Dear Friends,
‘Come, Lord Jesus!’ is both our Advent mantra and our Christmas mantra too as Advent flows into Christmas. Both seasons offer us the opportunity of remaining open to grace and the action of God in our lives, times of refreshment and new hope in our spiritual journey.

In both our personal lives and our hopes for the community, we hunger for Peace – not in some vague, romantic sense but as a reality in everyday living across the world. We are justifiably frustrated at the inability of people, organisations and nations to achieve respectful and peaceful coexistence – in costly conflicts between and within nations, in disputes among members of our Church on matters doctrinal and liturgical, in our own families as we seek harmony and love at Christmas, in society where a rising road toll often reflects thoughtless and costly behaviour.

The weekly Advent themes, named each time we lit a new candle in our Advent Wreath – **Hope, Peace, Joy Love** – are energizing gifts for our lives in family and community but by no means easy gifts as we contemplate the many challenges of our

living. I often find the biggest impact on our understanding of the Christmas event comes from the simplest of sources – such as the Saviour named in Isaiah 7:14 as **‘God-with-us’** and quoted in the Gospel passage from Matthew 1:23, describing the angel of the Lord’s message to Joseph. **‘God-with-us’** sums up the profound mystery of God’s engagement with us.

Spiritual writer Fr Richard Rohr OFM shares a favourite Franciscan statement about the coming of Christ – **‘Incarnation is already Redemption!’** – and explains it this way:

‘Henceforth humanity has the right to know that it is good to be human, good to live on this earth, good to have a body, because God in Jesus chose and said “yes” to our humanity’ (Preparing for Christmas p 92).

How does each of us describe the magnitude of this extraordinary event that defines our beauty and human dignity? Simply trust the wisdom of our personal faith as others have done. We conclude with a Christmas Greeting from Saint Mary Mackillop (December 1899):

‘With all my heart, I wish you a very happy Christmas and a bright and happy New Year!’

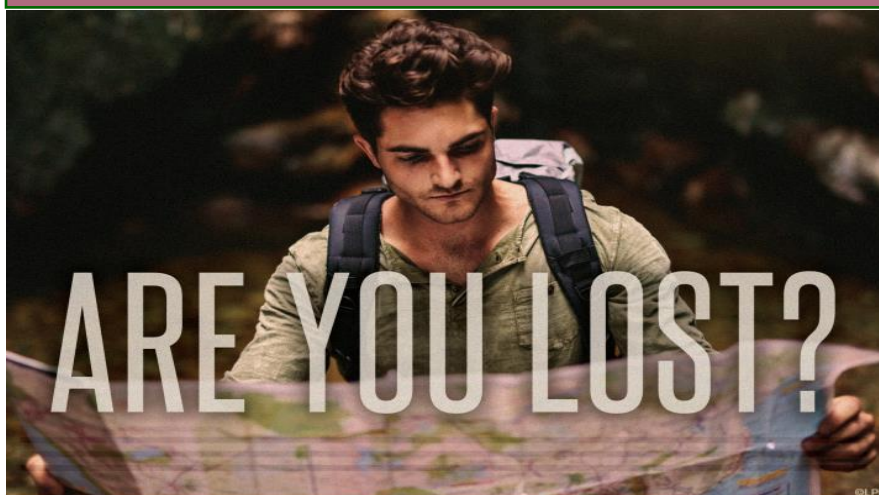

LIVE THE LITURGY



Inspiration for the week

Does the world realize that it is waiting? As we go about all of the busyness of our lives and entertain our distractions, there are many holes and gaps in our lives that need to be filled. We are always wanting more, but not really sure what that “more” needs to be. Fulfillment, happiness, contentment, and true satisfactions are fleeting occurrences and often come to us in illusive ways. What we think is the ultimate fix to our anxious emptiness really is only a fancy trend that we entertain. The world does not realize any more today than it did over two thousand years ago that it is waiting for a Savior. We need a Savior. We need to see and embrace the God who has broken into history and become one with us. It is this union of God and man that sets us on a straight path, orders our relationships, establishes proper focus and goals, and tells us whose kingdom we really are meant to serve. The world does not know how truly lost it is. Do you realize how lost you are and that the One you need most is here among us and within your grasp?

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK:

First Reading: Today’s reading from Second Samuel narrates the context in which God establishes his covenantal promise to King David around the year 1000 B.C. In the birth of Jesus, God fulfills his covenant with David. What does this teach us about the idea of “salvation history?”

Second Reading: Paul concludes his letter to the Romans with a hymn of praise to God for the long-awaited revelation that all are saved and justified through faith in Christ. In what ways are you praising God during this season of Advent?

