BEATITUDES - *'Jesus Reverses Human Values!'*

Dear Friends,

By now we know well the mood of Jesus' teaching which is both beautiful, affirming and supportive, and also very disturbing and challenging. Some issues then and now become political hot potatoes and society's response often has little to do with Christian values.



This Sunday we have Luke's beatitudes, probably a good fit for today as they confront familiar issues – poverty, hunger, sadness and hatred. How are these blessed' or 'happy'? These beatitudes call for a response, a change of heart. The promise is that God, who hates to see evil in the lives of people, acts to free people by blessing them. In contrast, those who are rich, have plenty to eat, and who laugh and enjoy the affirmation of others can easily forget God and their obligation to share their blessings with others.

There are so many problems in people's lives and in society. How often have you heard people say: Why doesn't the Church do something or say something? Surprisingly, more often than not the Church does act. The annual Bishops' Social Justice Statements are documents of significance and depth and most of the recent ones are still current in their message – on migrants, refugees and asylum seekers, domestic violence, engagement with First Australians, and most recently, the promotion of peace and the need for truth in public life.

We know that the Church walks a fine line where public issues are concerned and needs to avoid adopting a party-political position. This can be problematic at times where polarisation is becoming more common on issues of race and gender, for example. While Church teaching on gender issues is clear, there will be situations in people's personal lives that require a sympathetic pastoral response.

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has released a guide on gender and identity to support Catholic schools in responding to the individual, social and pastoral needs of students - *Created and Loved: A guide for Catholic schools on identity and gender*. This document, available on the ACBC website, outlines a pastoral approach shaped by the theological, medical and legislative context in which Catholic schools operate, and will be of assistance to parents too.

This is yet another reminder that the human person is at the centre of Jesus' teaching and the Church's response.

GOSPEL: Luke 6:17-26

Jesus came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them. Then he looked up at his disciples and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets."

Thought for the day

We all know from experience that happiness can be confused with all sorts of things — enjoyment, getting my own way, pleasure etc. We also all know— in our heart of hearts—that true happiness is not something that I have for myself but something that I am with others. Rather than something I possess, it is something that I am, with my values and vision. The paradox of human life is that we attain happiness not by aiming at it for ourselves but only making other people the focus of our lives and loves. In the words of St Paul: Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. (Rom 13:8)

Prayer

God of our happiness, give us the wisdom that you alone can give so that we also may be wise and come to life in abundance, according to your will.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. We are told that Jesus "fixed his eyes on the disciples" before speaking. It suggests that he was about to say something that he really wanted them to take in. Surprisingly he then tells them it is no bad thing for us to be poor or hungry. But perhaps you have recognised the truth in what St. Augustine said "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."
2. "Blessed are you who weep" is not an encouragement to be miserable. Rather it is an affirmation of the importance of loving relationships in life. We are blessed to have such people in our lives, but there may also be pain. Yet is it not true that the blessing of loving and being loved is worth the price you pay?
3. Jesus said that his followers would be open to opposition and ridicule because of him, and they are blessed when this happens. Unpleasant it may, but have you not been grateful on those occasions when you had the courage to stand by something that you believed in?

PRAYER

O God, who alone can satisfy our deepest hungers, protect us from the lure of wealth and power; move our hearts to seek first your kingdom, that ours may be the security and joy of those who place their trust in you. We make our prayer through your Son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

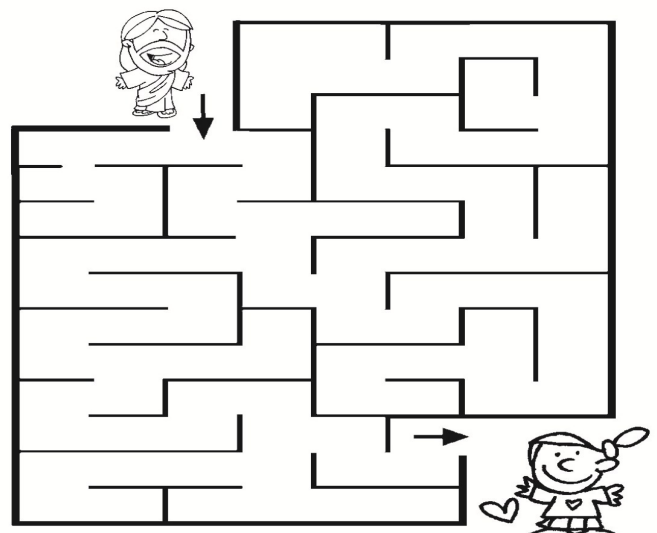
