

Dear Brothers and Friends

In support of the letter addressed to the Order and international Augustinian Family from our Prior General Fr Alejandro Moral Anton OSA and in union with the Universal Church and the global community, the Augustinians of the Province of Our Mother of Good Counsel, Australasia celebrate with gratitude and joy that in the election of Pope Leo XIV, a Pope has been chosen that will serve the good of all with compassion, wisdom and love. The election of a Pope who will serve with goodness is the outcome we have all been praying for in these recent days.

As an Augustinian family, with humility, we rejoice that our brother Cardinal Robert Prevost OSA has been called to this role of servant leadership in which he is called to be Pope for all.

Many of us have known the new Pope personally and have experienced his leadership when he served as Prior General of the Augustinians (2001-2013). During that time he visited all our communities and ministries in Australia and Korea. Of special significance was that he was the Prior General who initially encouraged our Province to work towards the foundation of the Order in Vietnam.

Robert Prevost was born in Chicago in 1955. After his schooling at an Augustinian high school/seminary in the United States , he professed vows in the Order in 1978, was ordained to the priesthood in Rome in 1982 where he was undertaking higher studies in Canon Law, missionary work in the OSA American mission in Chlucanas, Peru, Provincial of the Midwest (USA) Province , Prior General of the Order (2001-2013), Bishop of Chiclayo, Peru, Head of the Dicastery of Bishops in Rome and made Cardinal in 2023.

Pope Leo XIV when he served our Order as Fr Robert Prevost OSA (Prior General) loved and served all of us well. He will now do the same for the Universal Church. In his first address Pope Leo XIV pleaded for peace and referred to the words of Augustine that while a Bishop for us, he is first a Christian with us. The values of communion in human relationships and profound interiority in our relationship with God are deeply embedded in the heart of Pope Leo XIV.

I commend Pope Leo XIV to the prayers of each of you.



EASTER JOY - 'Grace of the Good Shepherd - Pope Leo XIV'

Dear Friends,

As I write this reflection, we rejoice in the election of Augustinian Cardinal Robert Prevost as Pope Leo XIV. A letter from Provincial Fr Peter Jones is printed on the front of this bulletin and there will be further communication about the Holy Father next Sunday.

As Prior General, then Fr Robert celebrated Mass at St Clair in 2005 and last year parishioners attending the International Lay Congress met up with him in Rome. His election just before the 4th Sunday of Easter -Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for **Vocations** – is very fitting. This Sunday is also special, coinciding with Mother's Day.

Recently, a fellow priest described the Blessed Mother as a 'good Mum'! We all have our preferred personal titles for Mary but this one was new to me - so appropriate, intimate and fitting. 'Good' is a small but powerful word that also describes Jesus as the Shepherd. We recall Pope Francis as a 'Good Pope' and a 'Good Shepherd' - imagery he used to describe his ideal for bishops who 'smell of the sheep' - part of his 'earthy ecclesiology', the Church that evangelises in its pastoral mission. I'm sure Pope Leo will be a Good Shepherd too.

We affirm the role of women in our lives and in our world and recall the Easter appearances of the Risen Jesus and the women disciples who witnessed the appearances of Jesus after his death and told the news to the apostles - they are 'the apostles to the apostles'!

In our world, the pivotal role of mothers remains undisputed, their special nurturing qualities, their place in passing on the Faith and, with fathers, encouraging sons and daughters and grandchildren

too to find their way in the world and follow the call in their hearts.

Today we are asked to pray to God that he 'send more workers into the harvest,' including religious and priestly vocations. Let's remember that prayer changes us and very little will happen unless families cultivate faith and positively encourage members to embrace a religious vocation. Mums and Dads are good at that but in our time some are reticent in raising the subject.

Mothers are invariably models of faithfulness and perseverance, serving the family and understanding the unique, personal gifts and hopes of each child. Pope Francis offers the maternal faith of Mary Mother of Jesus as our inspiration:

> 'Mary's gaze reminds us that faith demands a tenderness that can save us from lukewarm. Tenderness: the becoming Church of tenderness.... When faith makes a place for the Mother of God, we never lose sight of the centre: the Lord, for Mary never points to herself but to Jesus; and our brothers and sisters, for Mary is mother.

We honour our mothers, living and deceased, and affirm the remarkable call of motherhood and the ways in which each of us has been given life and formed in the likeness of God through the love of parents and the unique role of our mothers. Let us pray that each of us will continue to pray and listen to our personal call.

GOSPEL: JOHN 10:22

At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, 23 and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. 24 So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." 25 Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; 26 but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep.

27 My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. 28 I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. 29 What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. 30 The Father and I are one."

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

The cultural dismissal of faith as illusory consolation or opium has left its mark on us all. Is it all projection? Has God truly spoken and revealed God's self? In Christian faith, our response is a resounding yes and, while we should be wary of facile solace, at the same time we should not deny ourselves the good and wholesome reassurance of faith. After all, one of the most repeated phrases throughout the Bible is "Do not the afraid" (though not in John, curiously). There are grounds for fear; but we, of all people, should not be overwhelmed by the negative.

PRAYER

Lord Jesus, risen from the dead, guide us to listen deeply to your voice, your word, that we may know you and, that knowing you, we may enjoy life in abundance, now and into eternity with you. Amen

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

- Jesus tells us that we can rely on his relationship with us. Think of the relationships you have in which you feel safe and secure because there is mutual understanding and the relationship has stood the test of time.
- 2. Jesus says that the disciple is one who listens. What is your experience of listening to the word of God in the Scriptures? To what other voices have you listened and found guidance?
- 3. The faithful disciple is also one who follows the path of love that Jesus preached and practiced. Although it may be difficult at times, it is in following it we find life. Where have you had the Oexperience of listening, responding, loving, and finding life?

PRAYER

Safe in your hand, O God, is the flock you shepherd through Jesus your Son. Lead us always to the living waters where you promise respite and refreshment, that we may be counted among those who know and follow you. We ask this through Jesus Christ, the resurrection and the life, who lies and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit God for ever and ever. Amen.
