

Easter – 'Moving Forward with the Faith We Have!'

Dear Friends,

Life experience, carefully reflected upon, is our best teacher. As we make our faith journey – perhaps with strong faith or faith 'nearly-on-empty' - isn't it amazing how life imitates faith? The recent tragic death of Australia aid worker Zomi Frankcom in Gaza raises the question of how her life journey led her there in the first place – faith in some form. I'm a great admirer of elite athlete Lauren Parker, victim of a training accident in 2017 when she became a paraplegic. Her determination since has led to her becoming a world champion, paratriathlete... her motivation: 'I can only move forward with the body I have!'

As each of us absorbs the grace of this Easter Season, that could be a 'faith statement' for us – moving forward with the Faith we have. Irish Augustinian Kieran O'Mahony quotes the intuition of Irish priest/poet John O'Donohue, 'Faith is helpless attraction to the divine.' Whether we are believers or not, faith or its absence has an impact on our life direction – for some, 'unbelief' becomes a faith stance.

Each of us comes to believe in his or her own way and our faith needs differ. Some need a lot of knowledge to nourish their minds for this journey while others are more intuitive. Some take the long and difficult journey with doubt, yet faith is the important destination. Each of Jesus' followers took a faith journey after his death. As our Easter Gospel readings reveal, the women at the tomb became the first evangelizers of reluctant disciples who were locked up not only physically but in their minds and emotions.

Doubting and questioning sometimes frighten us, yet facing these moments truthfully leads us to faith. Describing the familiar encounter of Jesus and Thomas, the late Fr Pat Negri SSS says, 'The Risen Jesus who appears is tangible. The experience of his presence in the gathering of disciples is real, substantial, ongoing. Thomas, sure now of his love for Jesus, makes his act of faith: 'My Lord and my God!'

Our family and local faith community support our faith – the First Christian Community in Acts 4 this Sunday where sharing of goods and spiritual insight strengthen our spiritual unity. 'Communion' as believers is our goal as each of us seeks 'to move forward with the faith we have'. When it comes to faith, there's no point in standing still!




WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

UPDATE FROM THE PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

Hello friends,

I hope you all had a wonderful time celebrating the joyous occasion of Easter and that the resurrection of our Lord Jesus has filled your hearts with hope, love and renewed faith.

This new section in the bulletin will endeavor to share with you monthly, an update from the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) and what we have been up to.

Last month the PPC Invited Chris Brenton from the Social Justice Commission to give an update. We heard that they are currently low on volunteers and will be asking Parishioners who are interested to join their important ministry.

We also invited Aaron Smith from Basic Gift to give an update, who advised that there are minimal youth currently participating. Basic Gift is looking at collaborating with other youth ministries from the Diocese to get ideas from on how to revamp their ministry.


Fr Dave provided a snapshot of our Parish Social Profile, which was obtained from the last Census and prepared by the ACBC Pastoral Research Unit. An interesting statistic was that; in the St Clair area in 2021, the total population was 27,541 where 10,119 stated were Catholic. We will be looking at these statistics further to see how our Parish can use this information. Finally, we had a discussion on Safeguarding and Fr Dave provided a resource for Safeguarding in our Parish: "Reflective Practice Activities for Parish Pastoral Councils" We covered Standard 1 - Child safety is embedded in organizational leadership, governance and culture. We will be looking into ways of putting Standard 1 into action in the near future.

We look forward to sharing more PPC insights with you next month.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Ouestion:

Why are priests transferred from one parish to another? How is that decided?

Answer:

Bishops take the appointment of pastors to parishes very seriously and the decision to assign or transfer priests is one of the most important decisions bishops can make, effecting the lives of everyone in the parish community.

In 1984, the bishops of the United States implemented a sixyear term limit for pastors (which can be renewed by bishop); term limits for associate pastors vary from diocese to diocese. Sometimes a particular priest is assigned to a parish or chaplaincy to respond to specific issues (such as a parish merger, a fundraising campaign, or because he has special qualifications that make him a good fit for the community). In the case of new or recently ordained priests, the vibrancy and diversity, the presence of a school, or certain social programs offer invaluable training and ongoing formation.

In making their decisions regarding the placement of priests, most bishops rely on a priest personnel committee or a council of priests. There is also a period of dialogue with the priest(s) who will moved. sometimes even including an extended period of discernment and self-assessment, helping to be as sure as possible that the assignment of a priest to a particular community will truly benefit the people and be a healthy one for the priest himself.
