

#### **VOICE FROM THE PEWS**

At Mass, one of my favorite prayers is the "Gloria." I love to sing this prayer. It is so majestic. Sometimes when I come to Sunday mass in a so-so mood, I join in the singing of the "Gloria" and I feel my spirits lift. Today's Gospel, however, tells us that giving glory to God involves more than our voices or words, and has nothing to do with our moods.

According to this reading, when we want to give glory to God, our actions will speak louder than our words. Read again Jesus' prayer to his Father. Like Jesus, we glorify God when we are doing the work God gave us to do.

The work list is different for each of us, designed according to our own unique talents and limitations. Some of us give glory to God by being a part of the choir or a lector. We give glory to God by working in a soup kitchen or teaching religious education at the parish. We glorify God by becoming police officers, teachers, factory workers, doctors, lawyers, or missionaries.

For parents, the toughest work God has given us is to raise our children to be spiritually, emotionally and physically healthy adults. We give glory to God by sharing our paychecks and the best of our time and energy with our families. We give glory to God with every peanut butter and jelly sandwich we make, with every dish we wash. We give glory to God when we use our gifts and talents to share who we are with those God has entrusted to our care.

FAMILY RESPONSE: Name each family member's specific talents. Discuss how they can use their talents to give glory to God.

PERSONAL RESPONSE: Where are you in your relationship with God? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?



#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

At a parish council meeting, our pastor mentioned the need for deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have a vocation? What steps should I take next?

#### **Answer:**

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service.

If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!
