EASTER FAITH - 'Bishop and Christian - Pope Leo XIV!'

Dear Friends,

As a child growing up, one of the anchors that offered stability and certainty in life was that the teaching of the Church does not change. Popes wrote beautiful encyclicals to assist us appreciate the richness of our Faith, some of them beyond the understanding of the ordinary person. Yet classic teaching like <u>Rerum Novarum</u> (Rights and Duties of Capital and Labor) by Pope Leo XIII in 1891 is a foundational text in Catholic Social Teaching. <u>Pacem in Terris</u> (Peace on Earth) by John XXIII in 1963 emphasized human dignity and equality and the need for world peace.

Our recent Popes have continued to 'break open' Church teaching so that it touches the daily lives of people like us and we have come to expect this 'official nourishment' of our spirit. Pope Francis was quite unique in this regard, particularly in Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel) in 2013 and Amoris Laetitia (The Joy of Love – Love in the Family) in 2016 which expanded our understanding of our Faith and the Church.


Already Pope Leo XIV has embraced this vision of the Joy of the Gospel, by which we can encourage each other to hear the voice of the Lord and to follow it in the service of the Church as we live out our various vocations. He encourages us: 'All of us must search together.... We have to know how to listen - not to judge, not to shut doors as if we hold all the truth and no one else has anything to offer.'

In his opening address to those gathered in St Peter's Square, his Augustinian background was manifest as he quoted St Augustine in <u>Sermon 340</u>: 'For you I am a bishop, with you I am a Christian!' — a classic statement that expresses his readiness to serve in his role of bishop as well as his belonging to God's people and his preparedness to walk with us as members of the Body of Christ - especially true of an Augustinian committed to community, friendship and humility.

Pope Leo has visited Australia on several occasions – in 2002 when he attended the Provincial Chapter in Brisbane, in 2005 when he visited all the Province ministries, including St Clair, and in 2008 for World Youth Day and the Augustinian Youth Encounter at Collaroy where he presided at Eucharist on the beach (see photo below).

How blessed we are in our new Holy Father and our experience of his humility, humour, Gospel joy and compassionate listening.

Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Diocese of Parramatta,

14 May 2025

I am writing to you all to let you know that I have convened a conference to be held for all our clergy (both priests and deacons) on the Central Coast commencing on the evening of Tuesday 20 May 2025 and concluding on Friday 23 May 2025 in the morning.

The last time that the clergy of the Diocese held a residential conference was in May 2016 before I was installed as the 4th Bishop of Parramatta. Thus, it has almost been ten years since the clergy have had an opportunity to be together for any meaningful time.

Much has happened since I came to the Diocese, not least being our Diocesan Synod and our new Pastoral Plan that emerged from the Synod. The clergy of the Diocese need time to be together to assist the building up of their fraternal relationships, and for some much-needed input on topics that are very relevant to parish clergy ministering in the context of our current world.

That means that for three days the normal liturgical schedules in our parishes will be disrupted. However, with the assistance of some retired priests and some priests from religious congregations Mass will be available at six major churches in the Diocese for those who wish to attend daily Mass from Wed 21 May – 23 May 2025.

- St Nicholas of Myra Penrith on Wednesday 21 May to Friday 23 May at 9:30am.
- St Patrick's Blacktown on Wednesday 21 May to Friday 23 May at 9:00am.
- Our Lady Queen of Peace Greystanes on Wednesday 21 May to Friday 23 May at 9:15am.
- St Patrick's Cathedral Parramatta on Wednesday 21 May to Friday 23 May at 12:30pm.
- St Michael's Baulkham Hills on Wednesday 21 May to Friday 23 May at 9:15am.
- St Thomas Aguinas Springwood on Wednesday 21 May to Friday 23 May at 9:30am.

I would encourage those who normally attend daily Mass and cannot access one of the proposed centres where Mass will be celebrated to still gather in the parish church and pray especially for the clergy of the Diocese during their time away.


