




LENT - 'Dimensions of Fasting!'

Dear Friends,

How confronting is the sight of victims of war barely existing on the meagre supplies of food and clean water if there is any, amid the rubble of their cities. In addition, millions of others in our world suffer from starvation every day, a massive humanitarian and moral crisis.

In many respects, it all makes our efforts to fast during Lent look pretty tame and invites to take a longer look at our Lenten journey in terms of our world's needs. Certainly we need to respond to the needs of the suffering but that makes even more urgent our personal conversion as that opens our hearts to others. St Augustine loved the Gospel Parable in Matthew 25:31ff on feeding the hungry, giving a drink to the thirsty, and so on, and he penned the following reflection:

'Don't believe that fasting suffices. Fasting punishes you, but it does not restore your brother or sister! Your fasting will be fruitful if you provide for the needs of another. How many poor people could be nourished by the meal you did not take today?'

Conversion of heart is both personal and communal and Pope Francis' Lenten Message uses the context of the Jubilee Year and the motto, 'Pilgrims of Hope' to invite us to conversion:

'A first call to conversion thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life; each of us is invited to stop and ask how our lives reflect this fact.... It would be a good Lenten exercise for us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn how to sympathize with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us.... a good "examination of conscience" for all of us wayfarers.'

Fasting is essential in the Christian tradition as it reminds us of the Passion of Christ, our own spiritual poverty, and the material poverty of most of the human race. Lenten observances may feel awkward, but are never empty gestures. Consider Pope Francis' suggestions for fasting:

- · Fast from hurting words and say kind words.
- · Fast from sadness & be filled with gratitude.
- · Fast from anger & be filled with patience.
- · Fast from pessimism & be filled with hope.
- · Fast from worries & have trust with God.
- · Fast from complaints; contemplate simplicity.
- · Fast from pressures & be prayerful
- · Fast from bitterness; fill your heart with joy. · Fast from selfishness and be compassionate.
- · Fast from grudges and be reconciled
- · Fast from words; be silent and listen.

At that very time there were some present who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. 2 He asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? 3 No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. 4 Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? 5 No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did." 6 Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. 7 So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?' 8 He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. 9 If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.""

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

We are all aware of the fleeting nature of time and we all have experience of the missed opportunity, the moment of grace—however secular—overlooked. At the same time, we know that our God is the God of second chances and that it is never truly over. Like Augustine, we hear the insistent murmur, "if not now, when?" That future moment of grace will be just like this one, ordinary, nothing special, fleeting and yet it is the only moment that exists, the "now" of our everyday.

PRAYER

Patient and insistent God, knock again on the door our hearts. We are never really ready—a sign perhaps of our everyday need of you. Help us undertake again to dig around and manure, so that under your grace, we may bear fruit, fruit that will last. Amen.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

- 1. Jesus rejects the idea that personal misfortune is God's punishment for sin. Yet a serious illness or accident can serve as a wake-up call about how we live our lives. How have such experiences given you a greater appreciation of the value of your life and relationships, and of the time and opportunities at your disposal?
- 2. "I'll wait till tomorrow to do that". Have you ever said that and then found the chance is gone the next day? In the story, we are called to recognise God at work in our lives and respond to Him. NOW is the opportune moment. When have you been glad you did not put off action to the following day?
- saw yourself like the tree in the parable—useless, merely a waste of space. Think of friends who came to you at such a time, people who saw your potential and were prepared to give you another chance, people who also dug the soil around you and gave you the helps you needed to grow. Perhaps in your turn you have been able to do this for others.

PRAYER

God of salvation, we stand before you on holy ground, for your name is glorified and your mercy revealed wherever your mighty deeds are remembered. Since you are holy and forbearing, turn us from every rash and shallow judgment to seek the ways of repentance. We ask this through Christ, our deliverance and our hope, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, holy and mighty God for ever and ever. Amen.

Devotions, Explained!

The Jesus Prayer

Mini Explanation — Great for social media or in your bulletin The Jesus Prayer is a short invocation of mercy in the name of Jesus: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." Often attributed to the tradition of Eastern Christianity, its short form makes it ideal for meditative prayer.

The Jesus Prayer, Explained!

The Jesus Prayer is a short invocation of mercy in the name of Jesus: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

The exact origins of the prayer are unclear, though it is often attributed to the tradition of Eastern Christianity, possibly via the Desert Fathers (early Christian ascetics who dwelled in Egypt). The prayer has been important to the traditions of both the Eastern Orthodox and the Eastern Catholic faithful. The text echoes the words of the publican in the parable from Luke 18:9-14, whose humble manner of prayer was praised by Jesus. Its short form and simple wording make it ideal for meditative prayer.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in paragraph 2667, highlights the Jesus Prayer, saying that "by it the heart is opened to human wretchedness and the Savior's mercy."


