Synodal journey ... continuous process of conversion

Dear Friends,

The 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod on Synodality concluded last Sunday, October 27, in Rome. This event marked the end of over three years of listening and dialogue with the People of God, aimed at creating a "synodal Church" that embodies "the Gospel not just through words, but through every action and interaction."

Pope Francis emphasized that listening is essential for fostering harmony within the Church, a vision articulated by the Second Vatican Council. He underscored the Church's role as a peacemaker in a fractured world, stating, "In our time marked by wars, we must be witnesses of peace, even by learning how to live out our differences in conviviality." He encouraged everyone to actively promote peace through listening and reconciliation.

The Pope warned against becoming "dispensers of grace" who limit God's mercy. He echoed the words of mystic Madeleine Delbr l, who encouraged her readers to avoid rigidity and embrace a faith characterized by openness, joy, and trust in God's mercy:

"Let us live our life, not as a game of chess where everything is calculated, not as a game where everything is difficult, not as a theorem that breaks our minds, but like an endless party where your meeting is renewed, like a ball, like a dance, in the arms of your grace, in the music that fills the universe with love."

The Holy Father chose not to write an Apostolic Exhortation but assured that the Synod Document would be accessible to all, providing guidance for the Church's mission.

He reminded participants that the process of synodality is ongoing, rooted in the Spirit, who unites the Church in its diversity. The synodal journey is "not an endpoint but a continuous process of conversion, driven by the Spirit that unifies the Church across all cultures, challenges, and hopes."

The Holy Father encouraged all Synod participants to carry the gifts of the Spirit into the world as a Church that listens, prays, and acts with humility.

GOSPEL : MARK 12:28-34

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

There is a story told about an elderly Cistercian, who on being asked what he believed at that point in his life replied, "I believe more and more in less and less"! It is not as paradoxical as it seems. As we go on, the core dimension of the faith should stand out for us. As Erasmus wrote, the essentials are few but essential.

PRAYER

God, your love is always there ahead of us, even before we are aware of it. Help us, therefore, to love you by letting you love us first. May we love you in our neighbour in need. Amen.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. Today's gospel brings us right to the heart of what a Christian life involves: love of God and of neighbour. Jesus tells us that having life both now and in the future is the fruit of living in a spirit of love. How have you experienced the power of love given, and received, as a source of life and vitality?
2. If you were asked what is most important in life, what would your answer be? Recall the experiences and relationships you have had. Which are the ones that you treasure most? What has particularly enriched your life? How would you encourage another person who asked you how s/he could live a full life?
3. Jesus praises the questioner as one who had answered wisely. Recall some of the wise people you have known, people who in their words and actions impressed you with their capacity to see and treasure what is important in life.

PRAYER

Lord our God, you are the one God and there is no other. Give us grace to hear and heed the great commandment of your kingdom, that we may love you with all our heart and our neighbour as ourselves. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen

SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

In Sunday's Gospel, we hear Jesus proclaim the greatest commandment of loving God with our whole beings. But then Jesus adds the second greatest: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." Your challenge this week is to think about how



loving God and loving neighbour are inseparable. Then choose one neighbour (near or far) who needs help. It might be spiritual, financial, emotional, physical, or something else. Reach out to this neighbour and offer your assistance. It's a great way to show how much you love God!

Do you pick up trash around your home? This week, pick up trash and litter whenever you see it around neighbours' homes too—be they near or far neighbours. Maybe some kids littered in your neighbour's front yard and they haven't picked it up yet. Or maybe you're walking on a public beach or riverbank and there's trash washed up from miles away. To be extra saintly, collect neglected dog excrement. Just as you want to live in a clean, sanitary space, help your neighbour to do that too.

Catholic Life Explained : WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Question:

How can we pray for the dead throughout the year?

Answer:

We commemorate the faithful departed on November 2nd each year. However, we can and should continue to pray for the dead. Our growth in Christian perfection takes a long time. At the time of our death, many of us might not be saints yet. But God, in His mercy, allows for those who love Him to experience purification after death. Our word for that state is Purgatory. It's the antechamber of heaven, so to speak. We know we're getting in the house, but we're not quite ready to go all the way in. There's rain to shake off our coats and dirt that's clogging our shoes.

Here on earth, we can pray for the souls in Purgatory. One way is to request that your parish offer a Mass for the intention of a specific loved one. We can also remember the departed in our daily prayers. Just as we have special intentions for family and friends here on earth, we can pray for those who have died. It's also a good act of Christian charity to pray for the forgotten, those who have no one else to pray for them. God knows who they are!


