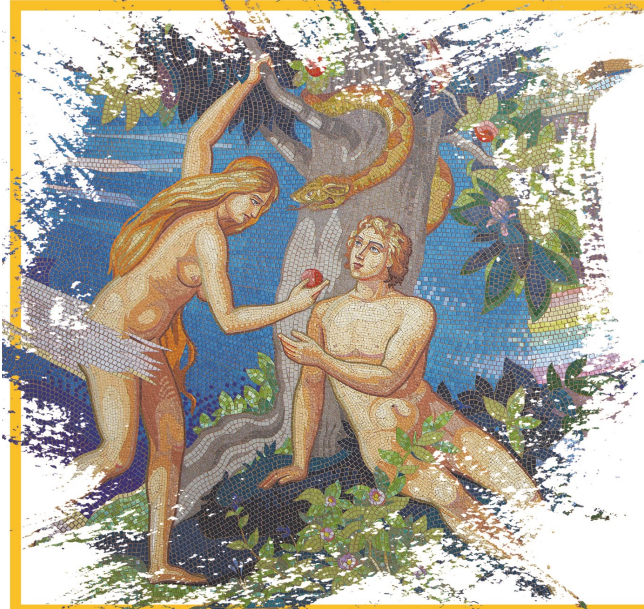

'The Joy of Love – On Love in the Family'

Dear Friends,

Our love relationships are precious, no matter what our state of life. The Scriptures contain many rich passages on love, a great resource for couples choosing readings for their marriage. 1 Corinthians 12:31-13:8 is the most popular, along with excerpts from Genesis 1 and 2 which define our humanity and equality as man and woman.

In today's Gospel, Jesus draws on this teaching about faithfulness in marriage but often deals with the imperfect, human face of our relationships which sometimes fall short of the ideal. Whatever our situation, we need to know the love of Jesus and the pastoral support of the Church when relationships fail. Today's Gospel is a challenge for the homilist.

Everyone needs to love and be loved. You are invited to enjoy these quotes from Pope Francis' 2016 Exhortation *Amoris Laetitia* - The Joy of Love: On Love in the Family as a way of personal and family renewal, perhaps in our prayer or in family conversation.

- Many people feel that the Church's message on marriage and the family does not clearly reflect the preaching and attitudes of Jesus, who set forth a demanding ideal yet never failed to show compassion and closeness to the frailty of individuals like the Samaritan or the woman caught in adultery. (*Amoris Laetitia* n 38)
- To be open to a genuine encounter with others, "a kind look" is essential. This is incompatible with a negative attitude that readily points out other

people's shortcomings while overlooking one's own. A kind look helps us to see beyond our own limitations, to be patient and to cooperate with others, despite our difference. (n 100)

- Just by a small gesture, a little something, harmony within your family will be restored. Just a little caress, no words are necessary. But do not let the day end without making peace in your family. (n 104)
- Sexuality is not a means of gratification or entertainment; it is an interpersonal language wherein the other is taken seriously, in his or her sacred and inviolable dignity. (n 151)
- In our own day, sexuality risks being poisoned by the mentality of 'use and discard.' The body of the other is often viewed as an object to be used as long as it satisfies, and rejected once it is no longer appealing. (n 153)
- It is a profound spiritual experience to contemplate our loved ones with the eyes of God and to see Christ in them. (n 323)
- As this Exhortation has often noted, no family drops down from heaven perfectly formed; families need constantly to grow and mature in the ability to love. (n 325)

Let us hold on to love, the heart of the Christian message, as we read in 1 John 4:16 – 'God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them!'

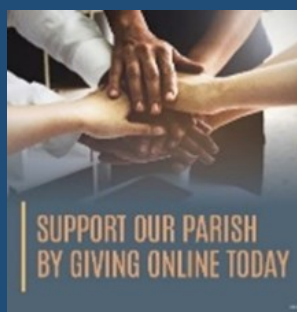

LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration of the Week



Come to the feast! God calls us to participate in the banquet of life, a banquet that can fill and satisfy us like no other. It is a spiritual feast where we kind find inner refreshment and satisfy the thirst and hunger of our souls. Do you want to come? Every human being receives an invitation; no one is excluded. There is no charge and an abundant table is set. Some will blatantly refuse. They see no merit in attending and feel that they can fill their needs in other ways. Others will simply ignore the invitation. Maybe they are too consumed with other matters they feel are more important at the time. Still others may even get angry and feel deep resentment for even being asked, resorting to acts of violence in protest of the very presence of the feast. In spite of this, many will also come. They will be the good and the bad, the lost and the lonely, and the ones who understand. They know love when they see it. When they go to the feast, they will rejoice and be glad as they will have found the God for whom they looked!

FIRST READING: Today's creation account of man and woman is the foundation of our Judeo-Christian understanding of the covenant of marriage. When a male and a female marry, "the two of them become one body." What do you see as some modern implications in this understanding of marriage?

SECOND READING: The author of Hebrews tells us that we are "brothers" with Jesus in our common experience of suffering and death. In what way do you find comfort in this idea?

GOSPEL READING: Both in public with the Pharisees and later in private with the disciples, Jesus takes a strong stand on the sacred and unbreakable bond of marriage. How do you imagine the Pharisees and the disciples reacted to Jesus' position?

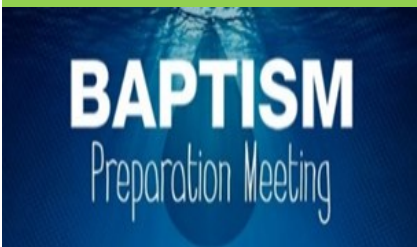
