Dear Friends,

Open doors are a powerful symbol and certainly a preoccupation of Pope Francis' in various documents, including The Joy of the Gospel [46]: **'A Church which "goes forth" is a Church whose doors are open.'** It's a nice 'churchy' statement though in practical terms not easy to follow through, especially in a previous parish where the Poor Box was constantly prised open until one day the thief brought a power saw and cut off the end of the pew which he then took home with him!

The COVID lockdown experience brought home in dramatic fashion the importance of 'doors open' as an essential mindset if we are to be truly Church! Closed doors do not mean closed hearts unless we close ourselves off from other people and God's Holy Spirit as well!

I daresay that you, like me, find the Holy Spirit difficult to understand. How easily we slip into a mode of living and doing where we are always in control, which is fine...

until we aren't! We need to think of times we have found ourselves in situations, seemingly by chance, but with the benefit of hindsight, actually where God wanted us to be. I recall 2 occasions when I visited critically ill friends in hospital when I should have been somewhere else. While I was there, both passed to eternal life – definitely moments of grace and the Holy Spirit nearby.

As a Parish Community, we are blessed with the patronage of the Holy Spirit. As we seek to live the Christian life, we recall that our gift to Jesus is our humanity, still part of him as he returned to his Father. His gift to us is the Holy Spirit – Helper, Comforter, Guide, Companion, Divine Presence, God always within us. Might the Spirit of God be more real for us if each of us gave this Holy Spirit our own favourite name? The Spirit enlivens our spirit at every moment!

**LIVE THE LITURGY** Inspiration of the Week



The phrase “being filled with the Holy Spirit” may summon forth images that are a bit too intense for some folks. They may conclude that when one is filled with the Holy Spirit that they immediately begin speaking in tongues, loudly praise God, sing alleluia from roof tops, and do other demonstrative things. In reality, being filled with the Holy Spirit means being filled with the fullness of God’s life and in touch with the power and wonder of God’s presence. It is the Holy Spirit that draws us together as a community of faith, inspires us with wisdom and right judgment, and turns us from the darkness of sin to the virtues that bring life. We live in a world where it is hard to discover truth. The Holy Spirit, through the ministry of the church, guides us to truth and shows us the way to be the graced human beings God made us to be. Come, Holy Spirit, and fill our hearts!

**QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK:**

**First Reading:**

The descent of the Holy Spirit onto the disciples, which marked the beginning of the Church, was a transformative experience for the followers of Jesus. What have been some transformative experiences for you in your faith journey?

**Second Reading:**

Paul speaks to the Galatians about our universal struggle between the Spirit and the flesh. Paul even lists examples of the “works of the flesh” and the “fruits of the Spirit.” How would you measure your own success in this spiritual battle?

**Gospel Reading:**

Jesus assured his disciples that his Father would send the “Spirit of truth” to believers offering guidance and divine gifts. Where do you see the Holy Spirit active in your life?

**WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES**

May 21st has been designated as World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development.

It is very interesting to note that this day occurs in the week before we celebrate **Pentecost**, which is a story about unity in diversity. How appropriate! Cultural diversity is a buzz term today, but it also is something which we Catholics—by our very identity, since “catholic” means universal—embody. We are a diverse people in every way: age, gender, economic status, race, personality, location, and so much more. We are called to embrace and celebrate our differences, not try to make everyone else over in our image and likeness. Your challenge this week is to experience and celebrate something in another culture.

It might be a particular prayer, or an ethnic dish, or a type of music. Whatever you choose, embrace the gift of the culture. And offer a prayer of thanks to God that while we are all created in God’s image, we are also created in unique and different ways from each other.

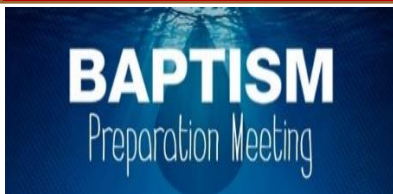



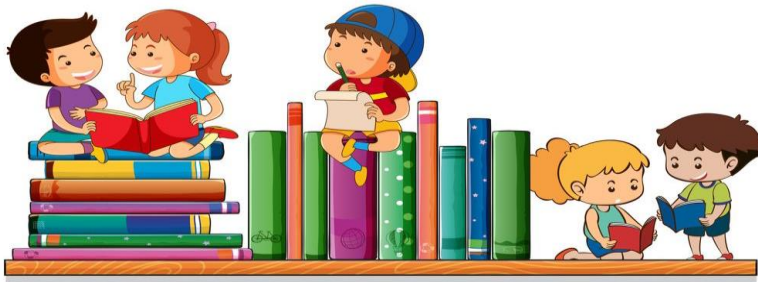

**WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:**

**Question:**

Why are Catholic and Protestant Bibles different.

**Answer:**

Since the earliest days of the Church, Christians used a Greek translation of the Old Testament known as the Septuagint. This collection of the texts of the Hebrew Scriptures included 46 books. At the time of the Protestant Reformation in the 1500s, the Protestant reformers began to create their own translations of the Bible (into local languages) and some began to question why the Jewish Scriptures would have included texts that were written in Greek, because, they assumed, the only valid Jewish Scriptures would have been written in Hebrew. And so, they decided to remove seven books from the Old Testament: Baruch, Sirach, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Tobit, Judith and Wisdom (as well as portions of the Books of Daniel and Esther). This means that the Protestant Old Testament only includes 39 books, while Catholic Bibles continue to include those original 46 books. Both Catholic and Protestant Bibles include 27 books and letters in the New Testament.
