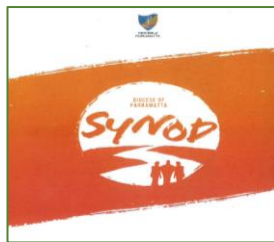

Parramatta Diocese Synod – Our Parish Representatives



The Parramatta Diocesan Synod is just a week away, convening on Friday evening 13 October and continuing over the weekend. Delegates will gather for the Opening Eucharist and Commissioning Ceremony at St Patrick's Cathedral and then process with lighted candles to the Convention Centre at CommBank Stadium in Parramatta.

Holy Spirit Parish is well-represented by parishioners Dominic Dimech, Dalton Gonsalvez, Lorensz Herft, Roslyn Moran and Peter Moriarty, along with Rachael Kama as Synod Operations Team Member and Liturgy Music Lead, and Fr Dave Austin as priest representative and Synod Liturgy Group member. Deacon Rod Pirota is attending in his role as Administrator of Sacred Heart Parish, South Mt Druitt.

We thank all who put themselves forward to participate in this important venture of the Diocese and for their commitment to the preparatory activities so far. Several parishioners have already participated in discernment sessions and preparing submissions. Submissions have been collated

and proposals formulated in the draft Synod Working Document. Our Parish Community has been faithful in praying the Synod Novena at the end of Mass each Sunday.

It is anticipated that the Synod's deliberations and outcomes will form the basis of a Diocesan Strategic Plan which will address the pastoral needs revealed through the collaborative efforts of our community. A crucial dynamic of this collaborative process is 'deep listening' – to the voices of the people of God across the Diocese here in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains and responding to their concerns.

The Synod is not simply an opportunity for introspection but an invitation to be outward-looking to the needs of the Church and the world – including the situation of families, our youth, and those on the margins, renewal of Parish and School, leadership in the Diocese, involvement of lay women and men, and a renewed commitment to Mission.

Our gathering coincides with the International Synod in Rome. We trust that the Holy Spirit will be active across the Church and we pray for the grace to recognize his presence.

