PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE – 'Augustine and Monica – Friendship in Family!'

Dear Friends

As we celebrate the Feasts of Sts Monica and Augustine, this week, we recognize the unique friendship of this mother and son. Friendship in family is worth cultivating and in most cases achievable but we know too that families go through stages of tension and sometimes serious division. I recall ministering to a family in a previous parish where love was strong but relationships strained. The daughters requested a memorial Mass on a Sunday where the Gospel described the chaos that can occur in family life. I suggested that we choose a different reading but the daughters said, 'It's okay, Father. That's our family!'

Family truths are sometimes difficult to acknowledge. While Augustine and Monica were soul friends, their relationship took time to mature. I recall standing in the ruins of the ancient Church of St Cyprian on the banks of the Mediterranean where Augustine left his mother in prayer while he farewelled a friend departing for Rome. Augustine boarded the boat too without telling his mother. Monica agonized for many years over her wayward son who himself eventually faced his 'wretchedness' and the 'heavy rain of tears' at the time of his conversion.

As we savour the wisdom of Augustine and Monica, we need a reality check. Sometimes our 'saints' seem to have it all beaten but most experienced inner questioning and self-doubt along the way. Painful periods in our lives can ultimately heal us and make us whole. This was

so for Augustine and Monica as it is so for many of us. Even in Augustine and Monica's time, society experienced massive challenges and people were no strangers to family strife and domestic violence. The resilience of our human spirit is often tested.

Saints remind us of how important it is to care for our inner self and our life balance. Our participation in the faith community helps us achieve that. Augustine embraced a community ideal for his followers, a pillar of Augustinian life. We know 'community' in our families and draw strength in difficult times. May the wisdom of Augustine and Monica be food for our souls and refreshment in our prayer life:

SOCIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT 2024 - 25 Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World

In 1963, the world was on the brink of nuclear war. It was at that time that Pope St. John XXIII issued his ground breaking encyclical letter, Pacem in Terris (Peace on Earth). It was a heart-felt plea to the Church and all people of goodwill for an end to war and for the banning of nuclear weapons. He promoted a peace which is grounded in the inalienable and inviolable dignity of every person. His successors up to the present have echoed the same impassioned plea.



The 2024 – 2025 Social Justice Statement, "Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World", launched on Tuesday 20 August, is very timely. Australia's Bishops scrutinise the signs of our own troubled times, observe the violence around us, and ask why it is so. They also ask what is needed if there is to be peace. In a world full of pessimism, they put their faith and hope in the possibility of peace.

Using scripture and the guidance of Pope St. John XXIII's Pacem in Terris and Pope Francis' Fratelli Tutti, we learn that peace is possible if we put our trust in Christ who is the way, the truth and the life and the Prince of Peace. It is from him that we learn about the architecture of peace. From him, we learn a commitment to the culture of encounter, the value of dialogue at all levels and the importance of seeing everyone as our sister, our brother. The statement also provides some suggested actions to help us to build on our commitment to be peacemakers locally and internationally.

The statement is available in electronic form and a small amount of hardcopies are available from the ACBC shop. A file suitable for commercial printing will be available for you to organise your own print run. The Statement and a postcard sized prayer and action card that accompanies the Statement will be available electronically and in hard copy via the <u>ACBC Online Shop</u>.





"As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." –Joshua 24:15. This week, choose not to fret about what your near and far neighbors aren't doing to care for the environment. Instead, focus on what you and your household can do or can continue to do to serve the Lord by caring for creation. If your family can afford the more expensive recycled toilet paper, then buy it. If you can get to the farmers' market to buy your produce while supporting local farmers, do it. If you have space to hang laundry on a clothesline, go for it, regardless of whether your neighbors do the same or

not.





WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

We live in a country that upholds the separation of Church and state. What is the role of Catholics in society?

Answer:

The role of the Church in the world has taken different forms over time, but the theme is the same. Be disciples in it! As the lay faithful — that is, not vowed priest or religious — we are called to live and love in the circumstances of our daily lives. St. John Paul II wrote a document about the laity. In it he wrote, "In their situation in the world God manifests His plan and communicates to them their particular vocation of seeking the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God" (On the Lay Members of Christ's Faithful, 15).

God wants us in the hospitals. the board rooms, the law offices, the food pantries, and the little league games! We are to engage in the affairs of the world. But when we're there, we should live the plan of God. We need to respect those around us, engage in just business and legal practices, and love our children. We should care for the earth, use our money wisely, and get to know our neighbors. We must advocate for social policies that respect human dignity and human freedom. No matter our state in life, we are invited to build the kingdom of God!
