Dear Friends,

Advent and Christmas provided us with prophecies of Jesus' birth and encounters with the people who were part of this great event - Mary's invitation, Joseph's struggle, Jesus' birth.

Today, we honour the Holy Family and affirm family life in all its beauty and potential but we are very mindful of families facing hardship - victims of bushfires, floods, extreme weather events, road trauma, famines, conflicts, and closer to home, adverse economic circumstances. Some struggle with the flaws and the brokenness in families.

We know that we need to work at family life and so in 2016 Pope Francis presented an Apostolic Exhortation - ***Amoris Laetitia - The Joy of Love: On Love in the Family*** - which expresses the beauty of Jesus' teaching on Love and the Church's teaching on married and family love. The foundation of all love is God's love for us and his ultimate, loving embrace of us in the birth of Jesus as one with us, Jesus who himself was formed in the family by Mary and Joseph.

As we recall the birth of Christ, we celebrate the Holy Family - our models, - but we must take care not to de-power their human example by surrounding them with an aura of unreality. In every family, people's lives bump against each other as they grow through different ages and stages. This is true of Jesus as he moved from childhood into adolescence and adulthood and grew in his awareness of who he was and his mission from his Father.

Jesus' call to 'Love your neighbour as yourself' is his call to families - that's where love starts. Family life and love demand the best from us. Family are those who hold us to the best dreams of our youth - the friends who challenge and stretch us to the limit of our ability and beyond so no gift is lost. In our family, we are God's gift bearers and we must remember that, no matter what age we are, old, young or in the middle, we still have gifts to share.

'As we begin this New Year, may we all be blessed by the Lord, and may we know the love of God, his generosity of heart, and his unbounded grace in our personal and family lives.'

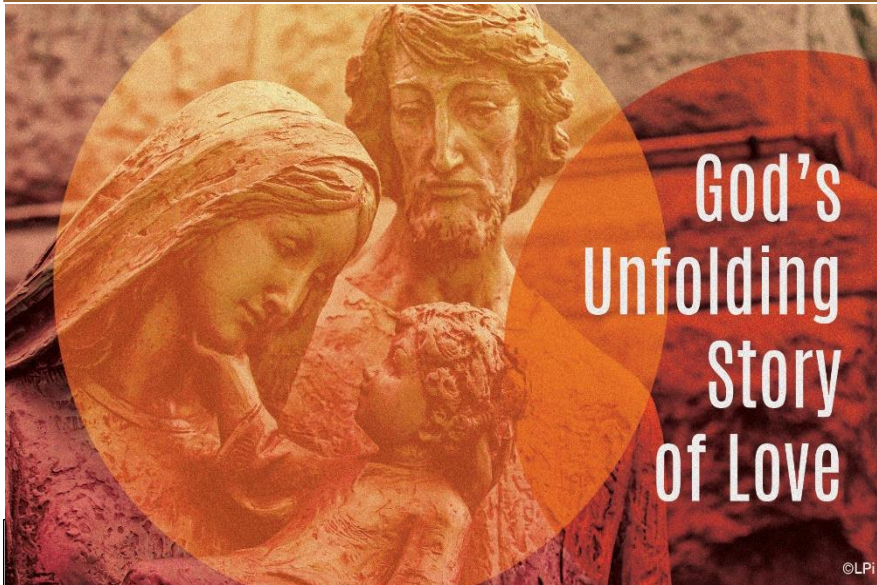

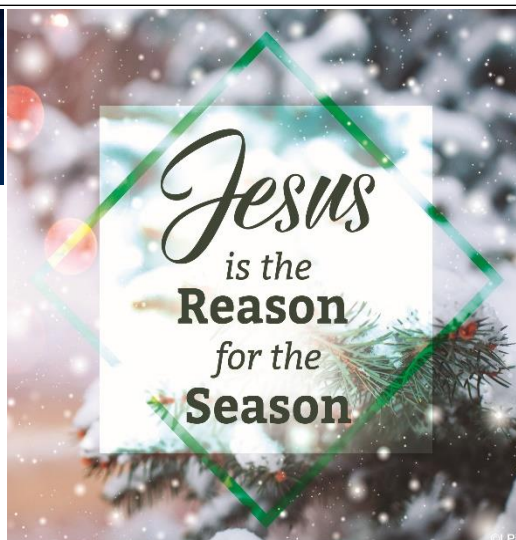
SECOND READING: John teaches us that if we believe in Jesus and love one another, "we may be called children of God." How do you show gratitude for being part of this holy family?

