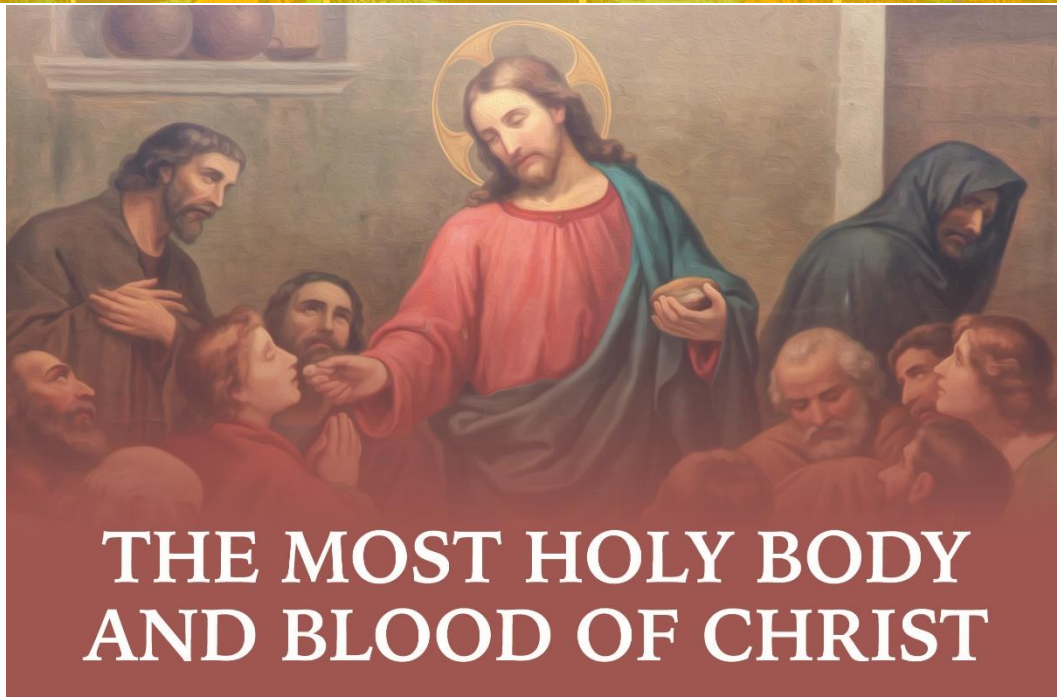

THE LIVING BREAD

The Eucharist, the Mass, is a memorial of Christ's great sacrifice celebrated at a meal. How can we help our children understand the great blessings of the Mass unless they are familiar with what a celebratory meal is like?

I remember a joke I heard years ago. "How does a suburban mom from Centerville call her kids for dinner?" Answer: "Everybody in the car!" Its truth resonates in so many of our families. I heard a statistic a few years ago that the average family sits down together for only two meals per week with everyone present.

The statistic is not surprising when we consider what busy and complicated lives we live. Extended work hours, long commutes, and a barrage of activities for children make time a precious commodity. And yet spending time together is one of the factors used to judge a strong, healthy family. Another quality is commitment.

One way of showing our commitment to family is by taking the time to have at least one special family meal a week. Make it a celebration. Remember, it is not the food that makes it special (pizza is fine); it is having everyone sitting around the table together.

Try to make a ritual out of such occasions. Light a candle in the center and hold hands for a blessing. Make sure the cell phones are silenced and the television and social media are turned off. Make it a rule that no one leaves the table until everyone is finished. Allow only positive, affirming conversation: no preaching, no scolding. A good conversation starter might be to ask everyone to share what was the best thing that happened to him or her that day (or week).

Time spent around the dinner table is special. Think about all the time Jesus spent in table fellowship with his disciples. He is no less present at our table. All of family mealtime is sacred, as much a blessing as the prayer it began with.

