produced by industrial agricultural practices that use pesticides and cause irreparable damage to ecosystems. Intensive agriculture also uses chemical fertilizers which the rain washes into our rivers, causing blue algae in our lakes. Since Christ is at the very center of creation, let us choose an organic bread to honor the Body of Christ. Often times farmer’s markets and small bakeries carry bread that is more responsibly produced. Consider switching your bread buying power to such vendors.
