

CATHOLIC MISSION - 'Go and invite everyone to the banquet!' (Mt 22:9)

Dear Friends,

The 'missions' have always been at the forefront of Catholic awareness but today we are being challenged to take a broader view. *Mission* is not just about those who are 'over there' but at the heart of what it means to be Church. At this moment, the Synod continuing in Rome is focusing on 'Communion, Participation, Mission'. In his Statement for the 98th World Mission Day, Pope Francis emphasises our identity as 'missionary disciples of Christ' and the need 'to refocus the Church on her primary task, which is the preaching of the Gospel in today's world.'

In the Diocese of Parramatta's Pastoral Plan, 'mission' is a priority that, 'emphasises that the Church exists to evangelise... to share the Good News. As such, the Church cannot be centred on itself.' Our commitment to synodality, 'enables the Church to better witness to the Gospel, especially to those on the spiritual, social, economic, political, geographical, and existential peripheries of our world' (p 20).

Pope Francis challenges us, 'Go and invite!'
The heart of the mission is 'to go out' and 'to invite' –
'Mission, we see, is a tireless going out to all men and
women, in order to invite them to encounter God and
enter into communion with him.'

The theologian Karl Rahner SJ speaks about the 'Sacrament of the World' and reminds us of both the expansiveness of God's presence in and with us and the magnitude of the task of bringing forth the Kingdom of God. Like his predecessors, Pope Francis exhibits an extraordinary global awareness as he seeks to reach out in dialogue with the world to effect change. This missionary awareness needs to colour our outlook and judgment as we witness tragic conflicts in many countries that truly threaten our peaceful future. We conclude with Francis' words:

Finally, let us lift our gaze to Mary, who asked Jesus to perform his first miracle precisely at a wedding feast, in Cana of Galilee (cf. In 2:1-12). The Lord offered to the newlyweds and all the guests an abundance of new wine, as a foreshadowing of the nuptial banquet that God is preparing for all at the end of time. Let us implore her maternal intercession for the evangelizing mission of Christ's disciples in our own time. With the joy and loving concern of our Mother, with the strength born of tenderness and affection (Evangelii Gaudium, 288), let us go forth to bring to everyone the invitation of the King, our Saviour. Holy Mary, Star of Evangelization, pray for us!

Synod of Synodality (2-27 October)

In Rome, the second session of the Synod of Synodality (2-27 October) is underway. Pope Francis in his homily at the Synod's opening Mass called for a Church where 'each person feels welcomed'. Archbishop Timothy Costelloe, president of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC), preached during a Mass for the Memorial of Saint Jerome (30 September) on the first day of the Synod Retreat in Rome. In his sermon, Archbishop Costello said the Church was 'being asked to reflect not so much on what synodality is but rather on how we are able to live it at every level of of the life of the Church . . . '


