

VOICE FROM THE PEWS

What, where and when is this kingdom in which Jesus Christ rules? Before Jesus even began preaching, John the Baptist announced that the kingdom of God was at hand. Jesus, himself, announced that the kingdom was upon us (Luke 11:20). But he also said that it was yet to come (Luke 22:30). How can we explain this paradox of time and place?

The not-so-simple fact is that the kingdom of God is not a set place, nor a particular time. The popular idea of heaven (an afterlife for the good), and the kingdom of God are not synonymous. The kingdom of God is whenever and wherever we find God present in action—good triumphing over evil.

When John the Baptist proclaimed the coming of the kingdom, he was announcing the coming of Jesus. As Jesus walked the earth, he was literally God in action. He confronted evil wherever he found it—prejudice, greed, selfishness, even sickness and death—and he won.

Wherever, whenever Jesus was and is, we find the kingdom. And whenever, wherever people continue to bring Christ's justice, forgiveness, healing and wholeness, we find the kingdom.

All of this, the cosmic battle between good and evil, and the victory won for us through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus is recorded for us in Scripture. It is the story of our faith, a story that is not finished yet. We believe the fullness of the kingdom is yet to come. Jesus promised that one day good would finally triumph, defeating evil forever. On that day we will enter the full reign of Christ as King.

FAMILY RESPONSE: The kingdom of God begins in your home. Talk about ways you can let others know you love them without saying the words.

Inspiration for the Week



Our king hangs on a cross. Onlookers saw this as the final defeat of a fool who many saw as an insurrectionist. They laughed at him and challenged his kingship by looking for proof: Save yourself! Historically, earthly kings are influential figures wielding significant power over the quality of their subjects' lives. Where is Jesus' power? Slowly fading away, he's a failure in many eyes. Brokenness and vulnerability are often seen as failures. Something went wrong and exposed us, revealing our fragile and sometimes incorrect selves to others. Yet, what appears at first to be shameful is really a golden key to life. It is only when vulnerable that we learn how to love genuinely. Marking what seems the end of a failed mission, Jesus Christ our King hangs before us as the vulnerable, wounded key to God's infinite love and life. The kingdoms of this world pass away. Jesus hangs as our king of a world that never ends. When we are vulnerable and broken in death, we fall into the fullness of Christ and are made one with him. This is more than any earthly king can promise and is the salvation we

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK


First Reading: The Israelites recognized that David was anointed by the Lord to shepherd and rule over them as their King. What do you think it takes to be a really good leader?


WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

The Australian Institute of Health and Welfare reports that "family, domestic and sexual violence is a major national health and welfare issue that can have lifelong impacts for victims and perpetrators. It affects people of all ages and from all backgrounds."


If you would like to contribute to Fr Myk's and Deacon John's farewell gifts, we will be taking up a collection at the Piety Stall – cash or EFTPOS.

Please bring a framed photograph of your deceased loved one and place on the special table before the Mass.



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

CREATION CARE TIPS

As we come closer to the holiday season, consider celebrating "Buy Nothing Day." The first Buy Nothing Day was organized in 1992 and launched the day after Thanksgiving—one of the busiest shopping days in the year in the United States. Besides refusing to dive into the rampant consumerism of the holiday shopping season, choose to do something else to celebrate the earth and nature. Use this week, and Buy Nothing Day itself, to re-evaluate how you want to celebrate Advent and Christmas this year. This is the time to start having conversations with friends and families about cutting back on your purchases and/or celebrating the season in a way that is lighter on the earth.

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WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Ouestion:

The Assumption isn't in the Bible. What proof do we have that it really happened?

Answer:

Since the beginning of the Christians Church, have venerated the relics of the saints. We can see this in the catacombs of Rome, in the crypts of churches, and in the reliquaries that contain tiny fragments of bone. Throughout Church history, there have been no relics of Mary nor any legitimate claims to her bones. Even the tomb of Mary, visited as a site of pilgrimage, stood empty. At the Council of Chalcedon in 451, the Roman emperor asked the bishop of Jerusalem to bring Mary's relics to the council. The bishop reported that there were no relics of Mary. Upon finding her empty tomb, the Apostles had concluded that her body was taken up into heaven. Soon afterward, the Church began celebrating this miraculous event.

The Assumption is an article of faith. Within the context of salvation, its meaning and logic is clear. Being born without original sin, Mary did not suffer its consequences. She is already participating in what we, too, will experience one day — the resurrection and glorification of our bodies as they reunite with our souls.
