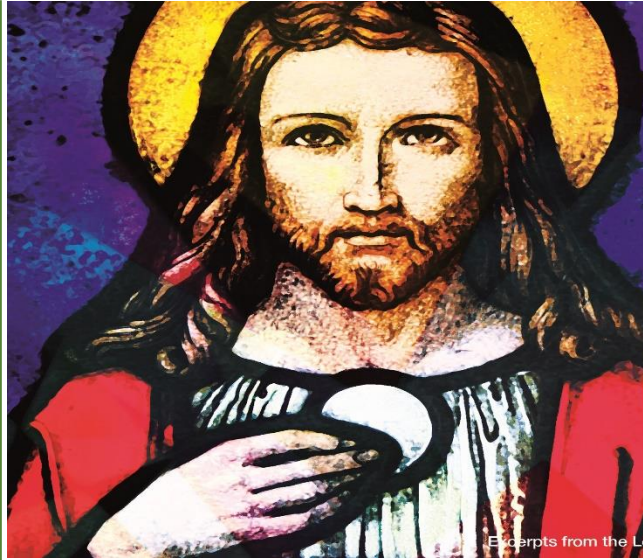

## DIOCESAN PASTORAL PLAN – 'Behold, I am with you always!'

Dear Friends,

The quote from Matthew 28:20 - 'Behold, I Am With You Always' - reflects both the reality of Jesus' abiding presence with us and the dream expressed in the Diocese of Parramatta's Pastoral Plan for a Synodal Church, launched last weekend. This Plan offers us a model for renewal and ministry in accord with the teaching of Vatican II. Keynote speaker and eminent theologian Fr Ormond Rush likened the model to Jesus' style of ministry and a move to a more reciprocal and responsive model of Church. A Synodal Church is one which 'listens' and guides the People of God in how they relate to one another and how they engage with the world - reflecting the deeper understanding and fresh outlook in the Council's documents written some 60 years ago. We can feel very proud of what has been achieved and take ownership of the Plan to the extent that many parishioners participated in the early discernment sessions and the more recent think-tank meetings that responded to aspects of the Draft Plan. Both at the Diocesan Synod last October and at the recent Launch, Holy Spirit Parish was well represented.

Synodality is an acknowledgement that together we are on a journey towards maturity as Church - guided by the Holy Spirit, all sharing in the Church's mission by virtue of our baptismal call, with a 'sense of the faith' that helps us recognise God in our lives, walking together as the People of God, sharing our gifts and charisms, searching for and discerning the

way forward. Our call and commitment is to be....

- An inclusive and welcoming Church
- A humble and healing Church
- A listening Church
- A Church renewed in spirit and prayer
- A Church that reaches to the margins
- A Church walking together

With Bishop Vincent, we pray *'that the seeds we have sown will bear fruit for generations to come.'*

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration of the Week



There is a “great cloud of witnesses” found in the official saints of the church and in ordinary people we meet every day. They are faith-filled inspirations who, by their example, help us to persevere in our faith. Living in a sea of conflict, change, challenge, and confusion, it is easy to grow tired and get weary. With so many things in competition for our attention, it is challenging to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus and the Kingdom of God. We have to keep running the race and continue proclaiming the Good News. This message is not always welcome. It can cause division, challenge accepted mindsets, ruffle peoples’ feathers, and cause some folks to become defensive. God’s ways are not always our ways. Even though often rejected by the world, the message of God in Jesus Christ must continue to be preached. We can rely on the examples of faith before us and around us and not lose heart. As Jesus endured the voices of opposition, so too can we.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

**First Reading:** The court official, Ebed-melech, courageously advocated for the prophet Jeremiah, having him recused from the muddy cistern. When have you defended someone being ridiculed for their faith?

**Second Reading:** The author of Hebrews encourages his community to remain strong in their faith in Jesus. What or who helps you when you feel spiritually discouraged?

**Gospel:** Jesus forewarned his disciples that his message would bring division, even within families. How does your family deal with this type of tension?

