Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate ***Gaudete Sunday*** and light the rose-coloured candle in our Advent wreath. Latin for ‘*Rejoice*’, ***Gaudete*** reminds us of the foundation of the Christian journey, the joy that must be evident in the Church. Joy is not the same as happiness, though they do sit well together, but we know that, even when happiness escapes us, we can experience an underlying sense of Joy.

While our personal, spiritual journey is important, it is not simply a call to focus on ourselves, but rather to grow in our awareness of our identity as Church and our responsibilities towards our neighbour. This year, on 7 December, marks the 60th anniversary of the promulgation of *Gaudium et Spes*, the Vatican II document on the Church in the Modern World – a unique ‘pastoral constitution’, not just addressed to Catholics but to all people in the world with the message: ***God is at work in everyone!***

Every one of us is called to ‘*read the signs of the times*’ – to recognise God’s presence and action today. In a recent Jubilee Audience, Pope Leo shared a powerful message:

‘God is not outside the world, outside this life: we have learned from the first coming of Jesus, God-with-us, to seek Him in the realities of life.... To seek Him with intelligence, with the heart and with our sleeves rolled up!’

Pope Leo himself is a living example of this commitment in his own life, especially as a Bishop in Peru where he worked in solidarity with his people when they experienced natural disasters. Waiting around with our hands in our pockets is futile, he says.

Our preparation for Christmas is always our opportunity to engage with the divine plan in which God himself defines who we are as he sends his son Jesus to fully share our human condition and challenge us to embrace our humanness, created as we are in the image and the likeness of God himself.

Many of us carry the burdens of illness, grief and personal loss, fear and anxiety, family disruption, and financial worries too, but our hope is that each of us and our families can grasp the freedom that Jesus offers us at Christmas. As Church, we wait together, companions in prayer across the cultures of the world. Amid the commercial and cultural scream of ‘Christmas!’ we Christians attend to the Advent call to a time of stillness and waiting, silence and reflection.

Gaudete! Rejoice! Let’s trust this gift of Joy that the Lord shares with us!

Gospel: Matthew 11:2-11

2 When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples 3 and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" 4 Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: 5 the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. 6 And blessed is anyone who takes no offence at me."

7 As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? 8 What then did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. 9 What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. 10 This is the one about whom it is written,

'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.'

11 Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Joy in believing might seem an "extra" in today's challenging climate for faith. Many of us struggle simply to hold on, not to mention being exuberant about it all. And yet, of course there is deep happiness in faith. First of all, everything around is a gift and behind all the gifts stands a giver. Secondly, love is at the heart of it all and, in the faith, nothing is ever "lost" or "wasted." Faith, hope and love endure and the greatest of these is love. Finally, why not "permit" ourselves true joy in all that God has done for us and still does for us in Jesus and in the Holy Spirit?

POINTERS FOR PRAYER

1. In response to the question of John, Jesus let his actions speak for him. Some people show by the way they live what it means to be a follower of Jesus. Who has given you such an example? Perhaps there have been times when you have done the same for others.
2. John made a journey of faith from an incomplete knowledge of Jesus to a deeper understanding of who he was. Recall similar steps in your journey of faith.
3. Faith is not primarily about answering abstract theological questions but about living the gospel. What in your life has helped you to get that sense of perspective?
4. John marked the end of an era, Jesus the beginning of a new one. In our lives how do we honour the past and yet be free to move on into a new era?