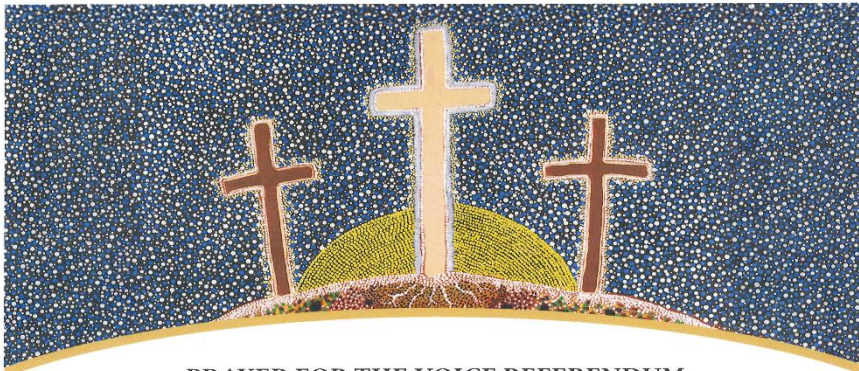

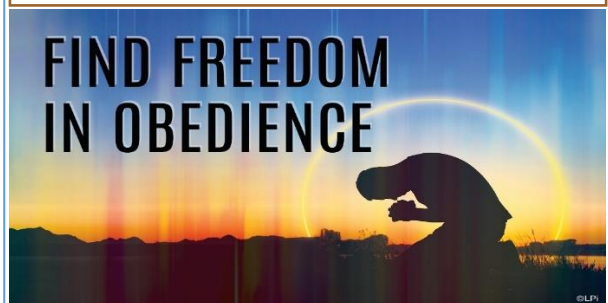

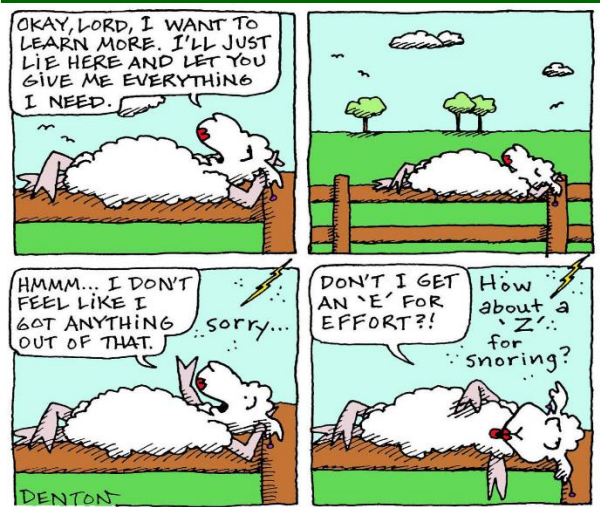
On October 11 we honor Blessed John XXIII. This is the pope who shepherded the Second Vatican Council. He also wrote several encyclicals, one in his last year of life in which he focused on war and peace. 

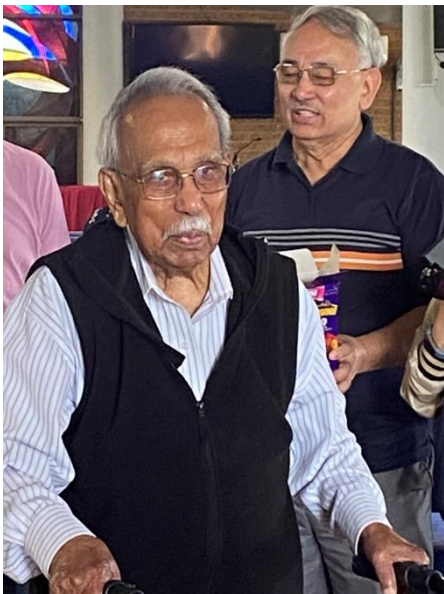

Question:

Why do Parishes Offer Special Masses like Thanksgiving and Memorial Day, even though they're not Holy Days of Obligation? Am I obligated to attend?

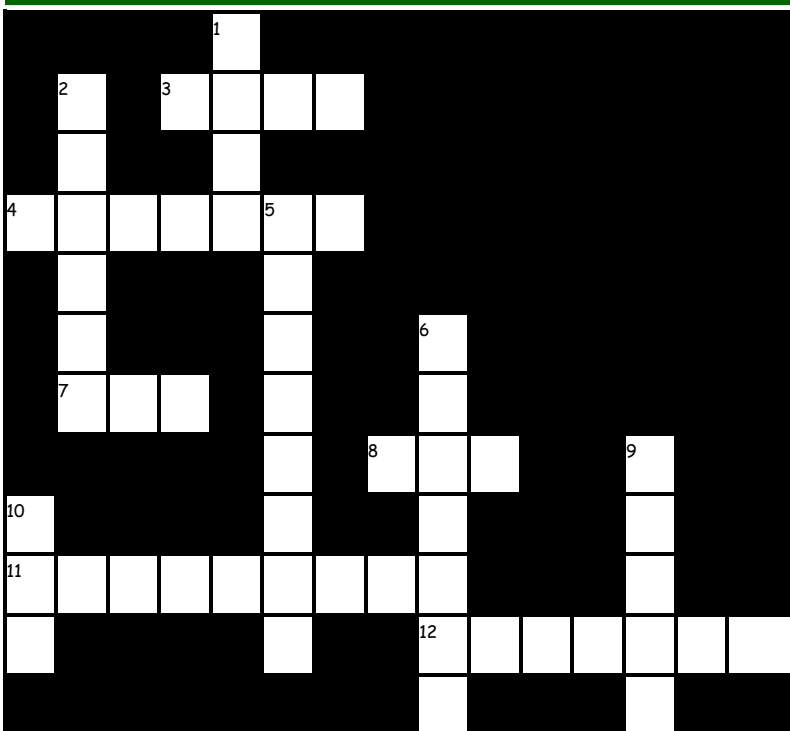
Answer:

Out of respect for the various civil celebrations that take place during the year, many dioceses and parishes will host special Masses. However, while it always worthwhile to come together to worship as a community, Catholics are not obligated to attend these celebrations. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church notes, the only times that we are obligated to participate in celebrations of the Eucharist are on Sundays and holy days of obligation:

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

The 70% of the collection is for the regular running of the parish. The remaining 30% is to provide for the household expenses of our priests and to support the ministry of the Augustinians.