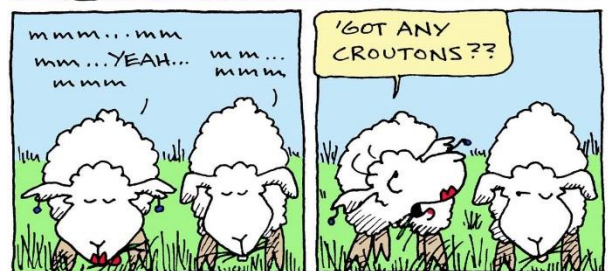
WEEKLY JUSTICE CHALLENGES

There is a lot of talk this week in the readings about how riches keep us from the kingdom of heaven. The rich young man was a good person and yet was asked to give up his riches. He was so challenged that he apparently walked away from the life Jesus was offering. Often people take this Scripture to mean that money is not good. However, Jesus never said that money is bad... it is just our attachment to it and all it can do for us makes it hard to give it up for anything... even eternal life. Your challenge this week is to take a personal assessment. Go through each room in your house (garage too), and make a list of what you have. Cross out things you really don’t need and make plans to give them away. Then go over the list again and see if there are things you can live without. Make plans to give those away too. Encourage the whole family to participate. It is a great way to become less attached to possessions and to remember where they all come from in the first place.

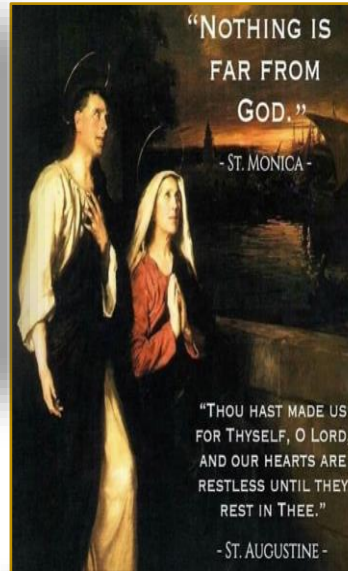

**WHY DO WE DO THAT?  
Catholic Life Explained:**

**Question:**

My neighbor is just beginning to explore the Catholic faith but was raised agnostic. I grew up believing in God, praying, and attending Mass. How does one start from scratch as an adult to develop a relationship with God?

**Answer:**

Start on a personal level! How did you and your neighbor become friends? How did you begin to discuss such a personal topic as faith? Communication, spending time together, and getting to know each other are essential to forming the bonds of a relationship. Personal prayer is essential to our relationship with God. We can’t be close to someone we don’t know! Invite your friend to explore the stories of Jesus in the Bible. Introduce them to the lives of the saints, especially ones you think they might be interested in.

Your neighbor might also have questions about the Catholic faith that you don’t know how to answer. If your friend hasn’t yet enrolled in RCIA classes, invite them to Mass at your parish. Introduce your friend to the faith formation director to make a connection. Personal support can be helpful as well, especially if few of your neighbor’s current friends are practicing their faith. Connect your neighbor to other people in your parish living their faith well. The good examples of other faithful people could help your neighbor to feel welcomed and supported. Our Church is vibrant and alive!

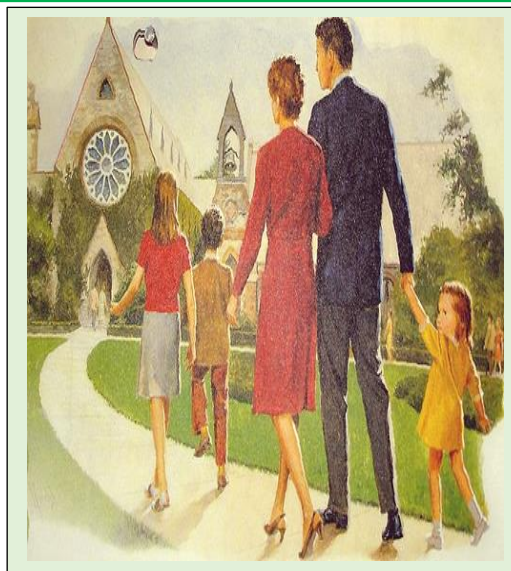
