

TO JESUS WITH MARY

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate our faith and devotion to the Blessed Mother. Our fiesta celebration honours Mary as a model disciple of Jesus, her Son. As such it gives us the opportunity to reflect on the significance of Mary's life to our lives as disciples of Jesus.

During the Marian talk, which marked the beginning of our fiesta celebration, we explored the relationship between Mary and the Church as described in the writings of Saint Augustine.

For Saint Augustine, Mary's greatness lies in her faithfulness to Jesus Christ, her Lord and ours. He wrote: "Mary was more blessed in accepting faith in Christ than in conceiving the flesh of Christ ." [Holy Virginity 3].

Augustine understands Mary's holiness in terms of her faith and radical obedience to the Word of God. He regards Mary as the true disciple of Jesus and considers her as the most eminent member of the Body of Christ who serves as a model of holiness for all the faithful.

Saint Augustine envisaged Mary as a "model member of the Church in a Trinitarian perspective." In Mary, one can find complete adherence to the Father's will, full collaboration with Christ's redemptive work and total obedience to the prompting of the Holy Spirit. Mary's life is truly, fully and actively at the service of the divine Trinity. She exemplifies to all Christians what authentic Christian discipleship is all

Augustine recommends Mary as a paradigm for the Christian life rather than just a subject of intercessory prayer. She is, for all us, an example for the Christian life, and not just someone we pray to.

As the first disciple of Jesus, Mary's primary role is to bring us closer to Jesus, and her mission is to make us disciples of her son.

May our devotion to the Blessed Mother bring us closer to Jesus and to one another. Happy Fiesta.

HEARERS OF THE WORD

So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ.

I beg you to give me real understanding of what I read, that I in turn may put its precepts into practice.

Yet, I know that understanding and good intentions are worthless, unless rooted in your graceful love.

So I ask that the words of Scripture may also be not just signs on a page. but channels of grace into my heart. Amen. (Origen, AD c.184-c.254)

Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

Thought for the day

As such, ambition is not quite neutral. We are called to be ambitious, that is, to use our gifts, to inhabit our strengths, to be of real service. St Paul says, be ambitious for the higher gifts. It is not that ambition as such is harmful; however, in the common experience, ambition can be destructively egocentric and based on distorted motivation.

Prayer

Set our hearts free, O Lord, that we may desire what you desire and love what you love. Amen.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

- 1. Jesus had spent much time teaching his followers that discipleship was a life of service, a life giving oneself for others. In spite of that, James and John were thinking of what they could get out of it. For Jesus, for the apostles, and for each one of us, the glory of God is revealed when we allow God to work through us as we give ourselves for others. When have you found that you reach a fuller life and others benefit when you act in this spirit of service?
- 2. One of the great problems in a community, a parish or an organisation, is when you have some people jockeying for status and positions of power. The good of the group and the people it serves take second place to personal prestige. You have probably seen this happen. Perhaps you have also witnessed people with a spirit of service that allowed them to value the good of the group over personal rewards. Recall them and give thanks for their witness.
- 3. Jesus himself is the great model of this spirit of service. Think of the aspects of Jesus' life and ministry that have inspired you to imitate his giving of his life for others.

PRAYER

Most glorious God, in Jesus you show us that your will is to save. Grant to us your people the boldness to desire a place in your kingdom, the courage to drink the cup of suffering and the grace to find in service the glory of your promise. Amen.

Synod of Synodality (2-27 October) - In Rome, the second session of the Synod of Synodality (2-27 October) is underway. Pope Francis in his homily at the Synod's opening Mass called for a Church where 'each person feels welcomed'. Archbishop Timothy Costelloe, president of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC), preached during a Mass for the Memorial of Saint Jerome (30 September) on the first day of the Synod Retreat in Rome. In his sermon, Archbishop Costello said the Church was 'being asked to reflect not so much on what synodality is but rather on how we are able to live it at every level of the life of the Church . . .' 
