EASTER FAITH - 'Follow Me!'

Dear Friends.

During an election campaign, our thoughts invariably turn to leadership and who we believe should lead our country. Candidates and parties promote themselves and their policies that promise a better world for all. At times, humility is in short supply and campaigns easily become bogged down in peripheral issues that distract from people's genuine concerns. Being a leader is a challenge and we come to realise that few of us can take on responsibilities automatically and do them well.

Leadership in the Church is on our minds too as the Cardinals prepare to elect a new Pope – an awesome task. Important as this choice is, the future of the Church does not depend on one man. Pope Francis was very honest about his own weaknesses and failures but he persevered in his role and did what he could. Already, some in the media, and in the Church too, are critiquing his successes and failures – yet we have been blessed with an amazing leader and teacher. Just look at his remarkable documents - The Joy of the Gospel, The Joy of Love: Love in the Family, Care for Our Common Home (Laudato Si), Christ Lives (addressed to young people) – to name a few.

The Scriptures last Sunday and today are about Jesus' commissioning leaders – the frightened disciples in the upper room, Peter among them and later Thomas, and today the disciples fishing in the lake, perhaps a sign that, not yet convinced of Jesus' Resurrection, they had returned to their old occupation as fishermen and were having a bad night of it!

For some strange reason, they took the advice of the stranger on the shore to try another location – finally experiencing success! Who is this man? Even amidst their doubts, they recognised their Risen Lord. John, the beloved disciple, first recognised Jesus from the boat and prompted Peter – 'It is the Lord!'

I love the familiarity of Jesus' invitation, 'Come and have breakfast!' The disciples knew it was Jesus. After breakfast Jesus asked Peter, 'Do you love me?' – 3 times at that. Typically, Peter reacted but Jesus affirmed him in his leadership role, 'Feed my sheep.' How will Peter do this? By responding generously to Jesus' invitation, 'Follow me!'

At different times and in diverse ways, you and I do just that. We follow Jesus in family life as we model faith, in the community by our Christian example, in our occupations as we work in diverse ways for the common good, as children learning about life and growing into faith, as those ageing who share wisdom and pass on the gift of the Christ life... the list goes on but the invitation of Jesus to 'Follow me!' is for every situation and generation.



Pope Francis modelled this ideal throughout his life in the face of many challenges and we pray that his successor will do likewise. Indeed, each of us is called by the Risen Jesus in our daily lives – 'Follow me!' As we respond, we too will know – 'It is the Lord!'

GOSPEL: JOHN 21:1-19

John 21:1 After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. 2 Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. 3 Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. 4 Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. 5 Jesus said to them, "Children, you have no fish, have you?" They answered him, "No." 6 He said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. 7 That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the sea. 8 But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.9 When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. 10 Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." 11 So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. 12 Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they knew it was the Lord. 13 Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. 14 This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead. 15 When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." 16 A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." 17 He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. 18 Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will

stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go." 19 (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this, he said to him, "Follow me."

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

In our ordinary world, words such as compassion, forgiveness and reconciliation convey an essential, if difficult and at the same time joyful, human task. In our world of faith, we add other words, such as mercy and grace, which make us conscious of the free gift, unalloyed, with no conditions attached. Our role is not to "retain the sins of any" precisely so that they may know, at our hands, true forgiveness. In our Gospel, Peter is not reproached; rather he is set free. That is love, the only commandment.

PRAYER

Lord Jesus, help us all to hear your invitation, "Do you love me?" and set our hearts free to practice forgiveness.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

- The disciples spend a fruitless night fishing and catching nothing. Things change dramatically when Jesus appears and invites them to try again. Remember those who came to you and encouraged you to try again when you felt discouraged. Perhaps on some of these occasions the results were beyond your expectations.
- The story can serve as a reminder that sometimes we are wasting our time if we try to work on our own without the Lord's help. When have you found that your work or life was more fruitful when you acknowledged that you needed God's help and you spoke to God about your need?
- 3. Peter is given the chance to be fully reconciled with his Master after his denial during the Passion. Remember those who have given you an opportunity for reconciliation after you had hurt them or let them down. What was it like for you to be given this chance? To whom have you offered the possibility of reconciliation?

PRAYER

God of life, in your risen Son, you reveal your abiding presence among us, and summon those reborn in baptism to lives of worship and service. Fill this assembly with reverence as we come before you in prayer. Grant us courage and zeal in bearing witness before the world to your Son, Jesus Christ, the first-born from the dead, for ever and ever. Amen.


The New Baptismal Font

Have you seen the new Baptismal Font and wondered about its design? Just like the Sanctuary furniture, the Baptismal Font has been designed to symbolically represent the enfolding arms of Jesus. When you look at the stand you will see the arms enfolding the Font symbolically representing the arms of Jesus enfolding those being baptised. he Presider's Chair, Altar, Lectern and Paschal



Candle stand also symbolically display this symbol of the curved arms of Jesus' enfolding and reaching out to touch us. Next time you are at Mass take a look! Hopefully, this symbol will help you to reflect on how Jesus arms reach out and enfold you!
