

VOICE FROM THE PEWS

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

I thank you for your support and prayers for me to participate in World Youth Day in Portugal 2023. Throughout the pilgrimage we saw many churches and relics of saints. One of the most beautiful churches was the Sacre Coeur, a Basilica dedicated the Sacred heart of Jesus in Paris with beautiful mosaics. Perpetual Adoration has continued at this Basilica for nearly 150 years. During our visit to Lourdes, we joined in both the Rosary and Eucharistic processions. We also had Mass with hundreds of other people along with their Bishops, Priests and Deacons, in the grotto where Mary had appeared. It was beautiful leading up to World Youth Day to first have Mass with Bishop Vincent as well as our chaplains, then with other Dioceses around the world. Finally, during World Youth Day we had the closing Mass with the Pope, with the youth of the world, worshipping. It was great to see so many

faith-filled people, all in union with our Church. Pope Francis said "... God loves us as we are, not how we would like to be or how society wants us to be...". He also said "That is the church, ... The mother of all, there is room for all".

After WYD we had a retreat in Assisi, Italy where the nature was so beautiful. I can't imagine St Francis of Assisi having such a devotion to God's creation, if he was born anywhere else. If God's creation is so beautiful, how delightful would it be to look upon God for all eternity. Along the trip but especially at the retreat, I realised how kind-hearted, compassionate, and considerate my fellow youth of our Diocese are. It fills my heart with joy and peace. It also reminds me of what the Romans used to say about the early Christians, "Look how they love one another".

THE SOUND OF FREEDOM movie

Last Friday evening, the Holy Spirit parish Family Ministry hosted the screening of the movie, The Sound of Freedom. And whilst normally a movie is an enjoyable night out, it was clear to all that this was a different movie, and no one was going to walk out of the cinema the same. Already in my own personal life it has been the topic of numerous social conversations. It is a movie that has left an indelible mark on my mind, soul and spirit, and I'm certain others would agree.


It is a devastatingly powerful and simultaneously tragic true story centred around an heroic Homeland Security officer (Tim Ballard) who is in a special paedophilia unit, and the two children that he sacrifices his life to save from a Child Sex Trafficking ring. In the end he does so much more. There are numerous implicit Christian themes – mission, vocation, redemption, forgiveness – woven into the ordinary daily life of a man who didn't realise what God was calling him to do. If you were unable to join us last Friday, I encourage you to make an effort and watch this movie.





CREATION CARE TIPS

"For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life?" — Matthew 16:26

Pope Francis wrote in Laudato Si', "Christian spirituality proposes ... a capacity to be happy with little. It is a return to that simplicity which allows us to stop and appreciate the small things, to be grateful for the opportunities which life affords us, to be spiritually detached from what we possess, and not to succumb to sadness for what we lack." Name one possession of yours which is "possessing you." Get rid of it if it is causing you to forfeit your life in any manner.



WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

How can I practice gratitude in my everyday life?

Answer:

God has given each of us many blessings. Fostering an "attitude of gratitude" might be easier than Simple, concrete you think. practices can help us to be more thankful more often. Incorporate it into your dinner with your spouse, or as you tuck the kids into bed at night. "What are three things you're thankful for today?" Make a habit of writing one note a week to someone special in your life, thanking them for how they've impacted you. This is also a good practice in the workplace. Consider opening your weekly meetings with a quick round of gratitude sharing. "I'm grateful John helped me with that lastminute change to my presentation last week. I wouldn't have finished it in time for the meeting without him."

Another way is to designate a few minutes to thank God. This could be the first bit of your daily prayer time or after you receive communion on Sundays. You can also integrate it into your daily How about while routine. brushing your teeth? There's probably nothing so important it can't wait two minutes. Brush your teeth, quiet your mind, and thank God from your heart for His blessings throughout the day. Get Any moment is an creative! opportunity to praise and thank God.
