

Celebrating Holy Spirit Primary – 40 Great Years!

'Belong to something greater!' This theme - part of the backdrop to Catholic Education Week earlier this term - fits so well the special milestone Holy Spirit Primary celebrates on its 40th Anniversary. Having opened in 1985 under the Principalship of Sr Patricia Bolster RSM, the school has certainly encouraged its students, families, staff and the wider community to embrace the future and its identity as a Catholic school.

Our Parish Community is very proud of our schools and at this time we especially congratulate Holy Spirit Primary School and acknowledge with gratitude its service to the Church and its ministry of forming our children in the Faith and educating them for life. In 1985, its enrolment was 135, growing to over 650 in 1992. Roll call in 2025 is 330 and staff number 46.

The school motto – *Together We Grow* – embodies Holy Spirit's emphasis on community and growth reflected in the spirit among students and staff and the wider community. Parental and family support is evident too, particularly on special days and at the various assemblies held during the year.

The Augustinians are very appreciative of our school and the energy it offers the Parish. Priests and school staff seek to work together in building a strong Faith Community and collaboration is a high priority. One strong feature is the children's participation and reverence in our Masses and liturgies.



Parents of course are the first and best educators of their children and Holy Spirit Primary seeks to support families in their important task of preparing our children for life by offering a wholistic education – 'We believe that the growth of each child is fostered through an integrated process of nurturing their spiritual, social-emotional and academic development.'

We thank the School Community for being such a positive presence in our Parish and acknowledge the leadership of Principal Mrs Frances Garzaniti and school staff, and our wonderful children and their families. There is always a warm welcome at Holy Spirit!

HEARERS OF THE WORD

Yet, I know that understanding and good intentions are worthless, unless rooted in your graceful love. So I ask that the words of Scripture may also be not just signs on a page. but channels of grace into my heart. Amen. (Origen, AD c.184-c.254)

GOSPEL: LUKE 15:1-3, 11-32

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them:

'A man had two sons. The younger said to his father, "Father, let me have the share of the estate that would come to me." So the father divided the property between them. A few days later, the younger son got together everything he had and left for a distant country where he squandered his money on a life of debauchery.

'When he had spent it all, that country experienced a severe famine, and now he began to feel the pinch, so he hired himself out to one of the local inhabitants who put him on his farm to feed the pigs. And he would willingly have filled his belly with the husks the pigs were eating but no one offered him anything. Then he came to his senses and said, "How many of my father's paid servants have more food than they want, and here am I dying of hunger! I will leave this place and go to my father and say: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as one of your paid servants." So he left the place and went back to his father.

'While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was moved with pity. He ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly. Then his son said, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son." But the father said to his servants, "Quick! Bring out the best robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Bring the calf we have been fattening, and kill it; we are going to have a feast, a celebration, because this son of mine was dead and has come back to life; he was lost and is found." And they began to celebrate.

'Now the elder son was out in the fields, and on his way back, as he drew near the house, he could hear music and dancing. Calling one of the servants he asked what it was all about. "Your brother has come" replied the servant "and your father has killed the calf we had fattened because he has got him back safe and sound." He was angry then and refused to go in, and his father came out to plead with him; but he answered his father, "Look, all these years I have slaved for you and never once disobeyed your orders, yet you never offered me so much as a kid for me to celebrate with my friends. But for this son of yours, when he comes back after swallowing up your property — he and his women — you kill the calf we had been fattening."

'The father said, "My son, you are with me always and all I have is yours. But it is only right we should celebrate and rejoice, because your brother here was dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found."'

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Both sons have misconstrued the relationship with their father. The older son wants to relate on a basis of servile loyalty (allegorically, the Law). The younger son, on his return, wishes to relate on the basis of confession of sin and desires to be treated as a slave. The father rejects both projections. Servile loyalty and guilt are not unknown in the Christian tradition!

PRAYER

Abba, Father, show us your compassion and let us know your love. Amen

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

- Like many a parable, this story makes its point in what seems to be unfair: the spendthrift son is rewarded and the elder son is hurt and angry. Jesus is telling us that love is a free gift, not something we earn by our goodness. This is true of human love, and is also true of God's love. When have you experienced this truth in the love you have received from others? When has the experience of human love prompted you to reflect on God's love for you?
- After some time the younger son "came to himself" and returned home. Where and when have you experienced a homecoming after a time of exile and alienation? What helped you to come to yourself and make that journey home?
- 3. The older son resented the welcome given to the younger son after his wandering and dissolute life. This contrasts with the welcome the father gave the younger son. Perhaps you have experienced these differing attitudes in yourself. What were they like for you? Where was there life for you or for others?

PRAYER

God of compassion, you await the sinner's return and spread a feast to welcome home the lost. Save us from the temptations that lead us away from you, and draw us back by the constancy of your love, that we may take our place in your household and gladly share our inheritance with others. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Devotions, Explained!

Pilgrimage

Mini Explanation — A pilgrimage is a journey to a place of spiritual significance undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

Pilgrimage, Explained

When the time came for the Transfiguration of Christ, Jesus took three of his disciples to "a high mountain by themselves," indicating that the sacred mysteriousness of this moment was something best experienced apart from the routine of ordinary life. This is the principle behind the act of pilgrimage: a journey to a place of spiritual significance, undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

Christian pilgrimages really began in the fourth century, when churches in the Holy Land were constructed in locations associated with the life of Christ. Throughout the centuries, pilgrims have likewise flocked to sites of Marian apparitions, miracles, and to places connected with the lives of saints. Some of the most iconic pilgrimage destinations include Fatima, Lourdes, and the Santiago de Compostela in Spain.


