Mission - 'Put out into deep water!'

Dear Friends,

Recent Popes have drawn on Jesus' words in today's Gospel to remind us that our lives demand much of us - ***'Put out into deep water!'*** The less able swimmers among us usually avoid deep water but it does remind us that following Jesus is about taking some risks, even if we try to stick to the shallows.

In one sense, we are already 'in deep water' – the deep water of family life with its joys and complex challenges, for example, and the deep water of being Church - challenging society's core attitudes about precious human life, especially the unborn and the vulnerable, principles of social justice so easily compromised for political ends, addressing complex moral issues, life-destroying conflicts, economic inequality, and destructive racial divisions, to name a few.

Jesus' words of invitation - *'Put out into deep water'* – inspired Pope St John Paul II in his Apostolic Letter at the beginning of the New Millennium and his Vocations Sunday Letter in 2005 to name the challenge that is both personal and ecclesial. One dimension of this invitation is ongoing discernment of our personal vocation but there is a broader picture represented by the Church's embracing of Synodality as our collective way forward.

Reflecting on Jesus' encounter in the Gospel, we notice that he was always interested in the disciples' story - *What were they doing? What had gone well? Where did they need help?* A strong theme here is Jesus' presence in moments of apparent failure. This sense of human inadequacy is evident in each of our readings: *'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost'* (Isaiah); *'I am the least of the apostles... I hardly deserve the name'* (St Paul); *'Leave me, Lord, I am a sinful man'* (St Peter).

Peter was probably surprised by Jesus' comforting response - *'Do not be afraid; from now on it is people you will catch'* – a timely reminder of the refreshing message and treasure of the Scriptures as we celebrate this **Sunday of the Word of God**, the promise of God's love and wisdom that never disappoints. Christ is alive in our lives – may we never look away!

GOSPEL: Luke 5:1

Luke 5:1 Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, 2 he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. 3 He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. 4 When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." 5 Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." 6 When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. 7 So they signalled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. 8 But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" 9 For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; 10 and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." 11 When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

Thought for the day

We tend to think of the first disciples as somehow "clergy" with a call special to them. But that is not adequate. Jesus is first of all calling disciples, that is ordinary people, including ourselves. Discipleship includes experience, learning and risk. What experiences have brought me this far? What have I learned and am I still learning? How about the call to "put out into the deep"? Is the Lord asking of me a deeper following, both costly and lifegiving? How am I responding? Is there something in me hesitating and holding back? Do I need to hear again the words, "Do not be afraid"?

Prayer

God of surprises, help us to take the risk of following Jesus on a path of discipleship costing "not less than everything." Help us to let go, that we may live the Gospel fully and richly.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. The invitation from Jesus to put out the net again, with surprising results. Have there been times when you had little hope of results, but decided to try once again and were pleasantly surprised by what happened?
2. "Put out into the deep water". When have you found that blessings, or progress, came when you had the courage to venture into unfamiliar waters, where you felt uneasy and insecure? What, or who, helped to give you that courage?
3. Simon had a profound sense of a power at work that he could not understand. When have you had a sense of the divine breaking into everyday experience?
4. The disciples "left everything and followed Jesus". This step was preceded by their experience of the concern of Jesus for them, the attraction of his work, teaching and actions. Recall the story of key decisions or turning points in your life. Who was Jesus for you in those situations?

PRAYER

Most holy God, the earth is filled with your glory and in your presence angels stand in awe. Enlarge our vision, that we may recognise your power at work in your Son and join the apostles and prophets as heralds of your saving word.

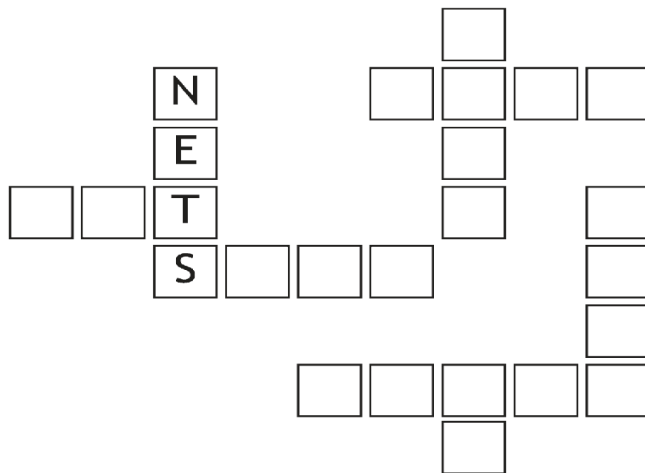