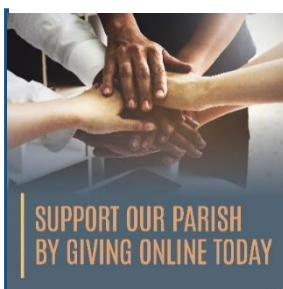

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



THIS IS MY BODY

As we gather today to reaffirm our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, we are reminded that we are also the Body of Christ. The mission of the Gospel calls us to be Christ for others. There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost and feeling lonely, marginalized and oppressed, victimized and abused. Every time we receive the Body (and Blood) of Christ, we are asked to become what we eat. Are we willing to step aside from our preoccupations and concerns so that we can be Christ for others? The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us. In receiving this transforming presence of Christ, we can truly effect change in the lives of those we meet. We can show them God's unconditional, ever-present love and the beauty that can come from loving others. We are given the grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God's sacred Presence within us wherever we go.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading: Moses and the ancient Israelites ratified the covenant God established with them at Mount Sinai with the blood of a sacrificed animal. The sacrificed animal affirmed Israel's commitment: "We will do everything the Lord has told us." Why do you think Israel tied sacrificed blood to their verbal commitment?

Second Reading: The author of Hebrews teaches us that the sacrificed blood of Christ sanctifies us and offers us eternal redemption. How do you see this connected to ancient Israel's practice of sacrificing animals for their blood?

Gospel: Mark's account of the institution of the Eucharist is linked to the Jewish Feast of Unleavened Bread when a Passover lamb was sacrificed. What do you think Mark is teaching us in making this connection?

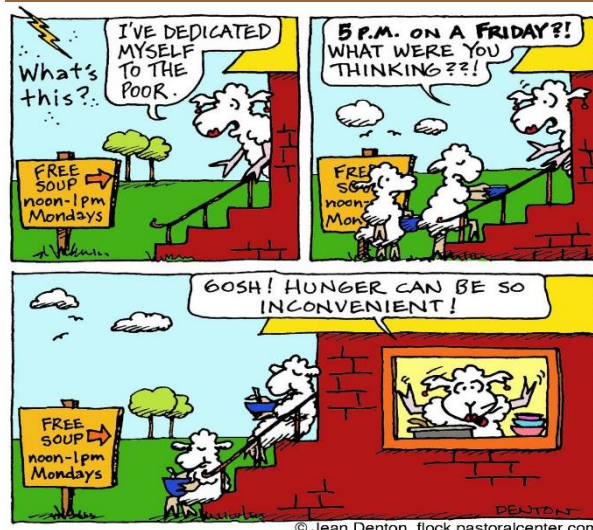
WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is a powerful reminder of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. We celebrate the gift of the Eucharist, the sacrament in which each of us is nourished and sent forth. This day reminds us that we don't do things on our own power – but from strength gained from the Eucharist. Before Jesus died, he asked his disciples if they could drink from the cup. He was asking if they were willing to endure what might come if they chose to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, heal the sick and blind and set captives free. They said YES. The Body and Blood of Jesus is a gift to us, yet it is a challenge too. Ask yourself this week, "How does the Eucharist nourish and strengthen me? How am I being sent like the disciples? To whom am I being sent?" Reflect on how you have responded to these questions in the past. What will your response be from now on?

