Dear Friends,

During November, parish communities provide opportunities for us to remember our brothers and sisters who have died – as expressed in Eucharistic Prayer II: ‘to remember our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection.’ Customs include recording the names of our beloved dead in a special book, asking that they be remembered in Masses during November, visits to the cemetery, parish and family prayers for the dead.

On Wednesday 27 November, parishioners and families who have lost family members or friends in the last 2 years are invited to a Mass of Remembrance. Few of us cope well with deep grief but it is the journey we need to take. My personal losses are still raw 60 or more years on, but that’s perfectly normal. Grief and love belong together and we need not fear them.

Dealing with death is part of our life, particularly so for priests in extending pastoral care to the bereaved. Over the years, I have presided at funerals of infants, children, the elderly, those with terminal illnesses, victims of road accidents and violent crimes, to name a few. Somehow we deal with all of these life-changing experiences as we seek understanding of the hope promised in the Paschal Mystery of Christ’s Dying and Rising.

Our prayers are important as we face the great mystery of death, both as a way of becoming more closely bonded with those who have died and especially those with whom we were not always at peace in this life, confident in the promise of ultimate reconciliation in the kingdom where God ‘will wipe away every tear from our eyes’ (EP III).

Our theology has never quite resolved the question of how near or far are the souls of the departed. What is it that we ask for them in our prayers during November? Christian tradition acknowledges our transition from this life to the next, our life in time to our life in eternity, perhaps with some purification, yet the nature of this ‘journey’ remains a mystery. I find great comfort in the words of St Monica, quoted in St Augustine’s Confessions:

‘Lay this body anywhere, and take no trouble over it. One thing only do I ask of you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be’ (Book IX, 27).

‘Nothing is far from God. There is no danger that at the end of the world he will not know where to find me and raise me up.’ (Book IX, 28)

GOSPEL : MARK 13:24-32

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you, when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.'

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Our expression "to have time for someone" is a heart-warming one, because giving time to someone is a real gift of myself, part of our consciousness of being human. The opposite—lack of time—is expressed in another idiom "Money rich but time poor." To be poor in time is a great deprivation, even when self-inflicted. It is all a question of perspective, values and choices. We do need to value the fleeting time we have and not live only towards a future, as yet unreal, moment. In the words of St Paul, *Look, now is the acceptable time; look, now is the day of salvation!* (2 Corinthians 6:2)

PRAYER

Help me, eternal God, to accept your gift of the present moment. It is the only moment I will ever have, so let me inhabit it richly and fully, and celebrate your gift of life in abundance.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. Jesus speaks of the established order falling apart, but the collapse of the old order opened the way for new possibilities. When have you seen something new and hopeful emerge after the collapse of something that you had expected to endure much longer, perhaps even for ever?
2. The parable of the fig tree. Even in winter it begins to put forth leaves which give a hint of the fruit to come. Where have you found signs of hope in a wintry situation – in your own life, in the life of some group, in the life of the Church?
3. Jesus proposes no clear time-scale for the events being foretold, so the final sentence (v. 32) is a call to alertness, to live the present to the full. What different does it make to you when you are able to live the present moment to the full?

PRAYER

Your creation, O God, runs its appointed course; as far as the ends of the earth you gather a people you call your own. Confirm us in the strength of your abiding word. Steady our hearts in the time of trial, so that on the day of the Son of Man, we may without fear rejoice to behold his appearing. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

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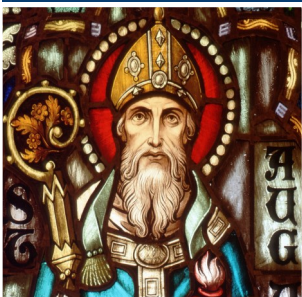

This silence, therefore, is broken every time a person in need is welcomed and embraced. The poor still have much to teach us because in a culture that has placed wealth at the forefront and often sacrifices the dignity of people on the altar of material goods, they swim against the tide, highlighting that what is essential for life is something else entirely.” **Pope Francis**