Gospel Reading: Today’s Gospel reading records the angel Gabriel’s announcement to Mary of the upcoming birth of Christ. Mary’s acceptance of God’s will for her life (“May it be done to me according to your word.”) models for all of us unconditional faith. How can we encourage others to embrace such faith?

WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

During the Christmas season, we reflect on the images of peace that the prophets said would come when the Messiah arrived on earth. We hear about lions and lambs lying down together and of swords being beaten into plowshares. January 1st is World Day of Peace. Yet we live in a world in which war and violence shatter the peace for which the Old Testament prophets yearned. All of us as one global family are called to do our part to bring peace to our world. Your challenge this week is to be a peace-maker—in your family, with your friends and colleagues at work or school, in your community. How can you bring people together, encourage others to settle disputes without resorting to violence, or advocate for global peace?

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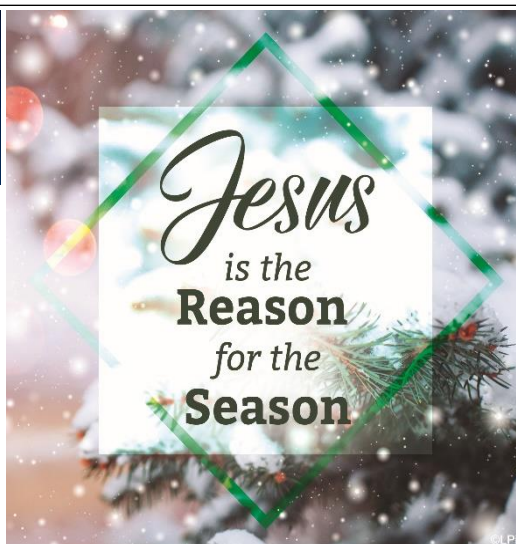

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CREATION CARE TIPS

“The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.”
—John 1:5

Some of us have so much excess on Christmas Day: presents, food, family, a big house, electricity, heat, and running water, while billions of others worldwide don't have the basics. On a day when we celebrate Jesus coming as a light into the darkness, find some time to tone down the excess. Turn the lights down (or out) and spend a few minutes of quiet with only the light from some candles or the Christmas lights. Be more conscious about your use of electricity and your heating source and celebrate that there is still light and warmth in the darkness.

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WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

What is the difference between apostles and disciples?

Answer:

When we look at the gospel accounts of the life of Jesus, we see two special titles applied to his followers: apostles and disciples. At first glance, we might think that these two words are interchangeable, but when we look at what each one means, we quickly see that the evangelists were using them very specifically. When we look more closely, we see that while Jesus had many disciples, the group of apostles was much more limited and referred to Jesus' closest collaborators.

The word apostle essentially means “one who is sent forth” or, as we might think of it today, “an ambassador.” The group of apostles — sometimes called the Twelve — included those twelve men who formed Jesus' inner circle (see Mark 3:13-14; Luke 6:12-13). It was this group that received the gift of the Holy Spirit and who were sent out by Jesus with the special mission of forgiving sins on that first Easter Sunday (see John 20:19-23). In time, the Catholic Tradition also recognize Saint Paul and Saint Barnabas as apostles, recognizing that they also shared the mandate of going out in the Lord's name to pray, to bless, and to preach. In 2016, during the Jubilee of Mercy, Pope Francis raised the liturgical celebration of Saint Mary Magdalene to the rank of feast, recognizing that she also received a special mandate to proclaim the good news of Jesus' resurrection to the Eleven, becoming the “apostle to the apostles.” In a particular way, the bishops continue the mission of the apostles in our own time.

When we think of the word disciple, we see that it has a very different meaning. Rather than referring to those who were sent out to carry on the mission of Jesus, disciple literally means “student” or, more specially, an “apprentice learner.” The task of the disciple is to learn and integrate into their lives the teachings, values, and way of life of their master teacher. Although a disciple might be called on to explain or represent aspects of their life, in light of the teachings they receive from this master teacher, Christian discipleship is ultimately about living our lives with faith and integrity, guided by the life and mission of Jesus, our Master Teacher. The call to discipleship is the common vocation of all Christians.

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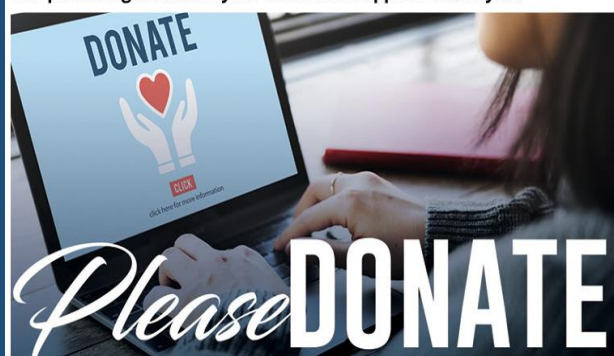