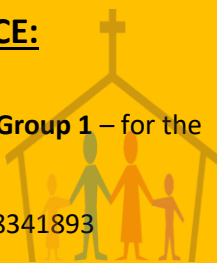

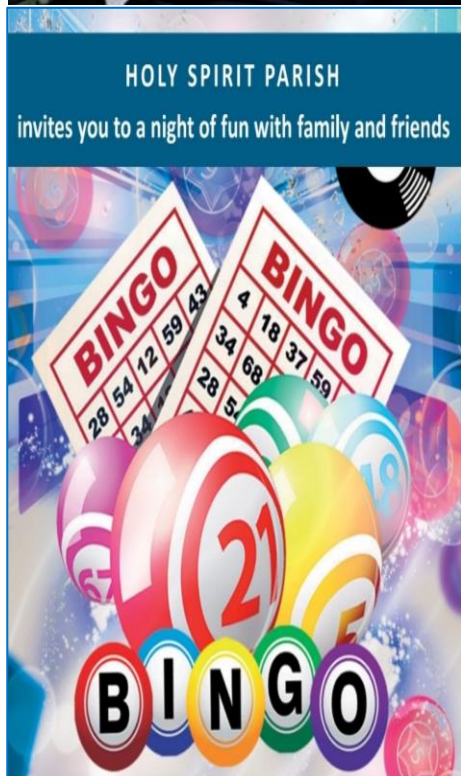

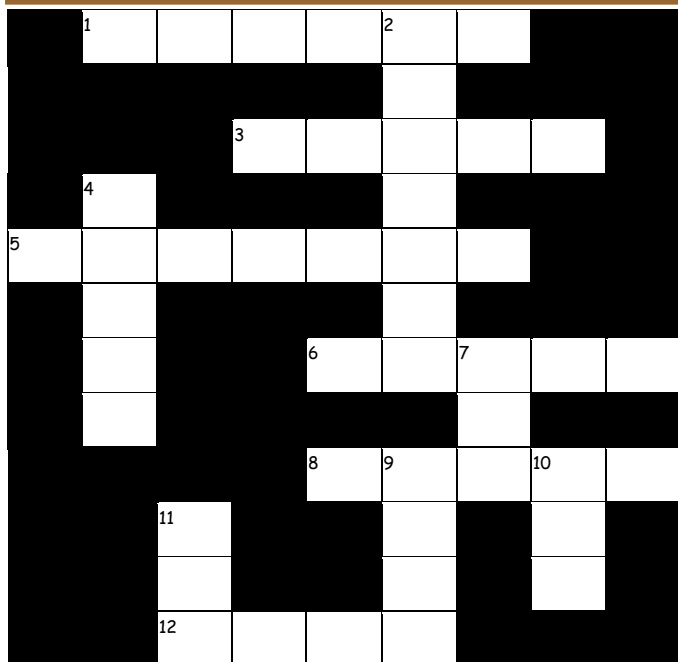

CREATION CARE TIPS

"He humbled you by letting you hunger, then by feeding you with manna, with which neither you nor your ancestors were acquainted." —Deuteronomy 8:3

We have access to more varieties of food than ever before in human history, but the processing, packaging, and transportation of many of them are unsustainable. This week, seek out a farmer's market to buy locally grown and in-season fruits, vegetables, and snacks. The "wrapper" that a peach or cherries come in (their skin) won't pollute the environment, and no energy was used to process them into something different than what they started as. Stock your snack shelf with any colorful, beautiful fruits, vegetables, or nuts that appeal to you instead of buying pre-packaged, processed snacks this week.

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WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do Catholics give the sign of peace to one another at Mass?

Answer:

The sign of peace is a part of the Mass that takes place immediately after we offer the Lord's Prayer. Inspired by the Jesus' words to his first followers, we stand together in a spirit of communion to pray as Jesus taught us: "Our Father who art in heaven..."

In this prayer, we call for the coming of God's kingdom in all its fullness and ask that God provides for our needs — "Give us, this day, our daily bread" — to forgive our sins and to bring us to the joy of heaven. It is almost natural, then, that the rite of peace would follow. As the celebrant prays that Christ's peace will fill our hearts, our communities, the Church, and the whole world, we extend to those around us a sign of peace (usually a hug or a handshake) as a symbol of the communion that we experience now and will experience forever in the fullness of the reign of God.

We are also reminded of Jesus' teachings that if we are at prayer and remember that a brother or sister is holding something against us, then we are to go and seek reconciliation with them before we continue our prayer (see Matthew 5:23). And so, the sign of peace also reminds us of the need to truly be in communion — united in love and peace — with God and one another before we approach the altar to receive the Eucharist.

So, the next time you're at Mass and the time comes for the sign of peace, remember that this is a moment to celebrate the gift of Christ's peace that each of us has received from God and to pass that peace along to those around us. We need this moment to practice, because this is also the same peace of Christ that we are instructed to carry out into the world at the end of Mass when the priest or deacon says to us, "Go, in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life."
