Dear Friends,

The World Day of Migrants and Refugees, instituted in 1914 by Pope Pius X, is celebrated annually and we seek to meet the challenge of Pope Leo's Message for the 111th World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2025 around the theme: 'Migrants, Missionaries of Hope'. Each year on this day, the Church reminds us of our obligations in justice and love to look out for those who flee oppressive regimes.


Most of us are from migrant and refugee stock and for that diversity, we give thanks. However, there is unease in our country and across the world about the impact of immigration to the extent that, for some it is a divisive issue. Nations must of course manage their migrant intakes but always in a generous and humane spirit, especially towards those being trafficked or fleeing, not only when there is a shortage of skilled workers.

In Australia, a country built on migrants and refugees, our Church continues to be enriched culturally and spiritually by the diverse backgrounds of 'those who come across the seas'. Pope Leo reminds us that, '...the search for happiness, and the prospect of finding it beyond one's place of origin, is certainly one of the main motivations for the movement of people today' and he continues:

'This link between migration and hope is clearly evident in many contemporary experiences of migration. Many migrants, refugees and displaced persons are privileged witnesses of hope. Indeed, they demonstrate this daily through their resilience and trust in God, as they face adversity while seeking a future in which they glimpse that integral human development and happiness are possible.'

Among the world's challenges, he notes the prospect of a renewed arms race, the development of new armaments and nuclear weapons, the harmful effects of the ongoing climate crisis, and the impact of profound economic inequalities. As Christians, we need to take the broad view of God's plan for humanity and the rest of creation and cultivate growing desire in people's hearts for a future of peace and of respect for the dignity of all.

Even prior to becoming Pope, the Holy Father made it clear that 'Jesus doesn't ask us to rank our love for others' – love is universal and we must act with love and justice towards migrants and refugees. Today, he prays that, '...there be a growing desire in people's hearts for a future of peace and of respect for the dignity of all. Such a future is essential to God's plan for humanity and the rest of creation.'

## They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them

### Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

19 [Jesus said:] "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. 20 And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, 21 who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. 22 The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. 23 In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. 24 He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames.' 25 But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. 26 Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us.' 27 He said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house — 28 for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' 29 Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' 30 He said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' 31 He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.'"

### THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Irony and sarcasm somewhat resemble each other, with some notable differences. Sarcasm, easily enough achieved, is often wounding. On the other hand, irony, using "cognitive dissonance", prompts insight and triggers memories. There is a good example in today's

Gospel: "if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent." Will they really? By the time of writing, Jesus himself had already risen—and still conversion was as remote as ever. With all our convictions and doctrines, what is holding us back?

### POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. The first of the faults attributed to the rich man is his insensitivity to the abject poverty of those around him. When have you discovered that it is when you are aware of the needs of those around you and seek to make some response that you bring out the best in yourself?
2. The second fault attributed to the rich man is the way he ignored the word of God coming through Moses and the prophets. How have the gospels, the scriptures or your faith opened you up to a deeper and more satisfying perspective on life?
3. Some people look to the spectacular for a sign of God's presence and action. For Jesus, the lessons we need are not to be sought in the spectacular, but in the ordinary things of everyday life. Where have you found sacraments of God's presence in the world around you?

### PRAYER

God of all life, you have given us the greatest assurance of your love in raising Jesus from death. Help us to live every day from your reassuring love.






