LENT - 'When We Need a Word from God!'

Dear Friends,

In 1988, during a renewal program in Dublin, a Redemptorist leading a retreat commented one day, 'Somewhere today there is a word from God for you.' He didn't specify what, when or where, but occasionally I'm aware of a *prophetic* word or saying which is just what I need at the time.

What insight has moved you this Lent – perhaps a word or phrase from the Lenten discussions, a homily, a friend or workmate's conversation? Wisdom cannot be contained. I am moved by St Paul's words last Sunday in 2 Corinthians about those who are 'in Christ' - what a remarkable statement about 'identity', yours and mine.

Family life is about that - our 'identity' in the family, belonging, bonding, faithful to each other, our family name and background. How might this help us understand last Sunday's parable of the Lost sons and the dysfunctional nature of that family?

Gazing at Rembrandt's striking painting -The Return of the Prodigal Son - spiritual writer Henri Nouwen reflects: 'The more I gazed at the painting, it became, somehow, the heart of the story that God wants to tell me and the heart of the story that I want to tell God and God's people. All of the Gospel is there. All of my life is there. All of the lives of every beloved sinner are there.'

This parable has shaped our Christian *identity* - without it, Christianity would be something very different. Today's encounter between Jesus and the sinful woman too is a vivid illustration of how Jesus lives the Gospel he preaches and exemplifies the extraordinary love of his Father who 'welcomes sinners', even 'kissing them tenderly'.

Somewhere here there must be a 'word from God' - to strengthen and support, offer insight and hope in the face of human weakness and failure. Might today's Scriptures offer that 'word'? St Augustine counsels us, 'Love the sinner, hate the sin?

Today's Gospel story raises the question, 'How well do we know Jesus?' When we are in difficulties or feeling slighted or treated unjustly, what image of Jesus comes to mind? Is it the Jesus who helps this woman feel safe - the tender Jesus, the human Jesus who is at home with the weak, the Jesus who always does things differently from us?

Interestingly, there is evidence of change in the hearts of the woman's accusers as they dropped their stones, but no protestation of the woman's repentance. Perhaps she did repent. At the very least, Jesus challenges her to a new life free from this sin.

Thankfully, we remain blessed with a God who doesn't force his will upon us at any time. Human freedom is awesome and we must use it well and be prepared to start over when we need to - and of remember to say course 'Sorry!"


HEARERS OF THE WORD

GOSPEL: JOHN 7:53-8:11

[Then each of them went home, 1 while Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. 2 Early in the morning he came again to the temple. All the people came to him and he sat down and began to teach them. 3 The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery; and making her stand before all of them, 4 they said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. 5 Now in the law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" 6 They said this to test him, so that they might have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground. 7 When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." 8 And once again he bent down and wrote on the ground. 9 When they heard it, they went away, one by one, beginning with the elders; and Jesus was left alone with the woman standing before him. 10 Jesus straightened up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" 11 She said, "No one, sir." And Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go your way, and from now on do not sin again."]


POINTERS FOR PRAYER

- 1. Compassion for human frailty combined with a gentle challenge to a better life marked the response of Jesus. From whom have you experienced a compassionate challenge? What was that like for you? To whom have you given such a challenge?
- 2. The Pharisees and scribes self-righteously condemned the woman until Jesus brought them in touch with their own sinfulness. This was a conversion moment for them and they turned away from their quest for the death of the woman. Have there been times when your awareness of your own fragility and sinfulness has helped you to be less judgemental of others?
- 3. "What do you say?" can be an embarrassing question. Jesus had the courage to voice an opinion, even though it was against the party line of the day. When you have seen that courage shown by yourself, or by another? What was the result?

PRAYER

God of power, God of mercy, you bring forth springs in the wasteland and turn despair into hope. Look not upon the sins of our past, but lift from our hearts the failures that weigh us down, that we may find refreshment and life in Christ, our liberator from sin, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, mighty and strong, for ever and ever. Amen.

Mini Explained

The daily examen is a spiritual practice whereby one places himself in the presence of God, prayerfully reflecting on the blessings of the day, the actions he took, and the invitation God has for his future decisions.

Daily Examen, Explained

The daily examen is a spiritual practice derived from the writings of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus. A Basque nobleman, Ignatius underwent a series of religious conversions as a young man following a wound sustained in the Battle of Pamplona in 1521. His *Spiritual Exercises* were first published in 1548 and form the basis of what is known today as "Ignatian spirituality."

Many different versions of the examen have been developed over the centuries, but all are centered on the same five elements which themselves reflect Ignatius' process of self-review and spiritual discernment.

In completing the daily examen, an individual places himself in the presence of God, prayerfully reflecting on the blessings of the day, the actions he took, and the invitation God has for his future decisions.