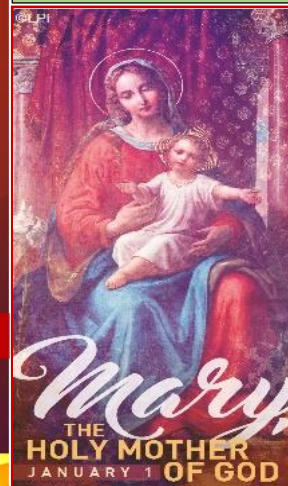

PARISH NEWS AND EVENTS

Amoris Laetitia – The Joy of Love: On Love in the Family

Pope Francis has a remarkable gift for naming our human reality - sometimes disarming, sometimes blunt, usually challenging. In his 2016 Apostolic Exhortation – **Amoris Laetitia – The Joy of Love: On Love in the Family** – he shares frank, common sense about family and relationships, often with an appreciation of human intimacy one does not expect from a Pope!

The full document and related comments can be viewed online. In the meantime, you may enjoy the following quotes.

- *Many people feel that the Church's message on marriage and the family does not clearly reflect the preaching and attitudes of Jesus, who set forth a demanding ideal yet never failed to show compassion and closeness to the frailty of individuals like the Samaritan or the woman caught in adultery. (n 38)*
- *Another challenge is posed by the various forms of an ideology of gender that 'denies the difference and reciprocity in nature of a man and a woman and envisages a society without sexual differences, thereby eliminating the anthropological basis of the family...' (n 56)*
- *I thank God that many families, which are far from considering themselves perfect, live in love, fulfil their calling and keep moving forward, even if they fall many times along the way. The Synod's reflections show us that there is no stereotype of the ideal family, but rather a challenging mosaic made up of many different realities, with all their joys, hopes and problems. (n 57)]*
- *The Church is a family of families, constantly enriched by the lives of all those domestic churches. "In virtue of the sacrament of matrimony, every family becomes, in effect, a good for the Church. The Church is good for the family, and family is good for the Church. (n 87)*
- *Just by a small gesture, a little something, harmony within your family will be restored. Just a little caress, no words are necessary. But do not let the day end without making peace in your family. (n 104)*
- *Just as a good wine begins to 'breathe' with time, so too the daily experience of fidelity gives married life richness and 'body'. (n 231)*
- *The life of every family is marked by all kinds of crises, yet these are also part of its dramatic beauty. Couples should be helped to realize that surmounting a crisis need not weaken their relationship; instead, it can improve, settle and mature the wine of their union. (n 232)*

Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

I have been away from the Church for a few years and really want to get active again, not so much for me, but for my children. Is this a bad reason to come back to Church?

Answer:

If you are on your way to the supermarket, and you are forced to detour from your usual route because of road work, does the food you buy taste different? Is the meal less filling? Are the vegetables less tasty? Of course not. In our faith journey, there are many detours called sin. Some are greater than others, some are even a bit longer. But God's grace comes to us in ways we understand and recognize and need. Your children leading you back to the Church is not as important as the fact that you are back.

This is an opportunity for you to renew, strengthen, and deepen your faith. Regardless of how we get to Church, or what draws us closer to God, the fact is we are there. Do what you need to do to get right with God and the Church. Go to confession, begin good family religious practices, and be involved in the ministries your parish offers. Be more than a lukewarm parishioner. Be the kind of Catholic you want your children to be.
