

BELOVED DISCIPLES – "All Saints and All Souls"

Here's a 'holiness' question! Did Mary MacKillop realise that she was a saint? Consensus is... certainly not, because '*If you think you're a saint, then you definitely aren't one!!*'

Each year, the great November Feasts of the Saints and the Faithful Departed remind us of our heritage and the people who have given us the example of how to live the Gospel message in day-to-day living - two feasts but different sides of the same coin.

Saints are strange creatures. Some are personally quite attractive in how they lived, what they said or wrote, where they were from, and so on. Some can be a touch forbidding, in their demeanour, their austere lifestyle and their eccentricities. Perhaps you have a favourite saint – some have a soft spot for Mary Mackillop, perhaps because she was an Aussie and knew what life is really like in this hard land.

Among the variety of saints, there are very different approaches to spirituality.

Saints like Our Lady, John, Peter, Martha Mary never used the word and 'spirituality' because Christian life was a total commitment, yet each showed great humanity and had a unique relationship with the Lord. Mary and Martha brought different personalities, temperaments and styles to discipleship and with their brother Lazarus were Jesus' close personal friends. In their lives, we see the different gifts where we so often live in tension - our busyness and the hungers of our hearts. Jesus speaks to each of us with great love and honesty. Each of us is a beloved disciple - the gift of these great feasts.

Let's not miss the saintly qualities present in our family members, in the lives of our fellow parishioners, in the lives of our loved ones who have died – we should pray for them and with them because they are always close to us in God's love, as St Augustine says, 'They have gone but a little way to a better place!' During November, let us also remember in prayer those who mourn family and friends at this time.

The Holy Spirit Parish pays respect to the Darug People, the traditional custodians of the land on which we gather to celebrate our faith and worship God. We acknowledge with respect the elders past and present.

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the Week

GOD'S PRESENCE IS IN ALL CREATION

Do we really understand how important our relationships with our brothers and sisters throughout the world truly are? Many gives God's commandment to love your neighbour and yourself a congenial glance of approval and agreement without really thinking about the implications. Sometimes it is easier to kneel in reverence before the tabernacle in a church than to kneel in reverence before the tabernacle of another person's soul. Witnessing and being consumed by the Divine Power alive in the heart of every living being transforms not only how we see our brothers and sisters but how we see God Himself. The cries of the poor and those who are hurting must echo in our hearts. We can no longer be deaf to the world's pain. It is no longer acceptable to judge others, unduly criticize, or marginalize, neglect, abuse, manipulate, or participate in the exploitation of anyone! We are asked to become hypersensitive to not only what we are doing, but why we are doing it. This holds true not only with regard to the daily conduct of our lives but our economic and corporate relationships and policies as well.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading: Today's reading is an excerpt from the many laws Moses received at Mount Sinai. We learn that God expects empathy and compassion for the most vulnerable in society. How do you show care for those in need?

Second Reading: Paul saw the believers in the city of Thessalonica as models for the faith in the surrounding regions of Macedonia and Achaia. Who would you hold up today as a model Christian?

Gospel Reading: Jesus teaches the religious leaders in Jerusalem that love of God and love of neighbour and self are the greatest commandments. Which of these two commandments do you find more challenging?

WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

The Sunday readings challenge us to care for the most vulnerable in our midst. The First Reading focuses on immigrants, orphans, widows, and the poor. The Gospel has Jesus linking the great commandment of loving God with the command to also love our neighbor. Jesus made them inseparable. Your challenge this week is to explore your definition of neighbor. Whom does it include? Can you identify the people whom is God calling you to love as you love yourself? Stretch yourself as an individual and as a family by expanding your circle of neighbors to include those beyond your comfort zone and beyond your own parish or neighborhood. Have a conversation, meet for coffee, sit in the school cafeteria, or share a ride with someone with whom you haven't connected. Make a new neighbor!

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CREATION CARE TIPS

As the days in the northern hemisphere grow shorter, don't immediately reach for the light switch. Experiment with doing activities in lower light or turn off your gadgets earlier in the evening as you try to stay in touch with the natural rhythms of the seasons and daylight. Do the dishes or play a board game by candlelight and enjoy the slower, quieter intimacy of the experience.

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WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

What Happens if Someone Drops a Consecrated Host?

Answer:

Despite our best efforts, and this is as true in our liturgical celebrations as in all of life, accidents happen. Occasionally at Mass, a host may be dropped or some of the Precious Blood could even be spilled from the chalice, despite the best efforts of the priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers of holy Communion assisting at the liturgy.

So, when a host is dropped or the Precious Blood is spilled, we can take guidance from the U.S. Bishops' statement *Norms for the Distribution for Holy Communion Under Both Kinds*:

All ministers of Holy Communion should show the greatest reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist by their demeanor, their attire, and the manner in which they handle the consecrated bread or wine. Should there be any mishap — as when, for example, the consecrated wine is spilled from the chalice — then the affected "area . . . should be washed with water, and this water should be then poured into the sacrarium.

According to no. 280 of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, the general rule is that a dropped host is picked up by the minister distributing Communion and reverently consumed. The minister should be careful to make sure that no other particles from the host remain on the ground. As we see in the instruction from the bishops, the Precious Blood would be absorbed (customarily with a purificator) and the area . attentively and reverently washed with water which would be disposed of properly. ©LPi
