FR DAVE WRITES....

'MARY MACKILLOP – MODEL OF VOCATION!'

Dear Friends,

National Vocations Awareness Week is always held around the Feast of Australia's first Saint Mary MacKillop on 8 August. Mary's journey to religious life has become familiar to us along with the people and places where she established Catholic schools, including at St Marys and Penrith.

Mary's life is a reminder that God is at work everywhere, even in the outback! While at her uncle's property at Penola, she became firm friends with Parish Priest Fr Julian Tenison Woods. They shared a dream of setting up a school in Penola to cater for all Catholic children, including the poor. The school eventually became a reality and Mary began wearing a plain black dress and bonnet. When Bishop Sheil visited Penola, he addressed her as 'Sister Mary' and her great story continued from there. Mary would later establish the Sisters of St Joseph.

Each of us has or dreams but how often does it occur to us that our dream and God's dream might be the same? As we embrace our personal vocation, invariably our vocation is about the convergence of these dreams. Every Christian is called and commissioned **to be a bearer of God's grace to others**. This is what every parent does, what spouses, family and friends do for each

other. When the dream 'fits', we are responding to God's call.

Vocations do not come out of thin air but are usually the fruit of Christian family life where parents engage with their children and form them in the Christian way. You and I have faith because at some stage, significant people were bearers of God's grace to us – our parents, a family member or friend, perhaps a religious brother or sister, deacon or priest.

A vocation is rarely discerned in isolation but is often nurtured and called forth by others. A religious calling, though deeply personal, is never private. God's love is always for sharing, exemplified in the generous way Jesus offered himself for us.

Even where religious live an enclosed life, their prayers are for those in need. Over the years I have requested prayers for children in desperate situations from the Benedictine Sisters at Jamberoo. I recall one message from a Sister who had joined the community later in life as a widow: *'Fr Dave, our community will pray for this child. As a mother and grandmother myself, my heart goes out to her parents'*. Now there's a miracle of grace!

Religious vocations are lived out in selfless service of the community and we need to pray for the grace to love the Church in troubled times and support those called in these ways. As Mary MacKillop would say, 'Do not let your troubles disturb your trust in God!'

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



What do you really hope and hunger for? We are most familiar with our physical hungers and cravings as they are quite obvious. What we don't always realize is that we also have emotional and spiritual hungers. Many are starving for acceptance and love. Many others hunger for a sense of purpose, more focused direction, and deeper connection and meaning.

Our hungers can easily get confused. We think we are in need of one thing but are actually being driven by another. We need to recognize and pursue our spiritual hungers. If we do not do so, we will attempt to fill these needs with lesser, and not always healthier, things. God, ultimately through the Eucharist, is the only One who can quench our more profound thirsts. Have we discovered this yet?

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading: Near the end of Israel's captivity in Babylon (597-538 BC), the prophet Isaiah spoke of the Lord's desire to be unimaginably generous and life-giving to his people. How has the Lord been generous in gifts to you and your family?

Second Reading: In his letter to the Christians in Rome, Paul speaks of God's inseparable bond of love for us through Jesus Christ. In what ways does this sense of God's love for us help you in times of stress and anxiety?

Gospel Reading: In the immediate aftermath of the news of the death of John the Baptist, Matthew reports that Jesus, "moved with pity," cured those who were sick in the crowds and fed the entire crowd of 5,000. How do you react toward others for whom you feel "pity"?

WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

On August 7 and 9, we mark the bombings of Nagasaki and Hiroshima during World War II. Today we have nuclear weapons which are much more devastating than the atomic bombs dropped on Japan almost 70 years ago. Our U.S. Bishops have written courageously about nuclear war. Applying the Catholic Church's teaching about just war, which has evolved over the past two thousand years, the bishops have concluded that they cannot justify the use of nuclear weapons. Your challenge this week is to look at how you can contribute to a peaceful world so that the threat of nuclear war is made remote and unimaginable. How are you a peacemaker in your home? At school or at work? In your community? In how you engage in civic life? What is one thing you can do this week to make our world safer for everyone?

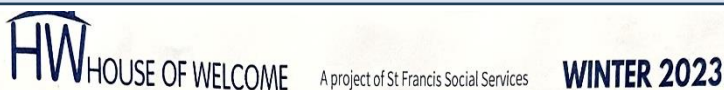

**WHY DO WE DO THAT?
Catholic Life Explained**

Question:

Why do the Gospels differ in their details? I was surprised to learn that not all of the Gospels tell the same stories, for example, the Nativity. Doesn't this take away from their credibility?

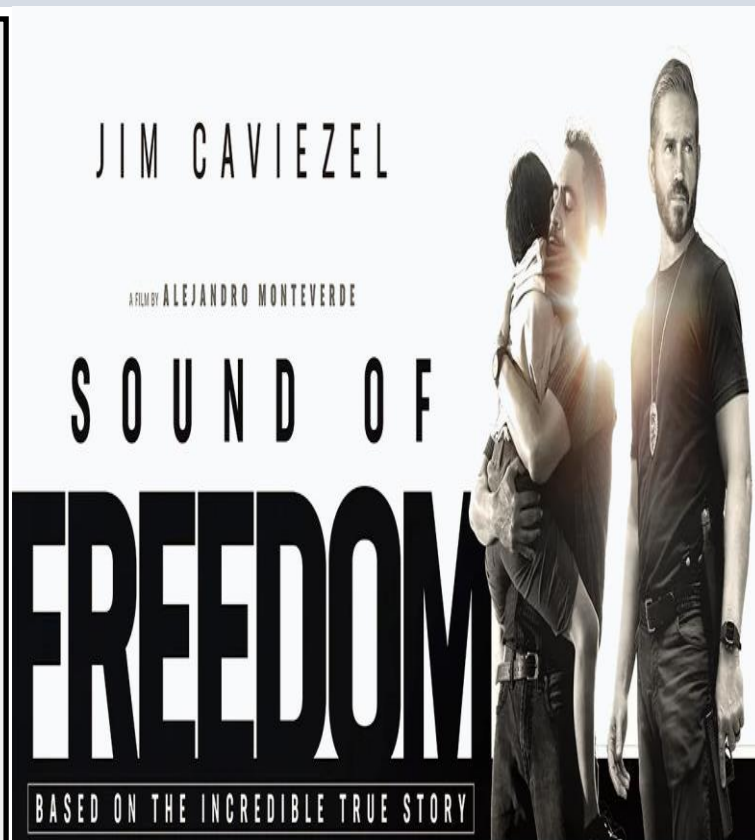
Answer:

Take any event that happens, from family trips to national politics and ask two or three different people to explain what happened. You will get a different version of the same story. People tend to tell the story from their perspective, and past experience shades what we recall and how we recall it. Our choice of words and what details we leave in or out is also influenced by the audience who is listening to our tales. The Gospel writers are no different. Each one tells the story of Jesus from their own perspective. Versions differ in some details, not because one is true and the other is not, but because each Gospel writer, or Evangelist, has a different theological point to communicate as well as a different audience for whom he is writing. He picks and chooses the details of his Gospel based on what message he is preaching, what his audience may already know, and what message they need to hear. The various details of the Gospels point more to their authenticity as a record of the church's experience and understanding of Jesus. In a good study Bible, the background notes for each Gospel contain a lot of information that helps us better understand each Evangelist and his message.
