The Power of Tears – ‘When even Jesus weeps...’

Dear Friends,

World events can heighten our sense of common humanity. Even as we celebrated *Laetare Sunday* a week ago – called to *Rejoice* – an underlying mood of sombre reality was not far away as the brutal harshness of war in the Middle East continues to rage, along with the conflicts in Ukraine and other places temporarily out of mind. Peaceful countries that many of us know well – if only for having passed through their airports or in some cases having family members living there – are being scarred as we speak.

At times, the words of the Scriptures leap off the page, their meaning sharpened both by our own circumstances and the often worse plight of others as individuals and whole communities. Today’s psalm 129, the *De profundis* – ‘*Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord, Lord, hear my voice!*’ - may move us to tears, yet we are reassured of God’s intimacy in the response – ‘*With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.*’

On our personal Lenten journey, there is a great opportunity for refreshment of faith in our families and communities, embracing Lenten penance, perhaps through attentive assistance to others. Reflection on today’s Gospel may be a good place to begin – Jesus’ visit to the family he loved, a family we’ve met before – the too busy Martha and the prayerful Mary as they deal with the death of their brother Lazarus.

This is a story we know as Jesus feels acutely the grief of Martha and Mary. We gain fresh insight into these sisters: as expected, Martha goes to meet Jesus but here we see the woman of faith, the woman who needs to talk about her loss. Mary stays inside, needing her own space.

This is Jesus at his most human, overwhelmed at Lazarus’ death. The words in John 11:35 describe a classic and powerful moment - ‘*Jesus began to weep*’ – and we discover something very special about the kind of God we have. St Augustine has this to say, ‘*Jesus wept for us; he wept to teach us to weep, to weep for our own failings, and also for the way in which sin is still active in the world.*’ And so Jesus, having reassured Martha that he is the resurrection and the life, calls his friend Lazarus forth from the grave!

In both the *Gospel* and first reading from *Ezekiel*, there is a promise to bring people forth from their graves but this is about much more than physical death. For us, each day is full of living and dying. When Ezekiel speaks of God opening our graves, one dimension is about drawing us back from the things that separate us from God... personal setbacks, disappointments, family

misunderstandings, fatigue, loss of motivation and self-esteem – those aspects of ourselves that we bury.

Yes, each of us knows this so well - each has his/her own ‘graves’ but Jesus offers comfort too - ‘*Jesus began to weep!*’

“I am the resurrection and the life” ***Do you believe this?***

Gospel: JOHN 11:1-45

John 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33-45 (shorter version)

The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that, even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life, if anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?'

'Yes Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.' Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him 'Lord by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:

'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer.

I knew indeed that you always hear me.

But I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.'

Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.

Thought for the Day

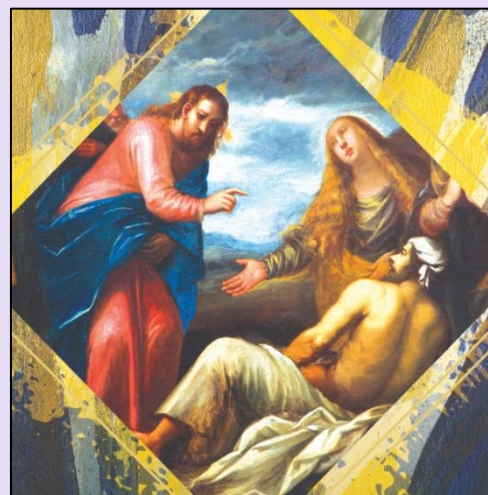
The historical Jesus was guarded in declaring his identity but by the time the Fourth Gospel was written, Christians had arrived at a rich understanding of the mystery of Jesus, the Son of God. John's Gospel puts before the believer a grand assemblage of 7 I AM sentences, rooted in the name of God in Exodus 3:14, I AM WHO I AM. I am the bread of life. (John 6:35, 48, 51); I am the light of the world (John 8:12; 9:5); I am the gate for the sheep (John 10:7, 9); I am the good shepherd (John 10:11, 14); I am the resurrection and the life (John 11:25); I am the way, and the truth, and the life (John 14:6); I am the true vine (John 15:1, 5). We are reminded that we believe first of all in a person, not in a philosophy. Anyone one of these images would take us deeply into our encounter with the Risen Lord, none more so than "I am the resurrection and the life."

Pointers for Prayer

1. Martha and Mary are portrayed as people of faith but Jesus led them to an even deeper faith. Who were the people who led you to a deeper faith in Jesus? Remember them and give thanks.
2. Martha and Mary were struggling to come to terms with their bereavement. What has helped you in similar situations?
3. The concern of Jesus is palpable and touching. Recall those who matter to you and to whom you matter. Such love mediates God's love, which surpasses human love with the gift of new life and Easter joy.
4. One can imagine Lazarus as a symbol of people and groups that are written off as dead (sometimes by themselves), and yet through faith come back to life again. Have you had the experience of being revived by faith? Has faith helped to free you from what held you in bondage, or was destructive of your life?

Prayer

Jesus, present to us always, you wept at the tomb of your friend Lazarus. As we face the mystery of death, our own and that of those we love, help us to place our trust in you, the resurrection and the life. Amen.

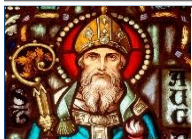

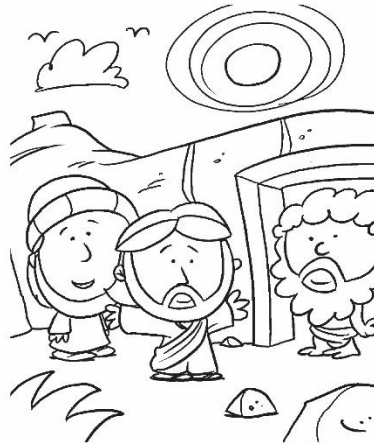
