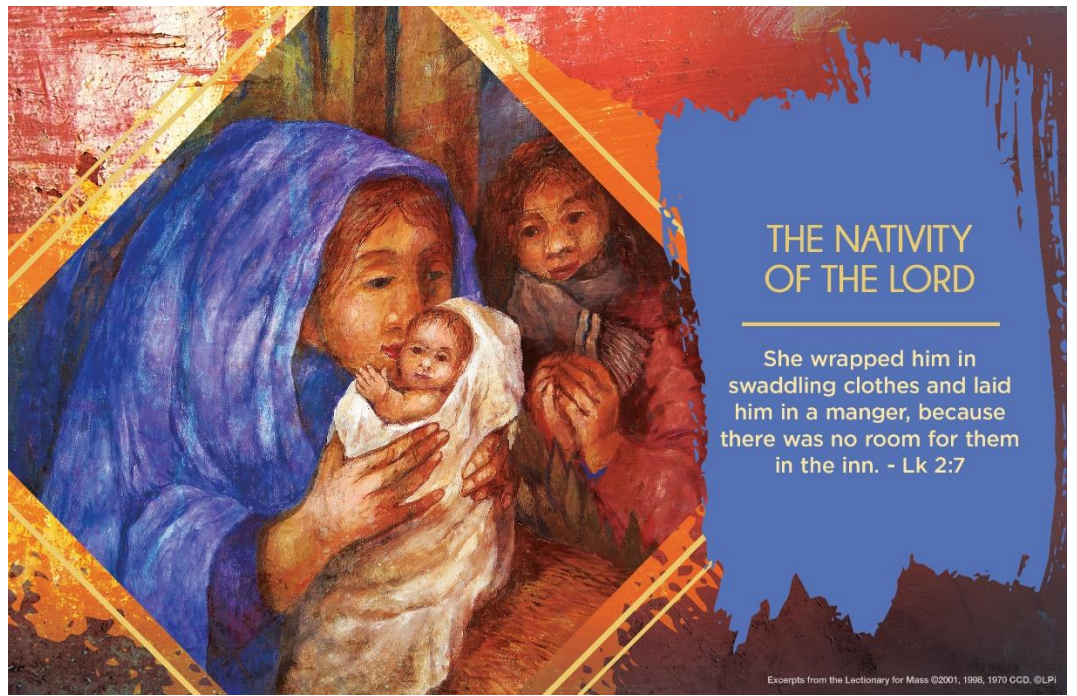

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

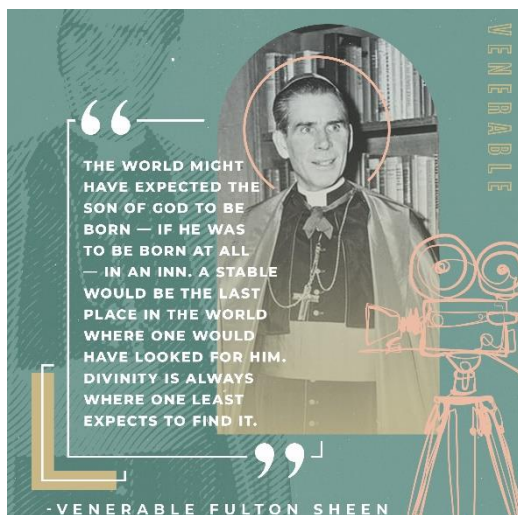

Gospel Reading: We hear Luke's account of the birth of Jesus. Luke tells us how the message of the angel of the Lord frightened the shepherds. In response, the angel said, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people ..." How will your family celebrate today the birth of Jesus, our Lord and Messiah?



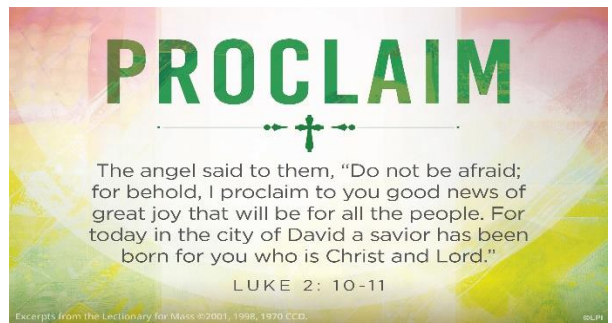

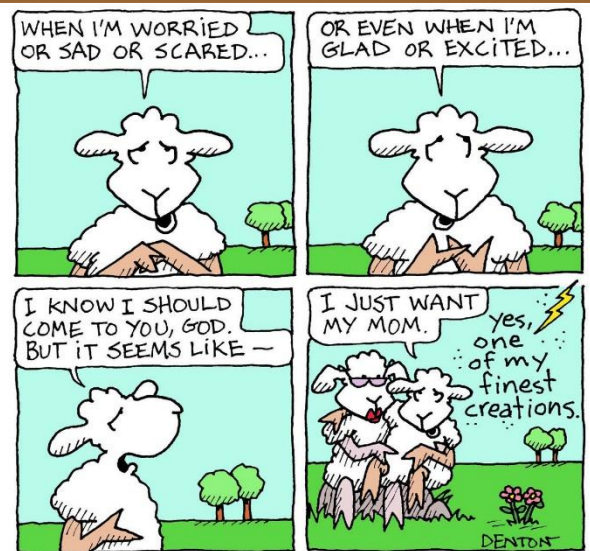
WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

Question:

Why do we give gifts at Christmas?

Answer:

So we mark the event with monuments, holidays, gold watches or plaques, making a meaningful event tangible and memorable.

Gift-giving sets aside the day as special and different. The special foods, customs, decorations, and gifts all help focus our attention on the importance and meaning of the day and at the same time allow us to share personally in its joy and happiness.
