### FROM FR DAVE - 'Listen, Learn Love' and the Referendum 2023

By now, many of you will have had the opportunity to peruse the Catholic bishops' Social Justice Statement – *Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples* - released for Social Justice Sunday on 27 August.

As Catholics, we bring a broader perspective to social issues, drawing on the Church's long commitment to Social Justice principles, based on Gospel values. Among the principles considered in relation to the Statement were the *inherent dignity of the human person*, the place of *the common good in the life of the community*, the Church's preferential option for the poor and vulnerable, and the right of all people to participate in the community.

Our Society often prioritises similar values but at times just outcomes are compromised by the political process and the inability to reach agreement on what is best for all. Aspects of the proposed Voice to Parliament have provoked legitimate and robust debate but on occasion this has become contentious and divisive, sometimes targeting people's fears.

While the Australian Bishops will not tell Catholics how to vote, they do ask all Australians to be properly informed. As the Chief Teacher of the Diocese, Bishop Vincent has written a challenging and informative letter to us that places the Voice to Parliament in context and suggests that we consider a YES vote to the Voice as the most constructive way forward. A copy of the Bishop's letter is included in the bulletin for your reflection, along with a letter from Augustinian Provincial Fr Peter Jones OSA.

I recommend 2 videos for your consideration (with links) – the first featuring NATSICC Chair John Lochowiak and Bishops' Conference President Archbishop Tim Costelloe SDB - Foreword Message; the second containing Bishop Vincent's address at the launch of the Statement in Emerton on 17 August - Bishop's Message.

The Parish has also received an additional 50 copies, a very timely gesture, given the forthcoming Referendum on the Voice. **Please collect a copy in the foyer.**



LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week



When making decisions, we often struggle with what voice to follow. We acknowledge the presence of God, the existence of the Trinity, the priority of the Gospel, and the virtues and values they embody. Yet, even with all of that truth, knowledge, and tradition behind us, we think we know better. When confronted with a decision, we eastly dismiss what we know we ought and need to do and entertain responses that stem from lesser desires and wants. We eventually may come around and realize that what God asks us to do is what we need to do, even if it wasn't our original intention. God accepts our return to Him with joy. What becomes dishonest is deceiving ourselves, God, and others by originally saying yes to what we know we need (and are asked to do) and willfully doing something else.


That is blatant hypocrisy.





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### **CREATION CARE TIPS**

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### WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

### **Question:**

Why do Catholics genuflect?

### Answer:

Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means "to bend the knee." For many Catholics, it's an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of "bending the knee" is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it become a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians, who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel that we visit and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.

In addition to genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament, we are also instructed to genuflect before the cross used for veneration on Good Friday (during the solemn celebrations of the Lord's Passion) and any time a relic of the True Cross is displayed for veneration. This long-standing tradition is a way of honoring the cross as the great sign of our salvation and of showing devotion to the passion of Jesus.
