The Christian Life – ‘Born into a Holy Family!’

Dear Friends,

During Advent, we listened to the prophecies of Jesus’ birth and key events - Mary’s invitation to become the Mother of God and her response, Joseph’s struggle to come to terms with the situation. Having celebrated Jesus’ birth, we now honour this Holy Family.

Faith related or not, Christmas celebrations invariably focus on family life, with its many joys, highpoints and challenges – God’s grace is at work wherever love is found. We are very mindful of families struggling at this time, especially those impacted by the tragedy at Bondi – the Jewish Community and wider Australian Society who share this pain – and we embrace them in love and prayer. We pray too for those who struggle with the flaws and the brokenness in families.

We need to work at family life. Pope Francis’ 2016 Apostolic Exhortation – *Amoris Laetitia – The Joy of Love: On Love in the Family* – expresses the beauty of Jesus’ teaching on Love and the Church’s teaching on married and family love. The foundation of all love is God’s love for us and his ultimate, loving embrace of us in the birth of Jesus as one with us, Jesus who himself was formed in the family by Mary and Joseph.

The Holy Family models family life for us, but we must take care not to de-power their human example by surrounding them with an aura of unreality. In every family, people’s lives bump against each other as they grow through different ages and stages - true of Jesus as he moved into adolescence and adulthood and grew in his awareness of who he was and his mission from his Father.

In *Amoris Laetitia*, Francis shares frank common sense about family and relationships:

The strength of the family ‘lies in its capacity to love and to teach how to love. For all a family’s problems, it can always grow, beginning with love.’ (n 53)

The Church is a family of families, constantly enriched by the lives of all those domestic churches. “In virtue of the sacrament of matrimony, every family becomes, in effect, a good for the Church. The Church is good for the family, and family is good for the Church. (n 87)

The Lord’s presence dwells in real and concrete families, with all their daily troubles and struggles, joys and hopes. (n 315)

Jesus’ call to ‘Love your neighbour as yourself!’ is his call to families – that’s where love starts. Family life and love demand the best from us. Family holds us to the best dreams of our youth - the friends who challenge and stretch us to the limit of our ability and beyond so no gift is lost. In our family, we are God’s gift bearers and we must remember that, no matter what age we are - old, young or in the middle - we still have gifts to share.

Yet, I know that understanding and good intentions are worthless, unless rooted in your graceful love. "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you"

Matthew 2:13-23

Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." 14 Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, 15 and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, "Out of Egypt I have called my son."

2:16 When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the wise men. 17 Then was fulfilled what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah:

18 "A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they are no more."

19 When Herod died, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, 20 "Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead." 21 Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. 22 But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And after being warned in a dream, he went away to the district of Galilee.

23 There he made his home in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, "He will be called a Nazorean."



THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Our Gospel today omits—understandably?—the brutal massacre of the innocents. While the story is indeed brutal, it is unfortunately not unrealistic. Its omission is a pity because the tragic side of life is underscored, in different ways, by both Matthew and Luke, in anticipation of the passion. They were not composing sweet scenes for Christmas cards! On the contrary, they were addressing the full human condition, in its mystery, its joys and its tragedies. It is precisely within the family that we encounter death, life, happiness and the sheer wonder of being at all. Today's feast invites us to look unflinchingly at the whole picture, in all its complexity.

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. The threat to the child Jesus put Joseph in a situation where he had to make a quick and yet wise decision. Perhaps you have also had to make a speedy response to an unexpected crisis. Who were the 'angels' who guided you to wise decisions? Remember them and give thanks.
2. The whole narrative is designed to bring out the guidance of God's providence for the child Jesus. Have there been times when you have been grateful that things worked out well for you despite adverse circumstances or experiences?
3. External forces forced migration on Joseph and his family, until he came to establish a home in Nazareth. Where have you lived before coming to the place you now call home? How has this journey helped to fashion the person you are now? Perhaps you have a mixture of gratitude and regrets as you look back. Give thanks for the good memories. What helps you to deal with the disappointments and hurts in the past? Bring them to God with a prayer for further healing.
4. The story and today's feast remind us of the importance of the family in nourishing and fostering new life. Recall and give thanks for those in your own childhood who helped you to find your way in life.

PRAYER

God, bless us all as members of our different families. As we thank you for the gift we are to each other, we ask your guidance and grace in all we do. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.




