## PASSION SUNDAY – ‘We are saved by Christ!’

Dear Friends,

There is a certain irony in Matthew’s Gospel where the Passion follows immediately after Jesus’ teaching about recognizing him in our neighbour and how love of neighbour will be the primary criterion by which we will be judged: *I was hungry and you gave me food, thirsty and you gave me something to drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me* (Mt 25:34-46).

The Passion of Jesus is the antithesis of this teaching as Jesus is betrayed by those close to him, taken prisoner and tortured, denied, and condemned to an ignominious death by crucifixion. Matthew provides a vivid, almost eye-witness account that would normally challenge our experience of reality if not for the tragic conflicts in our world at this time that confront our sense of goodness and justice, and Jesus’ prophetic call to love.

Thankfully, the Death and Resurrection of Jesus are events that change how we see our world, ourselves and each other. More than ever, we need to keep this dream alive, particularly as we celebrate the fulfillment of this promise. Easter reminds us of our Baptism as we renew our baptismal promises – the biggest sacrament, the sacrament of our identity – our call to mission.

The Stations of the Cross have already awakened in us a strong sense of how life in our world is one of mixed experiences – joy and sadness, gift and loss, grace and pain. In Holy Week we enter more deeply into the mystery of our redemption, particularly during the Paschal Triduum – one, continuous liturgy – ‘*One Feast*’ – the heart of the liturgical year.

On Good Friday, we will listen again to the Passion, this time from John’s Gospel. Scripture scholar Fr John Reilly SJ points out the significantly different mood from the Synoptic Gospels – Jesus sees his passion as a lifting up into the Father’s glory, the ‘hour’ of his glorification beginning with his betrayal by Judas (Praying John p 209). Jesus remains in control, engaging with his enemies, and is portrayed as a king. Questioned by Pilate, Jesus speaks of a kingdom, his kingdom (Jn 18:36).

As followers of Christ, we take the journey of Holy Week together – touched by the events of Jesus’ life and the graphic experiences of dying and rising in our lives, and the more ordinary ways in which we die and rise each day – all of this in anticipation of our celebration of the holiest day of the year - Jesus risen from the dead.

Indeed, both the Divine Story and our story are about *Life, Death and Resurrection* – all three!

## This is the King of the Jews

### Gospel: Matthew 26:14-27: 66

As they went out, they came upon a man from Cyrene named Simon; they compelled this man to carry his cross. 33 And when they came to a place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull), 34 they offered him wine to drink, mixed with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. 35 And when they had crucified him, they divided his clothes among themselves by casting lots; 36 then they sat down there and kept watch over him. 37 Over his head they put the charge against him, which read, "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews." Matt 27:38 Then two bandits were crucified with him, one on his right and one on his left. 39 Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads 40 and saying, "You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself! If you are the Son of God, come down from the cross." 41 In the same way the chief priests also, along with the scribes and elders, were mocking him, saying, 42 "He saved others; he cannot save himself. He is the King of Israel; let him come down from the cross now, and we will believe in him. 43 He trusts in God; let God deliver him now, if he wants to; for he said, 'I am God's Son.'" 44 The bandits who were crucified with him also taunted him in the same way. Matt 27:45 From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. 46 And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" 47 When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "This man is calling for Elijah." 48 At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink. 49 But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him." 50 Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last. 51 At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook, and the rocks were split. 52 The tombs also were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised. 53 After his resurrection they came out of the tombs and entered the holy city and appeared to many. 54 Now when the centurion and those with him, who were keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were terrified and said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"

27:55 Many women were also there, looking on from a distance; they had followed Jesus from Galilee and had provided for him. 56 Among them were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the mother of the sons of Zebedee. Matt 27:57 When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who was also a disciple of Jesus.

### Thought for the Day

Official memorial celebrations are familiar to us, marking wars or national events. Often, these are coloured by a mixture of sadness and gratitude. The Christian memorial of the last week of Jesus' life is entirely different. First, we tell the whole story again because he is risen from the dead. Secondly, this memorial is an effective one: as we do this in memory of him, the very same gifts of compassion, forgiveness, love and healing are offered again to all present, precisely because Jesus is risen from the dead. Our Christian memory is not a dead remembering but an effective bringing into the present of the great events that gave us new life in Christ.

### Pointers for Prayer

1. The identity of Jesus is revealed as the Messiah and the Son of God, not with a display of human power, but as one who was prepared to suffer unto death to show us how our God loves us. How does the Passion story speak to you as a revelation of how God loves you?
2. Jesus gives us an example of patient endurance and faithfulness in suffering. Suffering is something we all encounter. It is not something that anyone likes, but sometimes we cope with it better than others. What have you found helps you to cope better with suffering?
3. As you read through the narrative of the Passion, where do you find yourself resonating with a character in the action? Is there any message there for you that is life-giving?

### Prayer

O God of eternal glory, you anointed Jesus your servant to bear our sins, to encourage the weary, to raise up and restore the fallen. Keep before our eyes the splendour of the paschal mystery of Christ and, by our sharing in the passion and resurrection, seal our lives with the victorious sign of his obedience and exaltation.

We ask this through Christ, our liberator from sin, who lives with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, holy and mighty God for ever and ever. Amen.

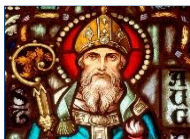
